

1. As a measure rendered necessary by the process of demobilization, and as the number of troops remaining in the Division no longer necessitates the retention of the same number of Headquarters Staffs as hitherto, the following reductions have been approved.

2. Headquarters 5th Aust. Divisional Artillery will cease to operate as such on the 17th instant. The C.R.A. will make arrangements to wind up all outstanding matters by that date, and will also arrange that -

- (a) All office records are completed and handed to Cadre "B" for custody and delivery to Records Section A.I.F. H.Q. (The C.R.A. and Cadre "B" will be attached to 5th Aust. Divisional Headquarters until all artillery demobilization questions have been settled. Cadre "B" will then be despatched to England).
- (b) All mobilization stores are returned to Ordnance.
- (c) All animals are disposed of under instructions to be issued by "Q" Branch.

3. On a date to be notified later, and which will be subsequent to the departure of Embarkation Quota No. 20, the 8th and 15th Aust. Infantry Brigade Groups will be amalgamated and will come under the command of Brig-General C.S. DAVIES D.S.O.; Headquarters 15th A.I. Brigade will then cease to operate. Instructions as to the disposal of the Commander and Staff of the 15th A.I. Brigade will be issued separately. Attached officers will return to their units and will be available for repatriation in their turn according to their position on the respective precedence rolls.

Cadre "B" 15th A.I. Brigade will be attached to 8th A.I. Brigade Headquarters and the selected officer will be available for duty with 8th A.I. Brigade Headquarters.


G.O.C. 15th A.I. Brigade will arrange to wind up all outstanding matters by the 17th instant and will be prepared to return all equipment, stores and animals, and to hand all office records to Cadre "B" by the 18th instant.

Instructions as to moves of units which may be rendered necessary by this amalgamation will be issued later.

23 In continuation of Australian Corps memo 71/198 dated 10th March 1919, the following decisions were arrived at by the various representatives at a Meeting held at 2nd Australian Divisional Headquarters on 12-3-19 :-

1. OFFICE. It was decided to establish an Office in CHARLEROI, the location of which is at present unknown, but this information will be wired to all concerned as soon as available. In the meantime wires, correspondence etc should be addressed to "SECRETARY GALA COMMITTEE" c/o 2nd Aust. Divisional H.Qs.

(a) Wires. Arrangements have been made for the Signal Service to accept for despatch wires addressed "PRESIDENT GALA", which will be delivered to B.G.G.S. Australian Corps, and "CHAIRMAN or SECRETARY GALA" which will be delivered to Gala Committee Rooms.

2. DATE. The date of Gala has been fixed for 12th and 13th April 19.

3. GROUNDS The ground selected is at MONT-SUR-MARCHIENNE, situated about 8 miles from CHARLEROI Railway Station.

The matter of selection of personnel of Sub-Committees is left entirely to the respective CHAIRMEN named. The names of such personnel selected will be forwarded to the SECRETARY as soon as possible.

6. CORRESPONDENCE ETC. Authority has been granted for the Chairmen of Sub-Committees to deal direct with Divisions in all matters. Any arrangements made direct with Divisions will be communicated at once to the SECRETARY at Committee Rooms.

7. PROCESSION. For the procession each Division and Corps Troops will supply the following :-

(a) One Company of Infantry comprising 6 Officers and 106 other ranks. These will be composed as follows :-

O.C. Coy.  
2nd in Command.  
4 Platoon Officers.  
1 C.S.M.  
1 C.Q.M.S.  
4 Platoon Sergeants.  
100 Other Ranks.

Dress will be "drill order". It is specially asked that particular care be taken in the selection of men for these Coys, and that their appearance will be a credit to the Australian forces. A.D.O.S. has been asked to render every possible assistance in providing new clothing, color patches etc.

(b) All available bands.

(c) Four (4) Tableaux'. These will be mounted on either lorries or wagons. Full details of required space in the procession for such tableaux' will be forwarded as soon as the information is available.

(d) All mounted troops available drawn from Artillery or Regimental.

(e) Decorated lorry.

(f) Decorated Box Car.

(g) As many competitors for Fancy Dress Competition as possible.

In addition to the above Corps Troops will supply a troop of Light Horse (if possible).

Infantry and Light Horse in the Procession will be regarded as competitive, and medals given to each member of the best turned out Divisional group.

