

# THIRD AUSTRALIAN DIVISIONAL ORDNANCE. WAR DIARY FOR JULY, 1917.

The Ordnance Dump was still situated in Rue de la Gare,
STEENWERCK. It may be recorded that the Ordnance Dump in occupation
at Steenwerck was very conveniently situated, and well organised,
facilitating the easy storage and quick despatch of stores.

On July 1st, 1917, Ordnance personnel was as shown on attached Nominal Roll (marked Annexure "A"). Four Bootmakers (Imperial P.B.men) were also engaged for the repair of Boots. A statement of Permanent Labour employed by A.A.O.C. is attached and marked Annexure "B".

The full working strength also included four three-ton Motor Lorries (each with two Drivers).

In addition to the ordinary Bulk Demands on Base (19 in number), 516 "detailed" Indents (by wire and on Army Form G.994) were submitted to Base, Calais. The system of dealing with Indents from Units is set forth in Appendix "C". A copy of the most important bulk demand is appended, marked Annexure "D". The items dealt with in this manner are shown on the list attached, marked Annexure "E". Receipts for stores delivered to Units are taken in Army Book 8, a specimen sheet of which is appended and marked Annexure "B". "F"

Upwards of 120 tons of General Stores (those demanded in Bulk) were received and distributed, the great majority by motor lorry, the balance being called for by the units themselves.

A statement is attached (marked Annexure"G") showing the quantities of clothing, Necessaries, Equipment, Oil, Soap, &c., issued to the Division during this month.

GAS APPLIANCES The Divisional stock of anti-gas appliances was maintained to the extent of 1000 Small Box Respirators and 2500 anti-gas Helmets.

The Extension above referred to was an appliance for attaching to the existing container of the small box Respirator for the purpose of providing better protection against a particularly powerful and injurious gas newly adopted by the enemy. The Division

GOGGLES, ANTI-GAS.

No further issues of goggles, anti-gas, will be made. Those in possession should be withdrawn and returned to railhead for despatch to Base. All outstanding demands should be considered cancelled. The scale of anti-gas equipment in future will be one small box respirator and one P.H.helmet per officer and man.

BOOTS. The issue to this Division of Australian pattern boots, which had long been delayed, commenced in July. The attached copies of correspondence in this connection (marked Annexure "H", Annexure "I", Annexure "K", Annexure "L" and Annexure "M") show that the issue was regarded as being of considerable importance to the Commonwealth. The issue was not without its humourous side, as it was noticed that without exception, the Australian boots were regarded with eager anticipation both by Officers and men throughout the Division, and that the Boots already in possession (of the strong Imperial regulation type) never seemed to reach the "unserviceable" stage and to be in immediate need of replacement by the Australian pattern. During the month of July over 3600 pairs of boots were issued to the Division, of which nearly 3000 were of the Australian pattern.

REPLACEMENT OF GUNS AND CARRIAGES. Attached Statement (marked Annexure "N") shows the demands made and satisfied for Guns and Carriages during this month.

For this purpose a Gun Park had been established in the Army area in May, and continued in operation till the 6th of Jluy when outstanding indents on the Park were transferred to Base. Appended and marked "Annexure" "O", is the original communication received, giving notice of the closing of this very important branch of the Service, the object of which was to supply, with the least possible delay, guns and their most important parts, during the heavy fighting operations.

VEHICLES. The demand for vehicles and spare parts fell off considerably in XXXX July, having been extraordinary (in common with every other nature of store) in June. The following statement shows the articles demanded in the months of June and July, 1917:-

From time to time special stores were drawn from the Ordnance Officer, II Anzac Corps Troops, and a statement showing those drawn in July is appended and marked Annexure "Q".

As regards discipline and health of Ordnance during July, these were good throughout.

A List of Units administered by D.A.D.O.S. in July is appended (marked Annexure "R").

MOVES The Mobile Artillery which was attached to the Third Australian Division was moved as shown by copies of Move Orders attached, marked respectively Annexures "S", "T", "U" and "V".

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE PREPARETION AND SUBMISSION OF INDENTS.

THIRD AJOURAGEAM

The following instructions have been compiled for the use of Quartormasters and Q.M. 31s; and all concerned in the preparation and Submission of indents for Ordnance Stores, Clothing and Necessaries. A rigid compliance thereto is of the utmost importance; firstly in order to standardise the system of indenting, and secondly to obviate the nocessity of returning indents to Units for amendment. Any departure from these instructions, except under very peculiar circumstances, will result in the return of the indent to the unit concerned. No action for the supply of the articles demanded will be taken by D.A.D.O.S. unless indents do conform to these instructions, and in this connection it is suggested that they be mounted on pastohoard and preserved for future reference and guidance.

