1. During the night 24/25th July 1918 it is proposed to project 400 Gas cylinders into enemy defences and shelters opposite the Brigade front as follows :-

Projection (a) At and around E 20 central.
Projection (b) N.E. of MORLACOURT K 2 d 9 4.

2. Projection (a) will be fired from E 19 d 45 15.
Projection (b) will be fired from K 1 d 0 3.

3. The areas to be cleared of troops from Zero - 15 to Zero plus 30, and precautionary zones in which S.B.R's. will be worn from Zero + 5 to Zero plus 30 are as shown on maps A and B on reverse.

4. The limits of direction of wind for safe discharge are :-

(a) S.S.W. to N.N.W. of a velocity not exceeding 10 m.p.h.
(b) From S. by W. through N. to N. of a velocity not exceeding 10 m.p.h.

5. Code words as follows will be used in connection with the operation.

Projection (a) Operation will take place FORTY:
Operation postponed SEVEN:
Operation completed THOUSAND.

Projection (b) Operation will take place PREVENTION:
Operation postponed BETTER:
Operation completed CURE.

6. ZERO hour will be 1 a.m.

7. Officer in charge of (a) Operation will be Lieut. J.P. AUSTIN, R.E. Officer in charge of (b) Operation will be 2/Lt. MOORE.

8. R.E. Officers in charge of operations will call at 31st and 29th Bn. H.Q.s. respectively and the responsibility for the discharge of gas will rest with C.O.'s. of those units in consultation with the Officer of 'Z' Coy.

9. Special precautions will be taken to ensure that portions of front line cleared are patrolled before being re-occupied.

10. Left and centre Bns. will notify Brigade H.Q. of completion of operation.

1. The 173rd Inf. Brigade will relieve a portion of the 8th Aust. Inf. Brigade in the line N. of K.l.d.6.3. on night of 27th/28th inst. On completion of relief 31st Battalion will move to BALLARAT and BENDIGO lines, N.Qrs at J.9.b.9.2.; 30th Battalion will take over from 59th Bn. the area occupied by that Unit.
2. All trench shelters and trench and area stores in the area relieved will be handed over in situ. Hot boxes will not be handed over.
3. The following General Purpose Reserve Rations will be handed over by :-

6. The 31st Bn. will take over trench and area stores for BENDIGO and BALLARAT LINES from Lieut DOUST, Off. i/o Brigade Ammunition Dump at J.9.b.9.2. who will also hand over 600 General Purpose Reserve Rations and 75 tins Water.
7. 30th Bn. will take over the following Supporting Point Rations from 59th Battalion.

8. A careful check should be made and guards posted before receipts are given for trench shelters and Supporting Point Rations.
9. Before handing over, all trenches, dugouts and shelters will be sprayed with a 5% solution of creosol. Certificate stating that this has been done and that the area, trenches, dugouts and shelters have been handed over in a clean and sanitary condition will be signed in duplicate by the Officers handing over and taking over.
10. Receipts and certificates (as per para.9) for handing over and taking over must reach Brigade Headquarters before 9 a.m. 30th inst.

Headquarters
27th July 1918

1. Brigade ammunition dump is situated at J.9.b.9.2. This will be administered by Lieut. DOUST, 30th Battalion.
Forward Brigade Dumps have been formed at J.12.d.25.05 and J.24.b.6.8. These will be administered by Left and Right Battalions respectively.
2. Battalions will form dumps as close to the jumping off line as possible. The dumps in each Battalion Sector will contain not less than 50.000 rds S.A.A., and a proportion of grenades.
3. One hundred petrol tins are being issued to each of the front line Bns. These will be cleaned and filled with water, 50 tins being placed in dumps forward, and 50 tins held in reserve at Battalion H.Qrs.
4. All men taking part in the attack will carry their emergency iron ration and full water bottles.
5. All ranks will carry in addition to 120 rounds S.A.A. per man, two bandoliers of S.A.A., 2 grenades and 2 red ground flares.
6. Battalion Commanders will ensure that every man is in possession of his identity discs.
7. Battalions will wire an estimate of casualties into Brigade Headquarters at the earliest possible moment, and also after Zero plus 3 hours, and later as information comes to hand.
8. Battalions will arrange to police the C.T's and establish Battle Stragglers Posts at R.A.P's, Bn. H.Qrs, Ration Dumps and other likely places.
9. Prisoners of War will be collected at Bn. H.Qrs and sent back in batches to Advanced Brigade H.Qrs at J.17.b.3.8., where they will be taken over by the A.P.M.



