





No II Section Right (LONE PINE to COURTNEYS both inclusive).

LONE PINE - report enemy becoming increasingly active with stick bombs and machine guns. A few rounds from our Howitzer generally cause them to cease firing.

At 1905 we broke into a Turkish tunnel which we explored and found empty. Barricades were erected. The Tunnel is now held by us. Enemy tunnel was entered from our drive L.P. 14 on the Bastern face.

Enemy continue to work in OWEN'S GULLY East of

JOLLY.

Hostile 'plane was observed flying East at 1515- it dropped 3 bombs but no damage was reported. our anti-aircraft machine gun engaged it. B8 to WIRE GULLY - Enemy shelled this portion of the line from direction 80 X 6 and 80 X 9- no damage done.

At 1815 sounds of traffic were heard from the enemy's position in rear of his LONE PINE trenches.

At 0320 the enemy were heard working on entanglements in front of the JOLLY and were fired on by us. WIRE GULLY to COURTNEYS - Nothing to report on this portion of the line.

The relief of COURTNEYS and STRELE'S POSTS

-will be completed and this portion of the line handed over to 5th Brigade tomorrow night. Estimated enemy accounted for - 2.

No II Section Left QUINNS to RUSSELL'S TOP both inclusive). QUINNS - report that the enemy are continuing to extend their trench West of C 29 (Trench Diagram No. 3) Enemy's bombing was more vigorous than usual

last night. At about 2000 bullets were reported to be fixing falling in WELLINGTON GULLY (80 R. 3-9) They appeared to come from machine gun heard firing somewhere near LONE PINE.

POPES - report that between 2400 and 0300 search light was occasionally seen.

RUSSELL'S TOP .- report bombing very quiet during past 24 hours.

Estimated enemy accounted for - 2.



7.11.15.

Clearing of scrub and improvement of field of fire continues.

Enemy shelled RHODODENDRON SPUR and CHAILAK DERE, without doing any damage.

SNIPERS NEST (80 I 8) was shelled between 5 and 5.45 pm. by 4%h Battery = 7 direct hits on NEST itself and commun-400 ication trench leading to main ridge, one shell opening up the trench for 4-5 yds. Machine guns and snipers cooperated.

Patrol reports enemy busy in the night reconstructing the damage done, in spite of our energetic sniping from Wo slopes of RHODODENDRON SPUR.

At 5.30 am, the 4" Battery again opened on SNIPERS' NEST obtaining 4 direct hits.

At the same time as the shelling of SNIPERS' NEST yesterday, BATTLESHIP HILL and CHUNUK BAIR were also engaged: on the latter a machine gun emplacement is reported as destroyed.

Our artillery set fire to undergrowth 80 K 1-2,

The 2nd Battery twice engaged guns firing from about 93 A 6 - the second time it was firing at our disabled aeroplane.

The 5th Battery again caught a working party at 80 F 2, the first round caused about a dozen casualties, the remainder making for cover.

The Mountain Artillery engaged a new trench on BATTLESHIP HILL 130 deg, from No. 2 Post, and communication trench on CHUNUK BAIR 120 deg.

Other usual targets were engaged by the artillery during the day,

APPENDIX GENE

SUMMARY of Events from 6 a.m. 7th to 6 a.m. 8th November 1915.

No I Section. CHATHAMS POST 68 G 7 to 68 B 5. 1st Australian Division.

The enemy artillery shelled the left of our line without causing damage. An howitzer from the neighbourhood of BOGHALI opened fier again after a long shlence. The velocity seems greater and the range shorter than previously; the ammunition is better too as nearly all their shells detonated.

In No 1 Section right there was an eventful day. At 2045 we seized and kept an old Turkish trench south of our new works, which commands the nearer sandbag barricade held by the Turks. The enemy did not attack us during the night but kept creeping forward and throwing bombs; they were driven off each time. The Turks sniped heavily with rifles and machine guns from BIRD TRENCHES 68 L 2/5 and TURKISH DESPAIR 68 H 5/7, but our new work was put in a state of defence. Co-operation between artillery and Light Horse all night was excellent; howitzers particular—ly did fine work and practically splenced everything for about 10 minutes after each shot. Our machine guns and catapults again did good work. Our casualties for 24 hours in this section were one officer killed, one officer and 11 others wounded. The enemy casualties are unknown but must be heavy for 20 were sniped during the day alone. In the rest of the section there is nothing to report.

During the night 17th Siege Battery, 5th Lowland Battery, 8th and 9th Field Batteries, fired from time to time as required on BIRD and ECHELON TRENCHES; as reported above this fire gave great assistance to the Light Herse who are pushing out to new ground on HARRIES RIDGE.


About three days ago, a smaller Bulgar force which was moving on MONASTIR from USKUB; was repulsed by the Serbians at KRITCHEVO.


RAILWAYS. Turkish newspapers announce that the Rajun - Islahie section of the BAGDAD Railway has been completed; the length is 46 kilometres.

