INSTRUCTIONS TO GENERAL OFFICERS COMMANDING 9TH CORPS AND
AUSTRALIAN & NEW ZEALAND ARMY CORPS.

G.S.R. 2/48

Army Headquarters,

Dardanelles Army,

10th December 1915.

1. The Cabinet has ordered the evacuation of SIVLA and ANZAC to be commenced immediately.
2. The evacuation will be carried out in two stages :-
 - (a) The INTERMEDIATE STAGE, which has already commenced. This will consist of the gradual and methodical evacuation of all men, guns, and animals not required for the tactical defence of our positions during a period which it is hoped will not exceed two days, but which may, in the event of bad weather supervening, be extended to a week, or even more. As much material, stores, and supplies as possible will be evacuated during the Intermediate stage.
 - (b) The FINAL STAGE. This will consist of the embarkation of men and guns only, and must be completed in two nights. The only personnel kept for this stage will be fighting men and medical personnel.
3. The decision as to the number of men and guns to be embarked during each stage is left to the discretion of Corps Commanders, subject only to the proviso that the number of men kept for the final stage must not exceed 20,000 at each place, this being the maximum number that can be dealt with by the Navy in two nights.
4. The allotment of ships and lighters to each corps for the Intermediate stage is given in Appendix A.

Sunday

This stage must be completed not later than daybreak on the 19th December.

Guns, war-like stores, and other material of value must be evacuated as early as possible in this stage, in order that should the tactical situation necessitate the curtailment of this stage, the losses of valuable equipment may be by so much reduced.

The relative order of importance in which, subject to tactical considerations, guns are to be evacuated is, howitzers, heavy guns, 18 pounders, 15 pounders, 10 pounders and smaller pieces. The Commander-in-Chief directs that, if possible, all howitzers and heavy guns should be saved.

The programme of embarkation will be left entirely to Corps Commanders, who will make all necessary arrangements with their respective Naval Transport Officers. Naval Transport Officers will be responsible for the allotment of troops, guns, and stores to the craft at their disposal.

Corps Commanders will report daily to Army Headquarters the number of personnel, animals, guns, and vehicles evacuated during the preceding night, and the units to which the personnel and guns belong.

5. The final stage will take place on the 19th and 20th December. Combined Naval and Military orders for this stage will be issued shortly.

The closest co-operation between Corps Commanders will be of the utmost importance. To assist in this object it is suggested that each Corps Commander should attach to the other Corps Headquarters a staff officer fully conversant with his plans. It is essential that the final withdrawal from the front line trenches at the junction of Corps should be simultaneous, at an hour to be mutually arranged by Corps Commanders.

6. It is recognized that it may be impossible to embark any guns or stores during the Final Stage, but any opportunity that occurs for doing so without impeding the embarkation of personnel must be seized.

Every gun left behind must be so completely blown to bits as to ensure its worthlessness to the enemy, even as a trophy.

7. Certain contingencies may compel the Army Commander to order the abandonment of the Intermediate Stage and the beginning of the final stage before the programme for the Intermediate Stage has been completed. In this eventuality one or more nights, as necessary, will be added to the Final Stage in order to embark the balance of men left over from the Intermediate stage. The embarkation of further guns, animals, stores, and material will, in this case, be abandoned.

8. The Army Commander directs that particular attention be paid to the following points:-

(a) The early accumulation of reserves of stores, water, and ammunition in the trenches.

(b) Preparation for the destruction of all ammunition, stores, and supplies which have to be abandoned. If feasible, it will probably be advisable to prepare effective mines under every dump of abandoned ammunition to be exploded by electric contact mines at the last moment.

(c) Full use of mines and entanglements, trip wires, etc. R.E. personnel must be left with the rear parties to complete these arrangements.

When our trenches are very close to the enemy and mine tunnels in the direction of their positions have been commenced, these should be completed at once, and large mines placed ready for explosion when our rear parties are evacuating their trenches. Several such large explosions

may well prevent the enemy following up.

(d) The necessity for complete silence, especially during the final stages of the operation, must be impressed on all ranks.

(e) During daylight, lighters and small craft should ply off the beaches in the normal manner.

(f) The early evacuation of documents, records, etc.

(g) The possibility of the Turks commencing an attack and the necessity for guarding against it. Such attacks will become more and more likely as the evacuation progresses. Should the enemy develop an attack across the open, offering opportunities for the infliction of heavy casualties, a counter-attack should be launched with vigour.

(h) Any small detachments of reinforcements which may be sent up in the near future should be landed in daylight, in order to give the Turks the impression that we are still landing troops.

(i) The possibility of deceiving the enemy by restricting movement by daylight on the beaches and in the open for the next few days, followed by alternate periods of activity and quiescence.