1. Reference Para.1 (a) and (b) of 5th Australian Divisional Order No.218, which states :-
 - " At Zero hour on 28/29th July 5th Australian Division will carry out attacks as detailed below:-
 - " (a) 8th Australian Infantry Brigade will attack and capture the enemy's defensive system between the points K.20.c.0.2 and K.8.a.3.5.
 - " (b) At Zero hour plus 55 minutes on the 28/29th July the 14th Australian Infantry Brigade will attack and capture the enemy's line J.30.d.95.30 - K.25.c.54.40 - K.25.d.63.94 - K.25.b.80.21.
 2. The 14th Field Company will, in consultation with 8th and 14th Australian Infantry Brigades, arrange to render all necessary assistance in taping out jumping off lines, direction lines, and communication routes, and by the formation of forward dumps of wiring and consolidation stores for the attack. The 14th Field Company will be responsible for this work South of the BRAY-CORBIE ROAD.
 3. The 15th Field Company will, in consultation with the 8th Australian Infantry Brigade render any assistance which may be required on the same lines as the 14th Field Company, but to the North of the BRAY-CORBIE ROAD.
 4. The 5th Australian Pioneer Battalion, using not more than two Companies will dig or improve communication trenches to the captured lines at the following locations :-
 - K.13.b.2.4 to K.13.b.5.6
 - K.13.d.40.75 to K.13.d.9.9
 - K.19.b.7.0 to K.20.a.0.0
 - K.19.d.2.0 to K.19.d.6.1
 At the two northern locations the starting points for these communication trenches are ~~not~~ defined by the intersection of our front line with barely formed old German trench.
 - At the starting points chosen for the two southern Communication Trenches "Russian" saps have been pushed out. Open Communication Trenches will commence from the end of these.
 - Detailed arrangements for the assembly, and time of commencing work of Pioneers will be made by C.O. 5th Australian Pioneer Battalion with Brigades.







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No.2 Shews CORN SAP excavated out as far as the road at which point a "T" head was put in to give the enemy the impression that it was merely a listening post.

This "T" head can be seen in Photo 3. COAL SAP can also be seen in this photo excavated for about 70 yards out. A post to which COAL SAP was afterwards connected also shews up in this photo the post being put in mainly as a "blind". It will be noticed in this photo that the enemy had also commenced to sap forward more or less opposite CORN & COAL SAPS .

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No.3. Shews CORN SAP continued some 40 yards beyond the road also the "T" head at the road.

This work was done the night before that of the attack the sap now being only about 40 yards from the enemy line.

NOTES ON OPERATIONS JULY 4/5th 1918.

REF. MAP, FRANCE

62D N.E. 1/20,000.

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An operation having been planned by the 15th Aust. Inf. Brigade to capture the enemy system from K 1 B 9 0 to RIVER ANCRE at E 26 A 3 6, it was arranged to provide a right flank trench from our present Front Line to the objective approximately on the line K 1 B 7 1 to K 1 B 9 0, and a C.T. on the line approximately K 1 B 6 5 to K 2 A 0 5. With this end in view Lt.GIBB was detailed to run out forward saps from the two points K 1 B 7 1 to K 1 B 6 5. There existed two listening posts in part of these two points in NO MAN'S LAND. In order to divert suspicion the two saps were to hit the listening posts, which latter were to be extended in the form of "T" heads. It was arranged that the saps should be dug full width and depth and the right sap which was to form a flanking trench was to be wired as far as possible and extended beyond the listening posts the night previous to the attack. This work was successfully carried out and the situation as the attack opened was - that the right sap had been extended some 150 yards and the left sap to 180 yards, leaving 70 yards on the right and 170 yards on the left to be completed to join up to the objectives to be gained.