8. CIVILIAN DEMONSTRATIONS. The Civilian Authorities have been asked to supply TABLEAUX' of their own, and have willingly accepted the offer and manifested a keen desire to outdo our own exhibits.

9. PROGRAMME. The Procession will be marshalled in the main square at CHARLEROI, and will march to the grounds already indicated at MONT-SUR-MARCHIENNE, a distance of about 2 kilos. It is anticipated that the procession will be of such dimensions that the head of same will arrive on the ground at the same time as the last portion is leaving the Square at CHARLEROI. This means that the whole of the Traffic will be blocked along the route in favour of the Procession, and arrangements are already in hand to make the line of march as decorative as possible by the display of bunting etc.

(a) FIRST DAY. The first day will be entirely given up to the Procession, football matches, and athletic events. It is hoped to make satisfactory arrangements for lighting to enable concert parties, boxing tournaments, and cinema shows to proceed during the evening in buildings which will be erected on the grounds.

Failing the provision of suitable lighting, those shows will be run concurrently with athletic and other outdoor amusements.

- (b) SECOND DAY The amusements on the second day will be chiefly mounted events, with possibly, the finals of boxing and football. During the evening there will be a grand fireworks display.
- (c) PRIZES. In order to commemorate the fete and stimulate individual effort to make it a success, it has been decided to pursue a most generous policy in the matter of prizes. Cups for Race Meeting medals for members of winning teams in football, tableau, athletics, fancy dress competitions etc will be secured from ENGLAND. If time permits a special medal will be struck which will serve as a lasting souvenir of the occasion.
10. CATERING. Adequate provision will be made for the supply of meals on the rounds during the days of the fete. The active co-operation of the Australian Comforts Funds and Y.M.C.A. has already been secured, and every effort will be made to augment the supply which they have promised, thus ensuring a plentiful supply for all concerned.

The Corps Commander specially wishes that all Commanders and Staffs, as well as personnel of Units will personally co-operate in assuring a successful outcome of the fete as fully and worthily representative of AUSTRALIA.



With reference to this office 71/192 of 5th instant referring to the proposal to hold a Gala Day early in April, a meeting of Corps and Divisional representatives was held at Corps Headquarters on 10th instant.

The following decisions were made at the meeting :-

GALA DAY: It was decided to hold a festival on the lines laid down in the letter named and that it should take place on the 5th and 6th April, 1919, covering two days.

FINANCE: It was estimated that the probable cost of the festival will not exceed £5,000.

Under normal conditions it was thought that the festival would more than pay expenses except under the most unfavourable conditions.

In order to meet immediate expenditure it was decided to ask that funds be granted from -

- (1) A.I.F. Trust Account.
- (2) Australian Comforts Fund.
- (3) Y.M.C.A. Funds.

The money advanced to be repaid from the takings.

Y.M.C.A. representative was asked for an immediate grant of £500.

It is hoped to get the greater part of the expenses back from civilian gate money, and entertainments and side shows on the ground for which admission will be charged.

PROGRAMME: The following is a brief outline of the general nature of the programme. Details will be fixed by the Executive Committee later :-

First Day. Procession.  
Football Matches.  
Athletic Competitions.  
Boxing.

Second Day. Football Matches.  
Mounted Events and Racing.  
Boxing.

Continuing side shows will be organised by the various sub-committees to run in conjunction with these events on both days.

The High Commissioner for the Commonwealth and the Agents-General for each State will be asked to organise exhibitions of Australian products, &c., on the lines of the Australian exhibits at the LYONS Exhibition. It may be possible to have the LYONS exhibits brought to CHARLEROI.

Pierrot shows and concert parties will give performances at which charges for admission will be made.

Civilians will also be asked to assist in providing entertainments.



A proposal has been put forward to hold an Australian Gala Day in the Corps early in April, in or near CHARLEROI. The Corps Commander has given his approval and the Aust. Y.M.C.A. have volunteered to give every assistance. The idea is to create something of absorbing interest for the troops remaining in the Corps Area and to get as many men as possible interested. Each unit will be asked to contribute some item to the day's activities, and competitions will be held.

The Corps Commander desires to know the feeling of Divisional Commanders on the matter.

If the general opinion is favourable a meeting will be held at Corps H.Q., HAM-sur-HEURE at 11 a.m. on 10th March. Each Division and Corps Troops will send a representative who should be thoroughly acquainted with the proposals and the opinion of the Divisional Commander. An officer from the Corps "G" Staff and "Q" Staff will also be present at the meeting. It will also be necessary to decide the most suitable date on which to hold the fete.