LONE PINE report hostile Hotchkies gun on PINE RIDGE - exact position not known - fired 3 shells into No 1 Section of the PINE yesterday. 8 other of its shells failed to burst.

The enemy artillery were more active to-day, a number of rounds

being fired at irregular intervals at various parts of our line;
RUSSELLS TOP, LONE PINE, BROWNS DIP, and the vicinity of CHATHAMS POST

received most of the shells.

Our guns fired in retaliation, engaged hostile guns, and searched valleys and communication trenches where it was thought fire would be effective. We also fired with good effect at a trench mortar, and at a machine gun emplacement at GABA TEPE.

No 1 Section Right - report continuous sniping by the enemy and periodical bursts of machine gun fire from GABA TEPE during the day, and
steady rifle fire, machine gun, and bomb fire during the night.
The enemy has succeeded in putting out a good deal of wire along this
front.

No 1 Section Centre - reports the enemy active with sniping and bombing up till 2000 and quieter afterwards.

Several falls of earth have again occurred, and more are threatening. The increased accuracy of enemy fire at our loopholes is noticed and it is thought that this may indicate that they are using fixed rifles.

No 1 Section Left - Usual sniping and bombing.

No enemy artillery fire is reported. At LONE PINE the approaches to the new captured Turkish gallery have been improved and a firing tube placed in one of the barricades. QUINNS POST reports parapets of trenches I 2 and H 4 (Trench diagram No III) have been raised during the last two nights. It is suspected that it is from these points that MONASH Gully is sniped.

The enemy was heard working underground during the night.

A considerable amount of bombing was done on both sides but we event--ually dominated the situation by our catapults and trench mortars. At POPES HILL a number of small stick bombs made from one pounder

shells were fired into our lines.

At RUSSELLS TOP we successfully fired a charge near our right surface

tunnel and another in our centre surface tunnel.

No III Section. HAPPY VALLEY 80 M 5 to WARWICK CASTLE 92 Y 6.N.Z.&.A.Div

Hd Qrs and 1200 men N.Z.M.R. Bde. arrived during the night, and went
into Divl Reserveon BAUCHOPS HILL. First parties of 1st and 3rd L.H. Bdes
left for MUDROS, 7th A.I.Bde left to rejoin 2rd Aust Divn. 3rd L.H. Bde
took over from 1st L.H. Bde down to DESTROYER HILL (exclusive) and handed
over their left to the N.Z.I.Bde to a point 150 yds East of the ISLAND
(80 I 6/J 4).

Between 3 and 4 p.m. No 2 Post, Old No 3, No 3 Post and Divl H.Q.

were subjected to heavy bombardment.

FRANKLINS POST (92 Z 4) was shelled at noon, no damage done.

A machine gun in vicinity of FARM was firing down AGHYL DERE and CHAILAK DERE - Hotchkiss gun was turned on to it, and its fire lessened. The enemy's sniping was more marked, but was got well in hand by the

afternoon and suppressed. During the night enemy reported as restless and jumpy.

Our artillery engaged the following targets - GUNS - 93 A 6. TRENCHES 105 T 9 destroying overhead cover, 92 P 2/6, 80 F 6 blew in some of the work, and other usual targets. Parties in open - 81 A 2.

No IV Section. WARWICK CASTLE 92 Y 6 to SUSAK KUYU 92 C 7. 54th Divn.

The right sub-section claim to have shot 6 of an enemy working party.

The centre sub-section prevented enemy working at night, by rifle and bomb fire.

Left sib-section report an increase of enemy rifle fire directed on to Hill 60.

At 2200 we broke into enemy workings underground and a charge will be fired in the vicinity.

It is feared that this will delay our underground work on Hill 60.

Summary of events from 6 a.m. 10.11.15. to 6 a.m. 11.11.15.

No. 1 Section Right.

During the day our right was shelled occasionally from GUN RIDGE and several broomstick bombs were fired into our lines from BIRD TREMCHES; enemy kept up a continuous aniping from his trenches in the vicinity and periodical bursts of fire from a machine gun on GABA TEPE. continued improving our works throughout the day.

At night the enemy kept up a steady rifle and machine gun fire and broomstick bombs were again thrown into our lines; this was done apparently to cover their working parties putting out wire, a great deal of which was erected all along our front during the night. This, it is thought, may indicate that the enemy apprehands further movement on our part in this direction.

No. 1 Section Centre.

Enemy was fairly active sniping and bombing during the day and up till about 2000. Soveral broomstick bombs fell in our second line. Enemy machine gun also fired occasionally. quieter after 2000.

Several falls of earth have again occurred,

and more are threatening.

The increased accuracy of enemy fire at our loopholes is noticed and it is thought this may indicate that they are using fixed rifles.

No. 1 Section Left.

Enemy fired a few shells at our lines without causing any damage; he was seen working on Hill 472 . PINE RIDGE, and GABA TEPE. kept up fairly heavy sniping day and night, to which we replied as opportunities occurred.
