

"Orders have been received that afternoon that you will remain with 1st. Infy. Bde. Group until after detrainment. You will march to GEZAINCOURT to-day under your own arrangements and rejoin 1st. Infy. Bde. Group. An officer will be sent ahead to report to 1st. Bde. H. Q. at GEZAINCOURT. Orders for entrainment will be issued by 1st. Bde. "

At 18.30 a communication was received from the A.D.M.S.(No. 12/239) instructing me to detail an officer to proceed by the train which takes 9th.Austn'Infy.Bde. Officer to report to 0.C.9th.Bn.at DOULLENS SOUTH at 22.19 25th instant at train No.5. His duty being to arrange for billets at destination and escort unit to them on arrival. X. Capt.ROBINSON was detailed for this duty.
