(a). The Corps area will be organised into areas and sub-areas in accordance with the table below, :-

Areas (1) (2) and (3) with their sub-areas are shown on the attached map.

(b). Areas (1), (2), and (3), . will be administered in all respects by the divisions in occupation of them. The Commandants of the various sub-areas will be responsible to the Headquarters of the division concerned for all administrative questions, but the permanent staffs for the various sub-areas are supplied by Corps Headquarters from the Area Employment Cos. detailed to the area.

- 2 -

(c). In accordance with G.R.O. 1142 the Commandants of all sub-areas will be responsible under the division concerned for the maintenance and sanitation of the dugout systems in their areas excluding the front line system. The divisions concerned will ensure that these officers are provided with the men necessary for keeping the dugouts pumped, clean, and in repair.

2. TRAFFIC REGULATIONS :-

(a). Right and Left Divisions and the Support Division will be responsible for all traffic control in their areas with the exception of the control of the portion of BAILLEUL - LOCRE - LA CLYTTE - YPRES Road in the Support Division area which will be undertaken by the IX Corps.

A.P.M. of Corps will be directly responsible for Traffic Control in BAILLEUL, METEREN and FLETRE.

(b). Headlights will not be used further forward than the road R.E.FARM - KEMMEL - LA POLKA - LINDENHOEK - NEUVF EGLISE - LEINSTFR ROAD - NIEPPE.

(c). Traffic will not proceed by day, and lights will not be used by night, forward of the line 0.19.a.8.8. - 0.19.c.5.6. - 0.36.b.2.8. - T.5.d.9.4. - T.12.b.8.4. - T.18.a.6.6. - HYDE PARK CORNER - PLOEGSTEERT - LE BIZET.

(d). Transport will not proceed by day beyond RED CHATEAU on the VIERSTRAAT - WYTSCHAETE ROAD except singly and then only under exceptional circumstances.

(e). Vehicles will not halt in daylight on the unscreened portions of the KEMMEL - WYTSCHAETE Road East of PECKHAM.

3. POLICE :-

(a). Right and Left Divisions and Support Division will be responsible for policing and picqueting the villages etc., in their areas.

(b). Support Division will supply the A.P.M. BAILLEUL (who will apply through A.P.M. of Corps), with picquets or extra police required in that town.

police and picquet the area:

(c). The Division in the SAMER Area will detail by arrangement with A.P.M. BOULOGNE whatever police he requires for duty in that town; and post picquets at PONT de BRIQUES and BAMETHUN to check all men proceeding to BOULOGNE.

4. PRISONERS OF WAR :-

Divisions will evacuate prisoners of war to the Main Corps Cage at BAILLEUL Asylum.

5. BURIAL OF THE DEAD :-

Divisions will arrange for the burial of the dead in their areas; burials will take place whenever possible in the established cemeteries, a list of which is attached, APPENDIX B.

6. FIELD PUNISHMENT COMPOUND :-

The Corps Field Punishment Compound is established at BAILLEUL ASYLUM (S.8.d.9.6.). Rules for the admission of prisoners to the Compound are attached hereto, APPENDIX A.

- 3 -

BAILLEUL STANDING ORDERS :-

(a). Water Supply - owing to the shortage of water vehicles are not to call from standpipes in the Rue de BAILLEUL and troops billeted outside the BAILLEUL Area will not send vehicles into the town to be filled.

(b). Billets - No billets may be occupied without a "billet de logement" from the Town Major who will be notified when billets are vacated.

8. LEAVE :-

(a). Leave to visit places in the Corps areas except BAILLEUL may be granted by Unit Commanders but no men will be allowed outside their billeting areas unless properly dressed and in the possession of a pass.

(b). Leave to visit BAILLEUL may be granted on the following conditions :-

1. Such leave will not be granted to more than 5% of any unit daily.
2. Men granted leave will -
 - i. be provided with a pass signed by A.P.M. Corps or division.
 - ii. be properly dressed, wearing belts.
 - iii. be clear of the town by 8.30.p.m.
 - iv. not enter any estaminet or restaurant except between the hours of 12 noon and 2.p.m. and 6 and 8.p.m.

(c). The division in SAMER Area may grant leave to BOULOGNE on the following conditions :-

1. Not more than 500 officers and men may be granted leave daily.
2. Personnel granted leave will not enter BOULOGNE before 2.p.m. and will leave the town by 8.p.m.
3. Men granted leave will be correctly dressed and wear belts. They will be inspected by an officer before they leave their units.
4. They will proceed to BOULOGNE by either SAMER - HESDIN - L'ABBE - PONT de BRIQUES or WIRWIGNIES - BAMETHUN.
5. Every man granted leave will be issued with a pass signed by the A.P.M., stating the day for which it is issued.
6. Leave to stay in BOULOGNE overnight may only be granted to not more than 10 officers each day.

