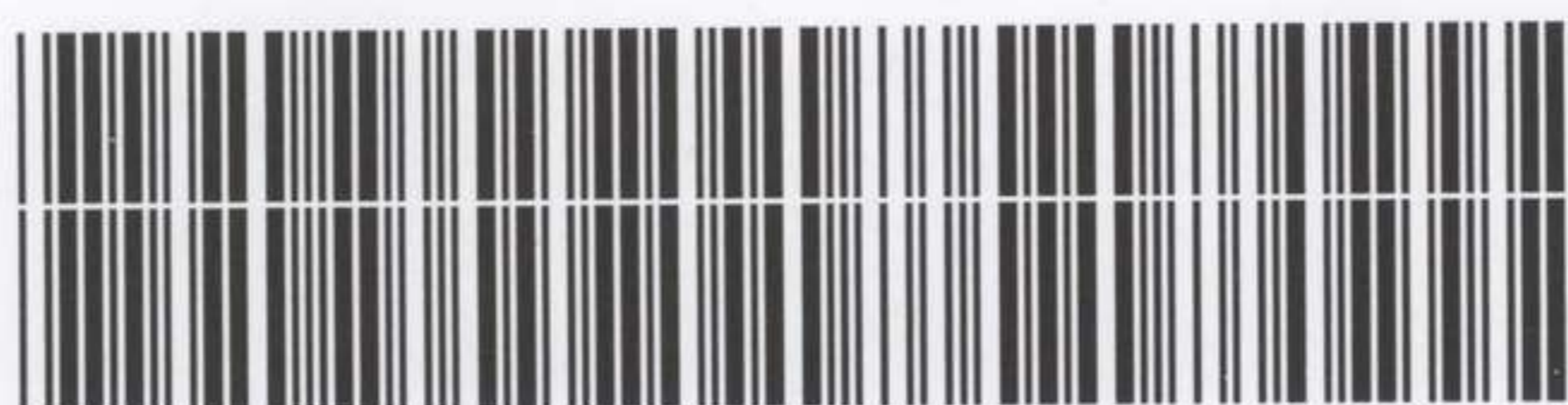



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1. Gas alarm is given in the village by sounding a gong (made from a shell case).
2. As an additional safeguard arrangements have also been made with the O.C. Heavy Battery to inform this Ambulance of any gas alarm that he may have received by telephone.
3. Two alarm signals have been set up, viz:- a shell case alarm at foot of Flag Pole, and a shell case alarm in front of the Cook House. DURING THE DAY the responsibility for giving the alarm will be on the Orderly Bugler who will cause the alarm to be given by beating the shell case at flag pole. The Sergeant Cook will sound the alarm by beating the shell case in front of Cook house ~~xxx~~
~~beating the shell case~~

All ranks will be ready to give the alarm if necessary.

BY NIGHT. The alarm will be given by the Sergeant in charge night nursing duties and the cook on night duty.

The Sergeant in charge night nursing duties is responsible for the waking of men sleeping in authorised dug-outs and any patients sleeping in the hospital tents. The cook on night duty will be responsible for waking men sleeping in main personnel tent and hut and bell tents, and also officers in the dugouts as well as the Staff of the Orderly Room and any Officers or men sleeping near the Orderly Room.

The night picquet at horse lines is responsible for waking the men of the Transport Section and men sleeping in the dug out to the right of the horse lines.

On being roused for the Gas Alarm men not on duty will turn out at once with P.H. helmet and box respirator and fall in in front of the hospital: transport at the horse lines. Nursing duty men on duty will remain at their duty with patients and take all steps necessary to ensure their safety. Patients' respirators will invariably be with them.

Officers will immediately go to their posts and take steps to assure themselves of the safety of the men of their section, or in their special department.

All ranks will remain quietly in their places until in receipt of orders from a responsible officer. If there is any smell of gas box respirators or P.H. helmets should be immediately put on.

The order whereby every rank wears both box respirator and P.H. helmet on first parade must be strictly adhered to. When working only P.H. helmets will be worn, unless the wind is dangerous, in which case both should be immediately available. At night every man should have the box respirator within easy reach.

