



Position: 127.F.23.a.
Unit on left: Cavalry
Unit on right: 66th Regiment.

German Infantry W. of their position in SHUNET NIBRIN valley, estimated at about 200 men, left a week ago for AMAL (probably the half battn, 146th German Regt)
It was reported other German troops were to replace them (probably remainder of 146th Regiment (German)).
German M.G. Company near entrance to valley S. of main road.
2 Austrian 7.5 cm Q.F. gun, a short distance W. of above M.G. Coy.
4 German 10.5 cm. guns, 400 metres W. of the Austrian guns.
2 Austrian, believed to be 12 cm. guns 250 metres W. of the German guns on S. side of road.

1/74th Regiment, of 25th Division, is now at B3 SALT as garrison.
2 & 3 74th Regiment remained behind at Constantinople to be used for rounding up deserters, who are well armed and have M.G.s, and in batches in the hills.
Heard that 75th Regiment had arrived here and was distributed among other units.

"MURETTE" cavalry regt (attached 3rd Cav Div) lately formed, is composed of Divisional Cavalry and the VIIth A.C. H.Q. cavalry about 400 strong, and are on W. bank of JORDAN R. of AUJAH.
703rd German Battalion, now attached to VIIth A.C.
NB. (VIIth A.C. are reported to be in YEMEN area).
Defences: There is a long line of trenches and sangars from Hill 749 (127.Y.1.a.) to hill 830 (127.T.12.d.) trenches are 5 feet deep, with firing step.
Wire is erected along the front of these trenches except where roads pass through.
(N.B. See D.M.C. Summary I.51/61 para 4, Enemy Defences).
Horses are in a very bad condition.
Leaflets dropped by aeroplane and our patrols have been picked up and read.
Guns of mule mtd I. have been transferred to 40th Division.
No units of 2nd Caucasus Cavalry Brigade have proceeded W.
Has never heard of the 10th Cavalry Regiment.

ii. In addition, there are several positions unlocated, observation being extremely difficult and sound bearings without mechanical registration very mis-leading.

iii. On the 11/12th enemy artillery showed marked activity, increase particularly in our left sector. Probably guns were pushed forward for this.

iv. Heavy howitzer shells are reported to have fallen on our right Sector - more definite information as to calibre will be furnished.

v. 8 enemy positions have been definitely engaged with aeroplane co-operation.

vi. Estimate total number of enemy guns on Corps front - 40 to 50.

Intelligence Summary

Up to 1630 - June 17th, 1918

1. OPERATIONS.

(a) Right Sector: 0845. 16th June:

(i) Patrols to 127.P.20.central and P.l.c. fired on from 127.P.20.c.8.2.

0700

(ii) Patrol to 127.P.16. fired on by mountain gun.

(iii) This mornings operations commenced 0845 troops withdrew 1135. General line of reconnaissance ordered eastwards reached along whole front with exception of immediate vicinity of KYBB SAID where considerable amount of rifle and M.G. fire was experienced, and the NADABA track B.25 a. Our estimated casualties one officer 16 OR wounded. 30 enemy believed speared. P/W taken, 2. Several good targets for Hotchkiss and M.G. obtained.

(b) Left Sector: (i) Situation unchanged.

(ii) From 1830 to 1915 long range enemy gun shelled area about 113.J.27 and towards JERICHO.

Smoke discharge located on bearing 325° mag from 113.E 12.d.cent also by sound bearing 325° from 113.Y.29.b central, and 245° from MUSALLABEH. Now thought to be located at 113.E.16.b.

Hostile aeroplane flying low co-operating with gun.

(c) Corps on our Left:

(i) Quiet night.

(ii) Covering party dispersed, enemy patrol attempting to interfere with working party on ROUND HILL (Q.14).

(d) Corps Coastal Sector:

(i) Situation unchanged.

(ii) Enemy shelled RAFAT.

3. IDENTIFICATIONS (contd)

(c) Officer P/W 11th Cavalry Regt, further interrogated states:-

Patrols are ordered to do their utmost to reconnoitre the HAJLA Ford, with a view to locating position of bridge, as they fear attack from this direction.

Reported that we have withdrawn some of our force from the Jordan valley.

Patrols are not keen about their work, as owing to poor condition of their horses, they are afraid to go far from their own lines for fear of being charged and overtaken by our patrols.

(d) German P/W, 146th German Regt: taken at 127.P.13.c. willing and credible states: (preliminary interrogation)

3rd Battn is in the line (2 Coys in reserve)

Position of 1 Coy (100 men) just left of house 127.P.17.c.