This preliminary work had to be carried out cautiously and cleverly in order not to excite suspicion, and was exceedingly well handled by Lt.GIBB, M.M. Simultaneously the necessary trenches in our forward system were widened and deepened to provide stretcher ways for casualties; a double splinter proof R.A.P. was completed at J 5 D 8 5; a battle Headquarters (deep dugout) was also provided at J 5 D 8 5 for C.O. Attack and a splinter proof O.P.

Dumps of wiring stores for consolidation were formed in NO MAN'S LAND at the head of the two saps pushed out and also on the road at E 25 D 8 3.

A Footbridge 35ft span was constructed out of two fire escape ladders trussed by wire rope ready to be used to provide communication across the river. AT E 25 B 95 45.

It was anticipated there would be some trouble in consolidating the ANCRE FLAT in E 26 D consequently 1 Sapper N.C.O. and 1 Sapper were detailed to accompany the Company Commander CAPT.DAWSON in the actual assault on that particular part of the objective to render and assist in immediate consolidation.

The attack was launched at DAWN July 4th 3-10 am. the objectives were quickly taken, trouble was however, as anticipated, experienced on the left for a little while and the Sapper N.C.O. and Sapper together with 2 Infantry ran a protective French wire belt round the road junction at E 26 C 5 1 and helped in the consolidation of an important post there.

In the evening Lt.GIBB led down a party of 60 men and successfully completed the right sap known as CORN SAP and wired it through to the objective.

Lt.OLIVER who had been detailed to reconnoitre and tape out the connection of the left C.T. known as COAL SAP, being given an Company of PIONEERS for the digging struck trouble. His reconnaissance for the connection had to be carried out by daylight and he ran into a heavy counter attack preparation barrage, nevertheless he managed to get his reconnaissance and taping out completed during the barrage subsequently placing the Pioneers on the job and digging through the C.T.

Lt.GILBERT also met trouble with the bridge over the ANCRE - the Hun counter attack preparation barrage fell heavily on the River flat and all bridges were destroyed. Nevertheless he managed by great perseverance to get his improvised bridge over the river at E 25 B 95 45 thus providing communication between our left battalion and right battalion, and he also repaired a second bridge at E 25 B 2 2.

Total casualties for this whole work were one Sapper killed.

The operation was completely successful and the arrangements were complete, a supply of emergency footbridges might have been useful, though not essential, sufficient communication being provided by what we did: we have however now designed a standard footbridge

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which we will keep in stock ready for use in any such situation again.

It was suggested that COAL & CORN SAPS be pushed through in daylight, but this was waived on my own suggestions, the attempt to do such work would probably have resulted in large casualties and the also probable non completion of the work till nightfall. The result of this operation once more shewed that the R.E. effective effort must undoubtedly be kept till the situation has been reported clear and night fallen.

The Hun trench captured was in good order little digging or consolidation was necessary to make a defensible position and it is the more difficult to understand therefore, why the Infantry made such a feeble effort to wire their new position. This wiring had to be completely done by Sappers on the night subsequent to the attack.

The Pioneers did not dig as well as was expected their organisation was poor and it was deplorable that out of a Company of 100 men led by their CAPTAIN only 45 reached Lt.OLIVER at the rendezvous. Lt.OLIVER had forwarded a guide who led the O.C. Pioneer Coy. to the rendezvous but he (the latter) had failed to keep his men together. Lt.OLIVER had to send a Sapper N.C.O. to find the straying 55 men, thus lost time and disorganized their work undoubtedly, but it was not a brainy display by the Pioneer Officers who had merely to keep 100 men together and when placed on their task see they dug.

Lt.GIBB with his N.C.O. Cpl POTTER displayed the utmost resource and endurance throughout the preparations and the attack.




Side Elevation A


Side Elevation B



DAMAGED BRIDGE ACROSS L'ANCRE



It was fortunate for the 8th Brigade that no counter-attack developed otherwise this lack of consolidation might have been felt severely.

It is useless as this experience proved to put all troops into attack, without keeping out a few parties to consolidate after the show, & all the work that was done towards consolidation was ably carried out by the Pioneers.
