Moosoon	Dec 7 th		<p>A disturbance in the Town of Smarke was reported by the DAPM Smarke apparently a large party of men in lean clothes to the 1st Infantry Ban Depot. Many being Black batch as far as the Training Depot is concerned no Australians took part a few Paratroopers however were implicated but were not reported officially. The Ship called the Mikado was looted & about 4000 worth of goods were stolen. 3 men of the Black batch were arrested with goods on them, & action was then taken by the DAPM Smarke.</p> <p>Further disturbances took place in Smarke caused by New Zealanders & Paratroopers & 3 small ships were captured & looted, not known the extent of the damage. No Australians were implicated, in fact very few in Town that night probably due to the fact that so much is being done for their welfare in Camp & their being very little inducement to leave Camp. Owing to the Commandant being absent in leave & that Lt Dick was temporarily in command may have contributed to no definite action being taken. _____ _____ _____ _____</p>



MOASCAR	31-12-1918.		<p>December 1918.</p> <p>The health of the Troops in Camp during the month under review has, on the whole, been excellent. It is extremely gratifying that the Sick Parades, taking into consideration the 30% increase in ration strength over previous month, shows an appreciable falling off in numbers, and the admissions to 2nd. A.S. Hospital were fully one hundred less than in November. This fact is the more pleasing, in that a large number of men marched into this Camp during the early part of October from Hospital & Convalescents Camps suffering from Malaria, both Benign & Malignant, and it looked as if the sick state would assume immense proportions, if the number parading sick continued to increase at the same rate as during the first fortnight of October. However, there are still a large number of men in Camp who have had Malaria, and who are at present attending one Quinine Parade daily at the A.A.M.C. Training Cadre, and they are keeping in fairly good condition. The training of those reporting sick has been carefully watched by the Medical Officers at the A.A.M.C. Cadre, and the Officers Commanding Regiments have worked in close harmony with the Medical Officers. No man who has been the slightest bit sick can complain of having been overworked. A large number of men who have suffered from Malaria have recovered sufficiently to rejoin their Units in the Field, and the majority of them now realise the importance of continuing on quinine treatment even though feeling comparatively well.</p> <p>A parade of 60 M.T. Malarial cases was held at A.A.M.C. Cadre at conclusion of Monthly Medical Classification Board on 9th. December, and each man was subjected to a close examination by the Senior Physician in A.I.F. who seemed decidedly pleased with the majority, and sent only 3 men to Hospital for further Quinine treatment.</p> <p>The number of "B" Class men in Camp has considerably decreased, a large number having been sent back to Australia. At the present time most of the "B" Class men in Camp are being usefully employed, and will be able to carry out the duties allotted them.</p> <p>The Influenza epidemic has been reduced to a very quiescent state, an average of one case per day being admitted to Hospital. The treatment with salicylates seems to be the most effective remedy that has been used in this Camp.</p> <p>Venereal Disease cases, likewise, have shown considerable decrease in numbers, and the men reporting at the Prophylactic Tent have been markedly less in numbers since the beginning of November.</p> <p>The Sanitation of the Camp, thanks to the most efficient supervision exercised by the 91st. Sanitary Section, has been very good. The 91st. Sanitary Section has now been succeeded by the 116th. Sanitary Section. Flies are comparative strangers during present Winter months.</p> <p>The food for the men has been of the usual high quality, and, during the past fortnight thanks to the Comforts & Camp Cinema Funds, the men have had practically everything they wanted to eat.</p>	<p>May</p>



MOASCAR	31-12-1918.		<p>An outbreak of Diphtheria occurred at the New Zealand Camp at Chevalier Island early in the month. All possible precautions against spread of the disease were taken. All patients, 12 in all, were sent to the 2nd. A.S.Hospital; the contacts were isolated and specimens from their throats examined. The whole of the personnel in Camp (N.Z.) attended parades for gargling their throats with antiseptic solution. The disease seems to be well in hand.</p> <p>A.A.M.C. Rfts. have been sent out to Units in the Field, and the numbers demanded have been complied with so far as has been possible. Some 1914 class A.A.M.C. personnel have been sent back to Australia on duty.</p> <p>The training of the A.A.M.C. personnel has been carried on as usual, just as before the Armistice. Men waiting to reinforce their Units in the Field have, from time to time, been sent to do temporary duty at the neighbouring No. 2 A.S.Hospital, when required by the C.O.