1st and 2nd Bns in reserve at SALT.

Turks expect to be attacked in a week's time and they do not intend to fight, but will give themselves up.

(e) Sergt deserter 9/3/61st Regiment, to Corps Coastal Sector states: He has heard that 63rd Regiment has returned into reserve from the Jordan, but has not seen them.

(N.B. This statement is contradicted by the fact that on the 6th and 9th instants, 4 deserters were taken E. of Jordan and on the 16th 1 prisoner was taken at 127.P.27.d.

(f) Willing, but rather ignorant deserter of 4th Coy, 3/2nd Regt 24th Division, taken at 113.W.36.a. states:-

Position: (4th Coy) 113.W.24 (approx) about 1 hour's distance from the river.

Strength: 60 rifles.

Machine Guns: 5 M.Gs, 40 Machine gunners.

Only 4th Coy. in each battalion of his regiment have machine guns. Other Coys have auto-rifles (number unknown)

Locations: 2nd Battalion on right.

1st Battn in reserve N. about to relieve the 2nd Bn. Cavalry west of 2nd Battalion.

Defences: Line of short trenches breast high, occupied by about 8-10 men each during the night. Two men remain in each during the day. Front is now being wired.

Water: Brought from the Jordan.

Identifications: 24th Divisional H.Q. near JISA ED-DAMIE.

Personalities: G.O.C., 24th Divn: ? THOMA (a German)

O.C., 2nd Regt - Major Sirri Bey.

(wounded during recent operations East of the Jordan and evacuated to hospital).

O.C., 3/2nd Regt - Capt Hassan Eff.

General: Took up present position 5 days ago.

Deserter arrived from Damascus, via Habis, about a month ago with a draft of 30 men, and proceeded to Jisr-ed-Damie. Here he saw the 58th Regiment on the west bank near the bridge.

He crossed East with 12 men and was attached to the 2nd Regiment. He did not come from Habis by the carriage road, but saw lorries on the west bank at Damie which had arrived from Habis.

3. IDENTIFICATIONS.

(f) continued:

When going East he saw German infantry on both banks at JISR ED DAMIE. On his return 20 days ago he did not see these, but only saw some Germans who are in charge of the ferry.

Believes the 143rd Regiment remained East of the Jordan, and was told the 58th Regiment had proceeded to NABLUS.

When deserter arrived at his regiment he was told that 15 wounded had been evacuated and 8 killed and missing from his battalion (the 3rd) during the recent operations.

113.R.15.b.5.9. Observer states gun pits appeared occupied no wagon lines or tractors were observed. A small well camouflaged camp was observed near battery position. A well defined track leads to battery position from track in 113.R.8.cent Gun pits are on bank of small branch wadi - bearings to dust and smoke of discharge from Left Sectors O.Ps. and bearing of scoops formed by shells in Jericho confirm location of gun in 113.R.15. Further information re nature of projectile is being obtained.

Enemy 4.2 Hows. fired from smoke bearing 324° from 113.Y.29.d.7.4 also 500 from 113.W.35.c.3.6.

1900-1910. Area 500 to 1000 yds in front of GHORANIYE wire searched and swept by 4.2 Hows. and 77 mm. 50 rounds.

1900-1910. Same area with mountain guns and 4.2 hows: brisk bombardment some rounds fell W. of JORDAN.

0730. 77 mm. 60° from 127.Q.1.c.3.6. firing on troops in 127.O.36.