1. There are two kinds of indents, viz "Bulk" and "Detail". Under the category of "Bulk" are included items shown on the attached table. The system adopted by Divisions in France is to consolidate in the office of the Divisional Ordnance Officer all idents of units administered by him which are of a common supply and in need of frequent replacement. This consolidation is forwarded to the Base in the form of a telegram. For the sake of uniformity a programme has been drawn up by the Chief Ordnance Officer, CALAIS, for the submission of these consolidations, and the attached is a copy of this timo-table Insofar as it affects individual units. Three points will be emphasised in connection with "bulk" indenting:-

(a). Items which are "a first supply" must not be included in a

"Bulk" demand. (b). Separate indents must be used for the four class of " Dulk" Stores: the indents for stores due on one day being considered as belonging to the samo class.

(c). Unless an indent for the supply of an item of "Dulk" issue is received within the allotted time, a week's delay is the result. 3. With reference to "Detail" indents, these are two of two

kinds, viz:-

(a): Indents for all stores not included in attached table.

(b). All items of a first supply. Indents under this heading must always be supported by an authority, e.g., G.R.O'S, A.R.O'S, G.H.Q., Army or Corps Headquarters correspondence, etc. etc.

4. Certain stores, shown at foot of attached table, should

always bé demanded on separato and distinct indents.

5. Whon indenting for Machine and Lewis Gun parts, it is essential that only the loft hand margin of A.F.W. 994 be used in detailing items. The other margin is required for A.O.D. use.

6. Indents for Anti-Gas appliances (except Satchels A.C. and S.B.R. which come under the heading of " bulk must invariably be supported by the certificate of a Gas Officer or his representative.

7. "Detail" indents may be submitted at any time, and if in order will be passed to Base at once for supply. Any delay that may occur will be due to that fact that stores are not available at B aso.

8. It is most essential, in the preparation of an indent, that that "vocabulary" nomenclature be employed. In the case of a Quarter-Master not having a "priced Vocabulary of Stores" in his possession, the nomenclature of the Mob. Store Table or, in the case of new issues being authorised, that of General or Army Routine Orders, etc., should bo used.

Regarding the Australian made akkle boots which are now being issued to Australian troops, when these boots were first received the Imperial Authorities refused to allow them to be issued as they were not considered suitable for service requirements. After considerable correspondence and a special trial in this Corps under conditions prevailing out here during the winter, sanction was given for the use of Australian boots made to the same pattern as the Imperial, but all that took time and a number of boots had been made and sent from Australia while correspondence was taking place regarding technical details of design. Thus some of the boots now being issued have no toe tips. The Australian Troops are naturally very anxious to be supplied with their own pattern of boot, and as it was only after considerable discussion and trials in the field that the Imperial authorities sanctioned the use of these boots, it is hoped that every effort will be made to give the boots a fair chance and not expose them to an undue strain which could be prevented with a little foresight. In this Corps an order has been xxxxx issued that all boots for use by Infantry Battalions are to have toe tips fitted befire the boots leave the D.A.D.O.S. dump. Most of the boots at present re eived have nails at the toe to protect them, but it is not considered that this is sufficient in the case of the Infantry, and sufficient nails are pulled out to allow xxxxx room for the toe tip to be put on. To ensure that this is done, the work is carried out under D.A.D.O.S. supervision, before the boots are issued to the unit. Unless a toe tip is put one, the sewing and a strip at the toe has no protection and also the nails are very liable to fall out as theboots get worn.

I hope you will see your way to have a similar arrangement, otherwise I am afraid the boots may wear out unduly rapidly and get a bad reputation while the method of prevention of this is available, and only requires a little trouble to put into force. I should be very interested to hear what you think of the Australian pattern boot, and how they wear in the Australian D ivisions with you.

As these are of special Australian make and pattern I would be glad if you will insure that they are only supplied to Australian units and that none are issued to any of the aImperial or New Zealand Troops in your Corps.

Samples of the latest types of Imperial boots have been sent to Australia from time to time to guide manufacture and the necessity for toe tips was pointed out, so it is hoped that as soosaas the present stock is used a more strongly constructed boot with toe tips will be available.