(d). Leave to ENGLAND will be granted in accordance with the allotment issued to units from time to time.

2. Personnel proceeding on leave via CALAIS will report to Corps Depot, Corps Reinforcement Camp by 4.p.m. the day prior to the day of commencement of their leave, carrying their rations for every meal. Accommodation will be provided for them at the Camp and they will proceed as a party under the senior officer to CAESTRE Railhead in time to catch the train leaving there at 2.15.a.m. This train does not proceed via HAZEBROUCK.

3. Applications for any leave not provided for above will be submitted to Corps Headquarters.

APPENDIX 'A'.

INSTRUCTIONS.1st ANZAC CORPS CENTRAL FIELD PUNISHMENT COMPOUND.

1. All men awarded Field Punishment No 1 and No 2 for 7 days and over will be admitted to Corps Field Punishment Compound.
2. All men belonging to the following categories will be held for safe custody at Corps F.P. Compound.
 - (a) Men awaiting promulgation of sentence.
 - (b) Men awaiting transfers to Military Prisons.
 - (c) Bad characters awaiting trial likely to escape from Battalion or Divisional Guard Rooms.
3. Before the prisoners are despatched, enquiries should be made from the O.C., Compound as to whether accommodation is available.
4. The following documents must accompany each soldier sent to Field Punishment Compound.
 - (a) Army Form C.386.
 - (b) Medical Certificate.
 - (c) Inventory of kit in duplicate.
- For Commanding Officer's Awards.
 - (d) Army Form C.385a.In addition to (b) and (c) aforementioned,
5. FORM OF RELEASE. Orders for release from Field Punishment prior to completion of sentence, by Commanding Officers, will be on Form J. Army Form 390; and for awards by Court Martial, order for release will be on Form I. Army Form 389a. Copies of forms required in 2 and 3 above will be supplied to Divisions.
6. CLOTHING AND EQUIPMENT. Soldiers sent to undergo Field Punishment must have rifle and equipment complete, excepting bayonet and entrenching tool.
7. Prisoners sent to the Compound should be delivered to the Officer in charge or his representative not later than 3 p.m. daily. Prisoners for discharge will be available at 2 p.m. daily. In all cases Units will be advised when men are due for release, and they must provide the necessary escort to take them away without delay.
8. The duplicate kit inventory will be signed by the Officer in charge of the Compound or his representative, and will be accepted as a receipt for the prisoner as well as an acknowledgment that he was in possession of the articles enumerated thereon.

6th December, 1917.ADMINISTRATIVE INSTRUCTION No. 146.

1. In consequence of the move of Labour Companies from the Corps Area, labour to carry on certain important works will be detailed from fighting troops in accordance with Table "A" herewith.
2. The 2nd Australian Division will arrange to supply from 9-12-17 the parties detailed from the Support Division.
3. Parties 1 to 6 will be supplied daily by the Battalions specified quartered in the neighbourhood of the work : the respective employers will arrange direct with D.H.Q. as to the actual numbers required and times at which they are to report.
4. 1st ANZAC CYCLIST BN will move on afternoon of 9-12-17 into the camp at STEENWERCK DUMP being vacated the same day by 135th Labour Coy. An advance party will arrange all details for the take-over on 8-12-17.
5. Parties Nos. 8,9,10 will move to their quarters on afternoon of 8-12-17 ready to commence work on 9-12-17: each of these parties to be in charge of their own officers and N.C.O.s.
6. Instructions as to when 3rd Aust. Pioneer Bn is to move to the camps detailed and commence work under A.D.L.R.II and R.C.E.4 will be issued later.
7. Separate instructions will be issued for the moves of the Labour Companies relieved.

SALVAGE OF PAPER AND CARDBOARD. There is an urgent demand for waste paper and cardboard and unless a considerable amount can be recovered from the Units in the Field the output of Ammunition, with the composition of which cardboard enters very largely may be seriously hampered.

It is believed from enquiries made that there should be very little difficulty in recovering a large quantity of the paper and cardboard used for packing supplies and general Ordnance Stores sent up to Units in forward Areas and also a considerable amount of paper for re-pulping from old newspapers parcels and magazines received by the troops.

Before issuing a general order for the collection of waste paper and cardboard, it has been decided by Army to try the experiment for a few weeks in the 1st Anzac Corps.