0811. Bridgehead area Right Sector was shelled.

0740. No. 3 road was shelled.

- 113.T. Constant movement of small parties of infantry, in vicinity of MUSJETERAH, T.10.11.13.17.18.
- 113.U. Movement chiefly of cavalry and packs. About 200 cavalry observed in two parties on 10th instant, 50 infantry observed same day; No more reported.
- 113.V. Constant movement of infantry and packs, 15th inst. Considerable movement in vicinity of KAFID JOZELE (V.23) 13/6/18. Ferries reported both at V.22.d.7.7. and V.23.c.4.7. Latter reported 17/6/18 to be pontoon bridge under construction. Ref: Sheet XV.
- 113.W. Small amount of movement cavalry infantry and packs. Not remarkable.
- 113.X. Redoubt in X.21. noted for movement 15th inst. Traffic of packs in area. 150 cavalry moving N. on Um. 13F SHEET track 10th instant.
- 127.C. Regular movement in ALD HILL area, infantry, cavalry and packs. Supplies come from J. of Jordan. Bodies of infantry up to 200 and of cavalry up to 50 observed different days.
- 127.F. Considerable movement 18th instant of men, horses and camels.
- 127.G. Supposed supply depot G.10.cent; daily movement about 0500 and 1500.
- 127.P. Usual movement behind the lines during period, but now much less than during May. On 16th inst considerable movement at JOSET DERBASI.
- 127.T. Usually 50/60 cavalry reported in area. A.A. guns at KABR SAID. Movement round T.15.cent (house) 13th inst; This area becoming more frequented.
- 127.W. 300 cavalry noted 11th instant W.4 - 16. Now works and movement reported between points 830 to 749.
- 127.Y. TILL EL RAH to EL ADIME area occupied.
- 128.B. Area becoming more frequented - Defences commenced.
- KUTRAHI. Force of all arms appears to have arrived in the district. Probably chiefly composed of irregular troops. R.A.F. reconnaissance on 16th instant shows decrease of 57 T.S. leaving 34 T.S. still in area.

West of this Ghali Bey's "MURRESEZI" Brigade (?) composed of 1 battn Infantry (strength unknown), 4 squadrons (about 40 men each) of the Muretab (Composite) Cavalry, and several batteries of guns.

16th Depot Battalion is attached to the 24th Division and is quartered at 113.V.12.

Identifications: Men at SALT 10 days ago be heard from a Turkish speaking German interpreter that the 161st German Battalion was at SALT. This, the interpreter estimated, was about 700 strong.

Organization: 7th Divn has been absorbed by the 16th Divn (?) 3rd Division has been absorbed by the 20th Division. The staffs of both these divisions have proceeded to Smyrna.

Sergt major originally belonged to the 27th Cav Regiment which was composed of 5 squadrons each over 150 strong. These were attached as follows:

Of these 1200 are reported to have come from the 14th Depot Regiment, at Constantinople, about 600 from Labour Battns, at ALEPPO, and a small draft from the Caucasus. The remainder consisted for the most part of convalescents and recaptured deserters from BAALBEK (13th Depot Rgt) and DAMASCUS, and included 300 men released from the civil prisons at DAMASCUS. Drafts as a rule appear to be sent unarmed and usually under escort, owing to the many cases of desertion.

(b) Hejaz: An Arab detachment operating between BOWAT (38 miles N. of MEDINA) and HAFIRA (14 miles S. of BOWAT) about the 15th June destroyed more than 4 kilometres of line.

7. TOPOGRAPHY. Report on country S. of WADI ER RAME (127.3 & T.

Between the W. ER RAME and the W. EL JOFRA a low scrubbed covered country affords excellent manoeuvring ground for cavalry, at all paces and on any frontage. TELL GHASSUL is a small hill with 3 small dilapidated houses on it. TELL GHASSUL can be galloped. The JOFRA itself is an open depression about 150 yards wide, with low shelving banks.

From S.29 central to T.17.d. it is hardly perceptible. The banks though broken furnish no serious obstacle as far as T.17.b. Squares T.11 and 12 are open plain. There are moderately steep banks in squares T.17. and 18 but troops can cross in places on a frontage of two troops extended, at the trot.

Between the WADI EL JOFRA and the wadi EL ADEINE the country begins to undulate, is covered with thin scrub and inclined to be broken and difficult, but can be traversed at the trot. Nearer to the hills it improves slightly. From T.23.d. to T.24.b. the ADEINE has rather steep broken banks about 30 feet high, but it can be negotiated anywhere. The wadi itself is about 100 yards wide and is covered with rather thick scrub. From T.26.d. to the DEAD SEA the bed of the wadi is covered with dense brushwood and reeds, almost impossible to cross. The banks are further apart and shelve gradually. From wadi EL ADEINE to WADI GHUEIR the ground is dangerous at fast paces on account of holes, otherwise it is easily covered. It is undulating and broken. The branches of the Wadi EL ADEINE squares T.27 to E.8 and T.22.c. to T.30.b. are easily crossed and, at a fast pace are scarcely noticeable. KH SULE is a small brown hill with a few shaks on it. The ground in this area also improves slightly towards the hills to the East. The WADI GHUEIR from the DEAD SEA to E.9. central is about 300 yards wide, has steep banks and is almost impossible to cross. From E.9. central to E.12.d. the ground is terraced from N. to S. and rough. The width of the Wadi bed is about 200 yards.

The North bank is about 20 feet high, and gently sloping. It can be crossed without difficulty. The wadi bed and south bank is riddled with holes and covered with thin scrub.