The adoption of similar methods of alternate activity and inactivity as regards night firing.

9. The Vice-Admiral is arranging to have boats off the shore throughout the course of the Final Stage at points where stragglers or wounded may come down to the beach.

10. Owing to damage to lighters or other unavoidable causes, a certain number of men may possibly still be on shore at daybreak after the last night of the Final Stage. A Keep must therefore be prepared in each area, as near as possible to a practicable landing place, in which such men could maintain themselves until embarked later. This Keep must be provided with supplies of water, food, and S.A. Ammunition. It must not

be used, however, until it is clear that there are no means of immediate embarkation.

11. The troops from ANZAC will be concentrated in the first instance at MUDROS and MITYLENE; those from SUVLA at MUDROS, except 15,000 from the Final Stage, who will be sent to IMBROS.

13. A suggested programme of evacuation of artillery has been drawn up, and is attached as Appendix B. This programme is for guidance only, and may be varied or altered by Corps Commanders at their discretion.

14. MEDICAL. During the Intermediate Stage the arrangements for evacuation of sick and wounded will be normal.

During the Final Stage lightly wounded cases must embark with the fighting troops.

Two hospital lighters will be provided at each beach for conveyance of badly wounded cases to hospital ships, of which there will be two at each beach.

A proportion of medical personnel, with accommodation for badly wounded cases, must remain on the Peninsula until after the evacuation has been completed, to

Of these 2 batteries 4.5" Hows. (8 guns) go to HELLES.

1. When some guns of a battery are evacuated and some remain, ammunition of evacuated guns should remain with those still in position.
2. When all guns of a particular nature are evacuated, the ammunition should be handed over to the park for evacuation.
3. If guns have to be destroyed, this should be total demolition of gun and carriage, so that they cannot be removed as trophies.
4. Guns should be left as widely distributed, firing from their original positions, as can be arranged, suited to tactical considerations, and, when practicable, moved, so as to fire and give the appearance of many emplacements being occupied.

Dear White

So sorry if you have been muddled over this Mitylene business. Yesterday we heard from S.H.A. that we must send £20,000 there at least. Today I.G.C. has come here & tells us that no troops are to go there after all - anyhow as first. I have accordingly sent you definite wire tonight, as to destinations, & hope it will remain unchanged. H.B. Anger will go to Andros as originally arranged.

I sent Austen to tell you all this by telegrapher's conversation this evening, but apparently it was not a great success, & the peripatetic trouble seems more speedy.

I enclose an advanced copy of the list of craft that will be allotted to you for the final stage - also an extract from naval orders (in press) showing arrangements for taking off men on the flanks. You will see that they are prepared to do this on both nights, & would prefer to do so, as it will make them all the more efficient on the second night. Will this suit you? Also, do you still want some of your 10 motor lighters as C. Beach in addition to these two? This can be arranged if you particularly require it, but unless you do so wish, the sailors will have all your lighters at Leatons, Miles, No 8 and Withins piers on both nights. Please let me know tomorrow night - or better still, by wire.

Stanely will be in charge of all our lighters etc, & you should work out two strips with him from this list.

Final these orders will probably order all men to carry an iron ration —

1. (i) Under instructions from the Army Corps Commander, moves will take place in accordance with the attached table which will be destroyed when the necessary extracts have been taken. Personnel will probably be required to embark on the night of 11th December, 1915.
- (ii) The detail regarding the numbers to be made up will be fixed by the Commanders of the units concerned - the principles governing the selection will be the retention at ANZAC of the maximum number of effective rifles.
- (iii) Troops will march out with 150 rounds of S.A. Ammunition per man, one iron ration and the remainder of the current day's ration. Gun ammunition will not be taken.
- (iv) Kits and baggage will be reduced to the authorised equipment, officers' valises and mens' kits. As the accommodation on fleet sweepers is limited, articles in excess of the abovementioned will not be loaded. Baggage will be ready to send to the beach by 1400 on 11th December.

- (iii) All trench stores including periscopes, periscopic rifles, telescopic sighted rifles, mauser (sniping) rifles, wallaby rifle rests, etc., at present in the trenches to be handed over, will be taken over by incoming units under brigade arrangements. The numbers of articles so handed over will be noted and receipts obtained in the usual manner.
- (iv) All machine guns now in the trenches to be handed over will remain there, except where they are replaced by machine guns brought by incoming units. In cases where machine guns are thus left behind, new detachments will be provided by the incoming unit.
- (v) The boundary between the 2nd Light Horse Brigade and the 1st Infantry Brigade will run from the firing line along No. 7 Sap, C T4, along the firing line to No. 2 gun and thence down Gun Road, across SHELL GREEN to the sea.