The procedure will be as follows and will be instituted forthwith:-

COLLECTION. (a). All papers and cardboard packing from cases containing supplies of various sorts - e.g. jams, biscuits, dried milk, &c., will be collected at Units Quartermasters' stores, at Cafeterias or refilling points where in most instances the cases are first opened. Newspapers, magazines and cardboard will also be collected daily within Units, and receptacles for this purpose in the form of sacks or boxes will be placed in suitable positions by Units and marked by Notice Boards.

Paper and cardboard is to be kept separate.

The actual carton containers in which jam is now packed should not be returned, as the jam adhering to them makes them useless for re-pulping.

Official correspondence must continue to be burnt and not treated as "Salvage".

The co-operation of Y.M.C.A., Comforts Fund and other Institutions is invited in this scheme.

PACKING. (b). The paper and cardboard will be packed in sacks rammed as tightly as possible, tied up and labelled "Paper" or "Cardboard" and with the name of Unit. One sack may be used for the purpose, and if supply of these received by Units is not sufficient, Supply Officers are authorized to issue additional sacks for the purpose. Bread sacks and postal bags will not be used.

DISPOSAL. (c) The filled sacks will be disposed of by empty supply wagons and lorries through refilling points, established Corps or Divisional Salvage Dumps, D.A.D.S. and O.O. Corps Troops, to railhead.

The Railheads in this Area are:-

BAUHEUDE
BRULOOZE.

At Railhead they will be received by Salvage personnel to be attached to R.O.O. for the purpose and weighed before handing over to R.O.O. for despatch to Base, so that a reliable estimate of the amount of paper and cardboard returned may be formed and a record compiled by Corps Salvage Officer each week to enable a check and comparison to be made of the returns from Corps Troops and Divisions against one another. The Corps Salvage Officer will arrange accordingly.

Any packing, which has to be returned to the Base, under the instructions of the Director of Supplies or Director of Ordnance will continue to be so dealt, and will not be collected under this scheme.

Scales will be available at the aforementioned railheads for weighing purposes.

THAW ARRANGEMENTS.

RATIONS FOR CORPS TROOPS.

1. With reference to Army Routine Order 1546 of 19/12/17, the following arrangements will apply within the 1st ANZAC Corps.
2. On receipt of telegram "Prepare for thaw", S.S.Os of Divisions and S.O. Corps Troops Supply Column, will wire Corps 'Q' stating the number of Preserved Rations (including forage) required for Corps Troops being rationed. These will be drawn on receipt of approval, and stored centrally in selected places.
3. On receipt of the telegram "Adopt thaw precautions", Divisions will arrange Horse Transport for any Corps Troops which may be using M.T. for drawing rations.
4. The Divisional Train teams at present engaged in carrying road material for the Corps Roads Officer will be released, and be available for supply work.
5. The 2nd Aust. Division will provide up to ten G.S. wagons for the use of the Corps Troops Supply Column, which will establish two Refilling Points :- viz -
 - (a) On the BAILLEUL - ARMENTIERES Road (on which lorry traffic will be allowed) for the rationing of Units stationed along that road, which normally draw by M.T. and will continue to do so.
 - (b) On the North side of STEENWERCK Railhead, for Units -
 - (i) who draw by horse transport or Ford car (and will continue to do so) and
 - (ii) who are located off the main road and do not possess wagons, and to whom delivery will have to be made by Train Transport.
6. The wagons provided by the 2nd Aust. Division will be used to clear the pack trains to the two Refilling Points, and subsequently to deliver to Units needing their assistance. At present these Units total 8, with a ration strength of 400 men.
7. The preserved rations referred to in para 2 will not be issued to Units without authority from Corps 'Q'.
8. Horse transport will be limited to half-loads during the period of thaw.
9. It is essential that the procedure on receipt of telegrams referred to in paras 2 and 3 should be elaborated in detail at once, so that the scheme will, when required, come into operation immediately and without hitch.
Divisions will report by 30th December the places selected in accordance with para 2, and the C.T.S.C. will notify the sites selected vide para 5.

4. RESERVE RATIONS.

5. QUARTERING.

Quartering will be arranged direct between Divisions.

The 3rd Aust. Divisional Supply Column and 1st ANZAC Corps Troops Supply Column will, by 2nd January 1918, vacate present quarters in STEENWERCK, which will then be taken over by the D.S.C. and A.S.P. accompanying the 57th Division.

6. TOWN GUARD OF ALIENATED, POLICE DUTIES, TRAFFIC CONTROL. will be relieved by 57th Division under mutual arrangements to be made direct with 3rd Aust. Division.

3rd Aust. Division will take over Police and Traffic duties of Support Area, establishing any necessary duties in METEREN Area.