South of the Wadi GHUEIR the country slopes gently towards the DEAD SEA. The surface is heavily covered with reeds. Speaking generally this country is not easily crossed by cavalry on a wide front.

AIN SULE is a thick light green patch of reeds.

Although the country south of the wadi RAME is for the most part anywhere passable for mounted troops, it is the sort of country where ground scouting is of greatest importance.

7. TOPOGRAPHY.

WADIS. Wadi AYUN MUSA in squares T.23. & 24. is approximately 15 yards wide. The banks are about 10 feet high but sloping in places and capable of being crossed by cavalry almost anywhere. WADI EL JOFRE in T.17.b. is a very gradual depression and hardly noticeable when moving fast.

WADI ER RAME in T.5. - T.6 is not a deep depression. On either bank there is a lot of scrub and there are reeds along the water edge. The banks, though only about two feet high are perpendicular and prevent cavalry crossing the Wadi ^{in places}. There are paths at fairly frequent irregular intervals where it is not difficult to cross in single file. Proper crossings could easily be made in many places in the locality. The width of the water is about 15 feet and the depth about 18 inches.

WADI ZIGHAN in R.29.b. - 30.a. is about 15 feet wide. It is easily crossed as the banks are low and shelve to the water. It can be crossed in places on a frontage of a troop extended.

THICK SCRUB: Thick scrub is found in area T.17.a. & b. T.11.b. and d., and T.5. b & d. The belt becomes wider towards squares T.5 and 6 and is more dense there than in T.17 & 11. The scrub is nowhere dense enough to prevent single mounted men moving at a canter.

IRRIGATION TRENCHES "Blind" irrigation cuts occur in T.5 and rendering the country dangerous to move over at a fast pace. They are very frequent in R.29 and 36, and also in R.35 and 36 where there are small clearings for crops.

OPEN COUNTRY. The country in squares T.23.a. and b., T.24. a & b, T.17. c and T.18 is flat and open and can be traversed at a gallop. North of WADI ZIGHAN there is ordinary scrub covered plain, but much of the scrub has been cleared by burning. It is not known whether the irrigation cuts continue north of WADI ZIGHAN.

Deserter originally belonged to the 74th Regiment, 25th Division. Was in Roumania at Braila. Left there about 6 months ago with his regiment and remained in Constantinople for about 4 months. Quarters at Selansiz, south of Scutari, in Armenian houses from which the tenants have been evacuated.

Left Constantinople with the 1/74th Regiment, 300 strong, direct to HABLUS without leaving their trucks except to change from the broad to the narrow gauge. The journey occupied 15-16 days, but many hours were spent at stations during which time the men were kept in the trucks. They travelled 40 men to a truck.

The regiment arrived at HABLUS/strong, 100 having deserted en route. 25 men were drafted to the 74th Regiment.

The 1st and 2nd Battalions, with the regimental artillery, left about 40 days previous to the 3rd Battn. They embarked on a steamer at HAIDAR PASHA and it was reported were proceeding to Smyrna.

(It is possible that if troops were urgently required at Smyrna and there was a shortage of rolling stock on the Haidar Pasha line, troops would proceed by steamer to Panderma and from there by train to Smyrna over the Panderma-Soma line. Meantime it was previously reported that elements of the 25th Division had proceeded by steamer for the Caucasus front).

N.B. It may be more than coincidence that OSMAN NURI Bey, who is said to have organised and carried out the Armenian massacres, was relieved of the command of the 7th Division as soon as it joined the XXIInd A.C.).

Is an "ERKIAN - I - HARE MIRALAI", that is a Staff Colonel, (i.e. equivalent to our P.S.C.). He originally commanded the 13rd Division and then was transferred to the 3rd Divn on its arrival on the Sinai front. At the battle of Beersheba he commanded a group under Von Kress, and subsequently the 1st Division again.

It is reported that he was considered the best divisional commander in Syria during the first half of 1917 and a better strategist than Von Kress.

A Circassian of Ismidt.

Clever, and a man of great experience - unpopular.

Said to dislike the German. Said to be addicted to oriental vice.

At the JARDANELLES he gained the reputation of a capable commander.

Has been in command of the 16th Division ever since its arrival in Palestine in February 1917.

(c) ESSAD Bey: MIRALAI - O.C., 3rd Cavalry Division. of RUMELIA.

About 40 years old.

Short and of dark appearance. Is said to be a brother of ESSAD Pasha (G.O.C., V Army) or more probably IZZET Pasha, (ex-G.O.C., II Army in the Caucasus).

