2nd.LIGHT HORSE BRIGADE.

To:- C.O., 5th. L.H.Regiment.

1. The following reliefs will be carried out by you on May 23, 1919:-

- One Officer & 16 OR's with one Hochkiss Gun will proceed to ATF and relieve detachment of Cape Corps commanded by Lieut. Templer. One Officer & 28 OR's with one Hochkiss Gun will proceed to DESUQ and relieve detachment of Cape Corps commanded by Lieut. Louw.
- 2. The steam launch "Stella" will leave DAMANHUR for ATF at 0800 and will carry gear and kits of relief. Two motor lorries will leave at 0800 for DESUQ and carry kits &c of relief.

Necessary Guards will accompany kits.

- 3. Relieving Columns will leave DAMANHUR at 0800 to-morrow.
- 4. Reserve rations, S.A.A., equipment, tents &c. will be taken over, and copies of receipts forwarded to this office.
- 5. Rations, Water, and Forage will be taken daily to ATF by the "Stella", and to DESUQ by motor lorry, under arrangements to be made by you.
