1. The 15th Brigade battalion (less "B" cadre, 57th battalion) will march out as part of embarkation quota No 58 on 24th inst. and entrain at CHARLEROI at 08.00 h.
2. STARTING POINT: Junction of Rue de Hanchies with the Rue de Phillipville.
STARTING TIME: 07.00 h.
ORDER OF MARCH: Band, "A-B" Company, "C-D" Company, Headquarters (under orders of O.C. "C-D" Company.)
DRESS: Marching Order - one blanket in pack, the other rolled horseshoe fashion around the pack. Officers, belts. All ranks will wear hats.
3. The sig. sergt. will arrange synchronisation of watches at 13.00 h. tomorrow.
4. Officers' valises, baggage of cadres, band instruments and equipment and education gear will be stacked at Q.M. Store by 13.00 h. tomorrow. The bandmaster will detail one bandsman and the Q.M. will arrange for a guard to accompany the baggage.
5. Company areas must be left in a clean and sanitary condition. Company Commanders will hand to the Adjutant at the starting point a certificate that this has been done.
6. Officers commanding companies will impress upon all ranks the necessity for the maintenance of strict discipline during and after the journey to HAVRE.
All doors on the right hand side (the side nearest passing trains) must be kept closed. A Non-commissioned officer must be placed definitely in charge of each truck.
7. To save time in detraining blankets will be rolled in bundles of ten and labelled before HAVRE is reached. Material for tying and labelling must be taken.

The 57/58th Battalion remained in billets in DOURLERS until 11th March. On 6th March Draft No 14 comprising of 4 Officers, 10 Sergeants, and 92 Other Ranks marched out to England for Repatriation. On the 11th March the remainder of the Battalion commenced to march to the new area. BEUGNIES was reached the same day. The outskirts of SIVRY (BELGIUM) was reached on the 12th, BARBENCON on the 13th, and the present billets at BOUSSU-lez-WALCOURT were reached on 14th. In the intermediate places referred to, the troops were accommodated in billets.

On the 24th March Draft No 20 consisting of 4 Officers, 18 Sergeants, and 208 Other Ranks marched out to England for Repatriation. Later in the day the remainder of the 59/60th Battalion, from which also a Draft marched out on 24th inst. marched in from VERGNIES and was amalgamated with 57/58th Battalion, the whole hence forth being designated the 15th Brigade Battalion.

The Medical Officer of 59/60th Battalion was withdrawn on 23rd March, and I have remained in Medical charge of the new formation.

Nine cases of V.D. (the majority infected in CHARLEROI), five cases of Influenza, and one case of Mumps were evacuated to hospital. The last named developed is one of seven contacts of previous cases of Mumps in 59/60th Battalion. Since the original outbreak all the contacts have been kept in strict isolation.

The billets occupied at BOUSSU-lez-WALCOURT are satisfactory but the general condition of the village is far from Sanitary. The place abounds in manure heaps, but fortunately the weather is too cold to cause trouble from flies. Latrine seats &c were brought by the Unit from DOURLERS and the sanitary arrangements of the Battalion have been eminently satisfactory.

"

All ranks will readily appreciate the necessity for the maintenance of discipline to the end. Any Officer, N.C.O. or man, who neglects to salute a superior is undermining by his bad example, the discipline of his unit. Example is everything. Men will salute smartly if they see their officers and N.C.O's doing so. Headquarters, Officers and Company Commanders will call a parade of the Officers and N.C.O's under their command to bring to notice the directions of the Divisional Commander. The standard of discipline reached by the battalion must be maintained and officers and N.C.O's will ensure that all men under their command are frequently reminded of their duty in these matters of discipline - dress and saluting.