Very strict and feared by his subordinates.

Has been in command of the 3rd Cavalry Division since its arrival on this front in early 1917 and was also appointed O.C., the DIR SAEA Group during the summer of 1917. Was wounded in the operations east of the Jordan early in May 1918, but is reported to have since returned. Said to have been recently promoted Pasha.

(d) MEHMET Bey, O.C., 7th Cavalry Regt

A Circassian of noble family.

Tall, well built and fair.

Known as "DELI MEHMET" = MAD MEHMET.

Said to be careless but quite fearless.

Usually does as he wishes regardless of orders. Popular with his men.

An undated captured document of the 77th Regt lays down the strength of a Turkish machine gun company "according to recently issued orders" as "sergeants, 9 corporals, 63 gunners and 9 machine guns."

It should be noted that no companies on this front have yet been known to have more than 6 machine guns.

8. GENERAL.

(i) Greek deserter from 2/76th Regiment states that a large fire in Constantinople rendered 15,000 families homeless. Psamatia, Koum Kapou, Yedi Koule districts, and as far as the Golden Horn, have been burnt out. This news was brought by a Colonel who arrived from Constantinople.

Deserter was at Kadikieni on the date that the explosion took place at Haidar Pasha. His version of this is as follows:- The explosion took place between 3 and 4 pm. There were 2 trains in the station loaded with ammunition and the explosion commenced in one of these. Both trains were completely wrecked and a large number of men, reported about 500, disappeared. The Scutari-sirkedji ferry boat was sunk and also a cargo steamer. Also many small tugs, motor boats, lighters and sailing craft. There were also the railway company's lighters which are used for transporting new rolling stock from the European railway line to Haidar Pasha, containing new wagons. These were also destroyed. All buildings and material in the vicinity were wrecked. The station is being rebuilt.

(ii)

Reliable agent reports:

Between 6th and 11th instant he saw about 1,000 troops arrive at ES SALT. The party proceeded to SHUNET NIMRIN. On 13th instant he saw about 400 German troops proceed by motor lorries from ES SALT to AMMAN. At AMMAN on 17th instant he saw the same number of German troops march south, reported destination KUTRANI. He heard on 23rd instant that Nouwaf son of Sheikh Nouri Abu Shalom of Rowalla tribe arrived at ZIZA with about 1500 men mounted on camels. His object was to co-operate with Turks and fight against the Sherif. He made certain demands from the Turks which were not granted. He then left ZIZA and proceeded East.

B. GENERAL (continued).

(iii) Land-mines. Deserter from 1/23rd Regiment, described as credible and intelligent states that land-mines have been laid in front of his regiment's defences and those of the 88th and 191st Regiments. They are laid 50 paces in front of the entanglements which are 50 paces in front of the trenches. This is confirmed by a prisoner from 191st Regiment who states that one exploded accidentally.

According to an agents report dated 21st June the Turks are actively engaged on extension of railway towards Mosul. On 11th March rails had been laid to within 8 kilometres of Misihin.

One Battn was absorbed before leaving Macedonia, where part of 11th Grenadier (2nd Silesian) Regt, was drafted in. All unfit men, malaria patients, etc. were drafted out, only men classified "tropenienstfahig" (fit for tropical service) being sent to Palestine. Discharged malaria patients were sent to the Western front.

Previous information shows that the regiment in Macedonia consisted of 15 companies, of which Nos 5, 11 and 15 were machine gun units. Nos. 2, 7 and 9 were absorbed by other companies, leaving 3 bns, or 9 infantry and 3 machine gun companies.

8. GENERAL. Organisation (contd)

Companies of the 3rd Bn left Macedonia about 100 strong, but lost about 40 men per company en route to this front owing to venereal and other sickness. Since arrival one company is said to have lost about 55 men from typhus, malaria and dysentery.

An "Ersatz" (Reserve) unit for the regiment has been formed at its depot at Allenstein (East Prussia) and will probably number about 150 men. This left Allenstein about the end of May and should reach this front about the end of June or early in July.

(ii) 11th Reserve Jaeger Bn.

A reliable agent reports that three detachments of this battalion, comprising 21 officers, 654 other ranks and 431 transport animals, passed southwards through RAYAK between 19th and 23rd May.

NOTE: This apparently does not comprise the whole of the battalion, as the itinerary given in a diary of a man of this regiment shows that he arrived at Aleppo on 23rd May and at Damascus on 25th May. The number of transport animals given is abnormal as the normal number of animals with a battalion is about 60.
