

Attention is directed to G.R.O., 6216. The portion of the para: 26, Regulations for the Army Medical Service, referred to reads as follows:-

"that drugs of a Poisonous character as chumerated in "Standing Ordo s. RoAoMeC. are in safe kooping under lock "ond koy".

Relations will ensure that all Poisons are kept under lock and key, or a clearly labelled as such, and in bottles of distinctive shape if procurable.

Poisons are not to be kept in bottles of the same shape as modicines intended for intermal administration.

work from those under whom he has served. 5. The application, when submitted, will be considered by a committee of the Counsil of the Royal College of Surgeons, which will


decide whether it be granted or not. In the event of the application being granted the Candidate will be admitted on one occasion only to the special examination.



the preparation of the Pot. Permang. solution, and the use of the Calomel Ointment both before and after the risk.

Men should be instructed to return the syringe on rejoining Unit, when, it will be thoroughly sterilized in antiseptic solution, (boiling may soften or spoil the vulcanite), so that the syringe can be again issued to another man. The syringes have been purchased out of Divisional funds, and men should be encouraged to take care of them.

The syringes may be obtained by Battalions direct from S. Maw. Son & Sons., 7 - 12, Aldersgate Street, LONDON EC. at a cost of about one shilling and three pence each.

The Battalion occupied billats in TOURS-en-VIMEU, HAMICOURT, and also at ERCOURT (until 17th). On the 17th owing to a quota having marched out, compenies were concentrated at TOURS and HAMICOURT, and ERCOURT was evacuated. Billats generally are satisfactory and the men have been housed without overcrowding. The weather was extremely cold for some days and made life in the billats far from pleasant. The Niessen Huts have been of vakue as recreation rooms and this was especially so during the cold spell. The Routine work has been carried on. During the month the Water Detail have been on leave and the duties have devolved on a relief sent by the 10th Australian Field Ambulance.
