



Thy - le - Chateau Belgium.	Feb'y	1	Lieut P.E. MacGillicuddy rejoined Unit es leave.		
		2	12 O.R. despatched for return with No 6 Embarkation Quota for Demobilisation. 2/Lieut McGowan's promotion gazetted to date from 13/10/18		
		3	Educational Classes continued to 11th inst. Vehicles prepared for painting. and stores collected for checking and packing.		
		4/5	Making boxes for storage of tools. 5th. Company Dance held in the Salle communale, being the final dance before deaprture. Lieut Oldham rejoined Unit es leave U.K. 3 O.R. despatched to U.K. on Early Repatriation.		
		6.	Lieut P.E. MacGillicuddy detached for duty at Aust. Corps HeadQrs.		
		7.	Lieut W.C.D. VEALE M.C. D.C.M. departed for leave U.K.		
		8.	2 O.R. discontinued on account of departure for new area.		
		9/10	Lieut G.R. McGowan and Sergt. Chatto proceeded to new area to arrange billets for Coy. Party of 1 N.C.O. and 6 O.R. proceeded also to construct latrines and attend to Sanitary arrangements generally.		
		11	Company moved to Nallines Area, Transport by road and Personnel by train from BERZEE. 3 limbers conveying section gear and Water Cart moved this day only, not sufficient frost cogs being available for horses, these being essential owing to roads being frozen. Personnel moved by 13.00 train from BERZEE. Cyclists left at 13.00 and travelled by road. Arrived at MARCINELLE HALES about 14.45. Most of the Sappers were accommodated with beds. 9 O.R. stayed behind, 4 on the Toolcarts, and balance to guard stores.

		14.	Pontoons wagons off loaded and parked in new area.

		16.	Church Parade. 1 N.C.O. proceeded to BEAUMONT as advance billeting party for Horse Sale Party.		
		17.	Collecting stores for Y.M. C.A. Party of 11 in-c, Captain Noedl in charge proceeded with Horses to Horse Sales Beaumont.