Briefly the proposals are as given below. These are for consideration by Divisions and for discussion and suggestion at the meeting.

No. 1 Grand Procession through CHARLEROI (Morning)

Using lorries without hoods, G.S. wagons, civilian vehicles.

A. "Keystone" tableaux depicting various aspects of Australian soldiers life on active service.

B. Tableaux shewing certain aspects of Australian life at home.

C. Topical tableaux of general interest etc.

D. Bands interspersed.

E. Picked troops. Shewing companies of Infantry, Artillery, etc., on the march.

F. Any other interesting items.

The items in the procession to include those of interest to both Australian troops and civilians.

No. 2 Arts, Crafts and Sports Exhibition. (Afternoon and evening).

To consist of simultaneous shows on a tented field close to, or in CHARLEROI. The procession to finish on the grounds.

Educational. Australian productions in metal, leather, paper and brush work. JEUMONT workshops. Great mock trial in full dress costumes.

Recreational. Sports finals if possible. Competitions or exhibitions in Boxing, Basket ball etc.

P.T.O.

Musical. Concert parties of divisions etc. to combine in presenting musical & pierrot programmes.

Funny competitions. Competitions in best make-up, best comic song, best clown turn etc.

Repatriation. Australia House to be asked to shew m. ps., pictures, charts, etc., shewing Aust. opportunities in agriculture, industry, etc.

Publications. Aust. publications sections to shew war pictures etc. War Records Section may be able to assist.

#### Arrangements and Control.

It is proposed that the following committees and sub-committees will be appointed at the meeting to carry out all arrangements in connection with the day and to control the organisation.

##### 1. Executive Committee.

##### 2. Sub-committees:-

- (a) Procession.
- (b) Education.
- (c) Recreation
- (d) Music
- (e) Repatriation.

As the time for preparation is necessarily short it will be essential to start the preliminary arrangements with the least possible delay.







A proposal has been put forward to hold an Australian Gala Day in the Corps early in April, in or near CHARLEROI. The Corps Commander has given his approval and the Aust. The Corps Commander desires to know the feeling of Division Commanders on the matter.

If the general opinion is favourable a meeting will be held at Corps H.Q., HAM-SUR-HEURE at 11 a.m. on 10th March. Each Division and Corps Troops will send a representative who should be thoroughly acquainted with the proposals and the opinion of the Division Commander. An officer from the Corps 'G' staff and 'Q' staff will also be present at the meeting. It will also be necessary to decide the most suitable date on which to hold the fete.

Briefly the proposals are as given below. These are for consideration by Divisions and for discussion and suggestion at the meeting.

- F. Any other interesting items.

No.2. Arts, Crafts and Sports Exhibition. (Afternoon and Evening).

To consist of simultaneous shows on a tented field close to, or in CHARLEROI. The procession to finish on the grounds.

Educational. Aust. productions in metal, leather, paper and brush work. JEUMONT workshops. Great mock trial in full dress costumes.

Recreational. Sports finals if possible. Competitions or exhibitions in Boxing, Basket Ball etc.

Musical. Concert parties of divisions etc., to combine in presenting musical & pierrot programmes.

Funny Com- Competitions in best make-up, best comic petitions. song, best clown turn etc.

Repatriation. Australia House to be asked to shew maps, pictures, charts etc., shewing Aust. opportunities in agriculture, industry etc.

Publications. Aust. Publications sections to shew war pictures etc.

War Records Section may be able to assist.

Arrangements and Control.

It is proposed that the following committees and sub-committees will be appointed at the meeting to carry out all arrangements in connection with the day and to control the organisation.

1. Executive Committee.

2. Sub-committees :-

- (a) Procession.
- (b) Education.
- (c) Recreation.
- (d) Music.
- (e) Repatriation.
- (f) Publications.
- (g) Finance.

As the time for preparation is necessarily short it will be essential to start the preliminary arrangements with the least possible delay.

Finance.

Each unit should bear the cost of its own contribution. Expenses of central control to be met by sale of souvenir programmes, refreshments, probable assistance from Aust. Y.M.C.A.