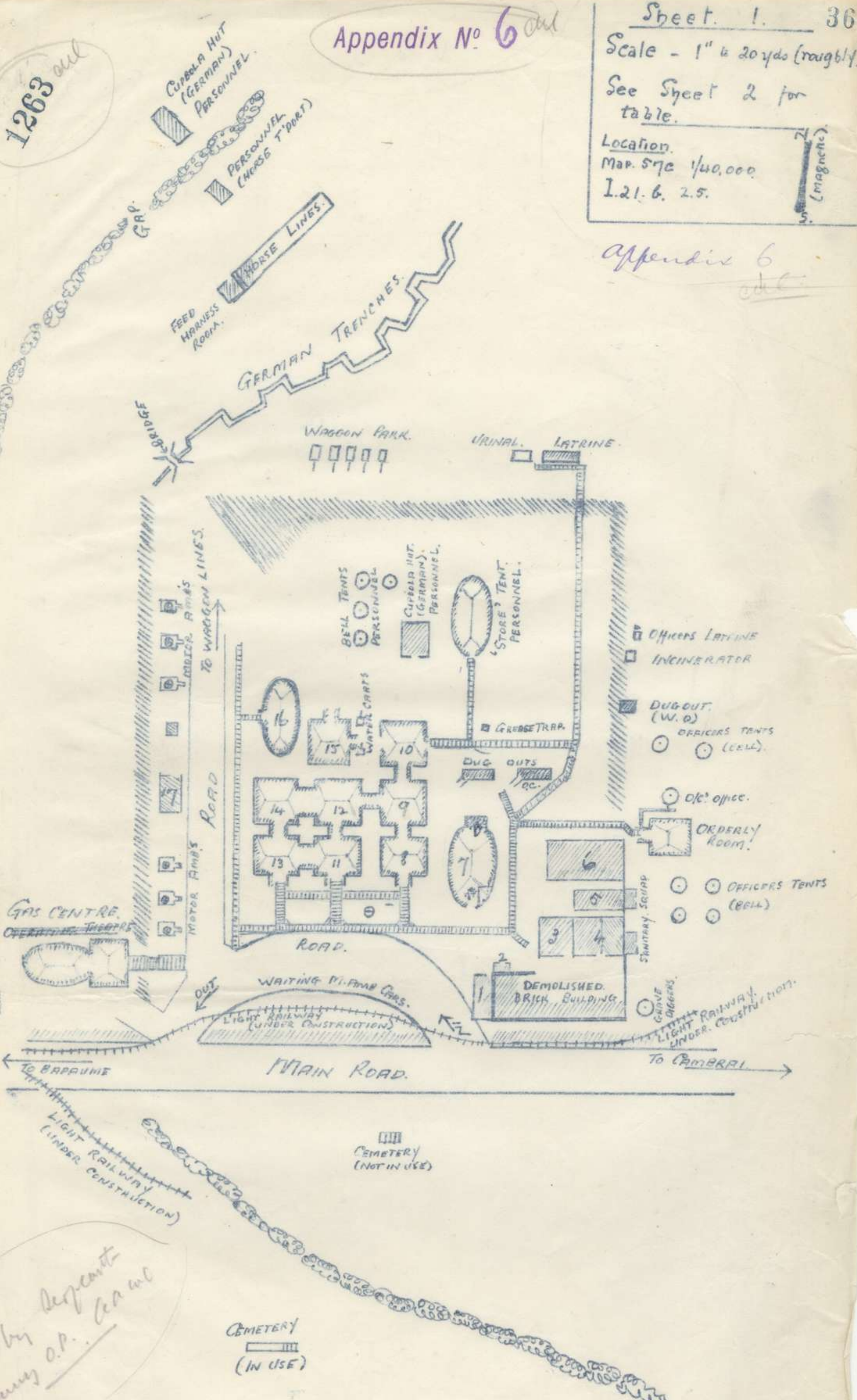
