

	Regiment in bivouac. The day was devoted to care of horses and saddlery.  Major C. Dick reported for duty and resumed 2nd in command of Regiment.  Major C.R. Spragg relinquished Temporary 2nd in Command of Regiment and appointed to command 9th W.E.C. Squadron.  2nd Lieutenant S.H. Lodge to Scouts course EL. ARISH.  Lieut-Colonel J.H. Whyte awarded bar to D.S.O. for good work while acting as Brigade M. to 2nd A.L.H. Brigade.  Lieutenant E. Levien awarded Military Cross for conspicious good services during period 1st March to 15th September 1917. Three Shoeing Smiths detached to RAMLEH to repair limbers. MAR ELI	AS 17th	Regiment left ZAKARIYA and marched with the Brigade to MAR-ELIAS. Rained continuously until 0930. Weather very cold when passing over the hills between ZAKARIYA and BETHLEHEM. Camel transport was dispersed with and supplemented by 5 G.S. Waggons of Div. Train.  The men were wet and cold on arrival at destination. Arrangements were made for 250 to sleep in a MONASTERY.	W D
	18th	Weather showery until 0830. The day was spent drying blankets and clothes. Orders were received to move out at 1700 but were afterwards cancelled for 24 hours. Effective Strength 15 officers 368 O.R. 448 Horses 11 H.G.	W.R.

JORDAN	23rd	The Regiment moved off from TALAT-ED-DUMM at 1930 to concentrate at KASR-HAJLAH prior to crossing the JORDAN River.	PALESTINE 1/63360 She et 18.
	24th	The Regiment moved off with the Brigade at 0130 and crossed the JORDAN River at MAKHADET HAJLAH bridge and concentrated at 127.8.3.b. At 0600 the Regiment moved with 6th Squadron in advance to 127. Q. 11.c. Patrols were sent out in the direction of SHUNET NIMRIN and came under machine gun and shell fire in 127 P.21.d and 27 a. At 1100 6th and 9th Squadrons were pushed forward to attack MAKKAR-ED-DERBASI. 6th Squadron connected up with 181st Inf. Bde on the left and 9th connecting with C.M.R. on the right. The final attack was made at 1140 and our Troops occupied the summit at 1150. Horses were watered in WADI NIMRIN and fed while the men had lunch. At 1140 the Regiment moved off with the Brigade and marched via No 4 Road to 127.V.8.A and bivousced for the night. 1 Officer (2/Lt Paterson) detailed for outpost duty.	Sheet

JORDAN	March 27th contd.		9th Sqdn sent to 142. H.24.c. At 1440 a train carrying troops appeared at 142.H.24.A. 9th Squadron opened fire at 1442. At 1703 the position of 9th Squadron was 142.H.24 D and J. 19.c. At 1805 instructions were received that as the demolition party was covered by I.C.C. Brigade the Regiment would co-operate at once with A.M.R. in attack on AMMAN. This order was followed by an order to report at Brigade Headquarters. The Regiment moved to 142.Y. 26 B and bivouaced for the night. An Officer's patrol (Lieutenant E.R. Black) was detailed to reconnoitre as far as possible towards AMMAN. 14 prisoners captured casualties NIL.	1/63360
	28th		Regiment in Brigade reserve at 142 Y 26 B. At 1300 an attack was made on AMMAN and the Regiment was prepared to move out at 5 minutes notice. At 1930 9th Squadron relieved right flank Squadron of C.M.R. N.W. of No 3 Road.	
	29 th		Regiment stood to arms at 0430. 9th Squadron in the firing line. During the afternoon patrols were pushed forward to reconnoitre the enemys position with a view of attacking after dark. Horses were watered at WADI in 142 Y.20 A.

JORDAN March VALLEY 30th

Two troops 9th Squadron were withdrawn at 0015 and proceeded to AMR H.Q. to take part in the attack on HILL 3039. Remaining 2 troops were left to prevent the enemy coming along No 3 ROAD. 2nd Lieutenant Ebbitt took charge of the 2 troops in the attack on HILL 3039 at 0200. At 1030 1 troop was withdrawn from No 3 Road and sent to Brigade Headquarters as Brigade Reserve but were subsequently put in the firing line. Troops withdrew from the firing line after all wounded had been evacuated and the Regiment marched with the Brigade to bivouac at 142.T.8.A. Troop detailed as Brigade reserve formed part of the Rear Guard. Arrived at bivouac 0315.

Casualties 4 killed, 1 missing, 8 wounded.

Troop 2nd Squadron detailed as demolition party returned to Regiment for duty at 1000. Regiment in bivouac. 2nd Squadron holding post at D.H. HAMAR RUMJ-AMEISH. 6th Squadron rejoined Regiment at 2100. Horses were saddled at 1515 in readiness to move out. At 1750 the Regiment moved to WEST sile of hill overlooking AIN-ES-SIRR.