## GENERAL STAFF MEMORANDUM NO. 247.

1. The process of demobilisation has now reached the stage at which the amalgamation of Divisions can be carried out. 1st and 4th Aust. Divisions are to be combined to form 'A' Divisional Group under the command of the G.O.C. 4th Aust. Division. 2nd and 5th Aust. Divisions are to be combined to form 'B' Divisional Group under the command of the G.O.C. 5th Aust. Division.
2. On the amalgamation of the 2nd and 5th Aust. Divisions, which will probably take place after the departure of the next Embarkation Quota from each of the two divisions, the 2nd Aust. Divisional Headquarters will cease to operate as such, and will be reduced to Cadre strength. 'B' Divisional Headquarters will be formed from the combined staffs of the two Divisions.
3. For the purpose of organising quotas the original divisional numbering will be retained; thus the present 2nd Aust. Division will be known as 'B.2 Group' and the 5th Aust. Division as 'B.5 Group'.
4. The above proposals are subject to the concurrence of the Department of Repatriation and Demobilisation. As soon as this is received orders to effect the amalgamation of the Divisions will be issued. In the meantime preliminary arrangements <sup>are</sup> being made in order that the combination may be effected <sup>immediately</sup> on receipt of such orders.
5. (a) 2nd and 5th Aust. Div. Signal Companies will be amalgamated under the command of the O.C., 2nd Aust. Div. Signal Company. O.C. 5th Aust. Div. Signal Company will report to 2nd Aust. Div. Signal Company for instructions and will make all preliminary arrangements for the amalgamation of the two companies, submitting the plan to this office for approval.  
 (b) 2nd and 5th Aust. Divisional Trains will combine under the command of O.C. 5th Aust. Divisional Train who will make the necessary arrangements and submit his proposals to 5th Aust. Div. 'Q' for approval.  
 (c) Ordnance Services will not be combined.
6. Further instructions to put into effect the necessary moves, amalgamations etc., involved by the process of demobilisation, will be issued in the form of Amalgamation Instructions.



The Anti-gas organization in the Division from March 1918 to the signing of the Armistice was as follows:-

- 1) D.G.O and 6 sergeants, the D.G.O and 1 sgt being at D.H.Q., 1 sgt at the Corps Gas School, 1 at each Inf. Bde H.Q., and one with the Divisional Artillery
- 2) D.A.G.O., <sup>reduced</sup> attached to D.H.Q. <sup>reduced</sup>, and assisted by the sgt mentioned above
- 3) Brigade Gas Officers, 1 attached to each Inf. Bde H.Q., and assisted by the sgt attached to Bde.
- 4) A Gas N.C.O. on H.Q. of each Battalion, and Artillery Brigade
- 5) A Gas NCO, also available for other duties, with each Company and Battery

Shortly after the signing of the Armistice, the appointments of D.A.G.O. and Brigade Gas Officers were done away with, and the number of Gas Qts on D.H.Q. strength decreased from 6 to 5, consequent on the disbanding of the Corps Gas School.

With these changes, the organization has remained the same down to the present time, but vacancies caused by Repatriation have not been filled.

At the end of November, reserves of SBR's held by D.A.D.O.S were returned to Base, thus making it impossible for defective respirators to be replaced once the small reserves held by units were exhausted.

From that time onward, the work of the Gas personnel has become of less and less importance, as it was obviously useless to continue inspecting and condemning respirators after the reserve of new ones was exhausted.

The most recent instructions have been that men will retain their SBR's till arrival at the Base, en route for England, and will hand them in there.

Reliable figures are not available at present, but estimating on previous figures, at least 50% of the respirators now in possession of men must be defective.

Since the end of December, there have been only a few small matters in connection with records to attend to, and unit Gas NCO's have been employed on ordinary duties, while the 5 Divl Gas Sqts have been engaged on general duties chiefly in connection with Education and Repatriation. In addition to classifying and arranging all files, memoranda &c, the D.G.O. has been engaged on Educational & general duties on D.H.Q.

On 12/3/19 an order was issued by D.H.Q.

\* making the Div Gas NCO's available for general duties with the formations to which they are attached, and directing that all files &c be forwarded to records.

Two of the NCO's, Sgts Loy and Staby, have already proceeded to England for Repatriation, while the remaining

3, Sgts Allan, Harrold and Norton are due to leave at an early date.

The records from the DGO's office have been packed and despatched to Records in accordance with the order mentioned above.
