

Summary of Events and Information

Major S. R. Burston, A.A.M.C., reported from 11th Australian Field Ambulance for duty as Senior Medical Officer, Australian Base Depots, and to have the temporary rank of Lieut-Colonel whilst holding the position.

On this date the following was the Medical establishment of the Australian Base Depots --

1 Medical Officer;

1 Staff Sergeant Dispenser;

5 A.A.M.C. Orderlies.

The medical personnel was as follows --

A.G.B.D. -- Captain H. Holland, A.A.M.C.

1st A.D.B.D.,, Captain R.C. Withington, A.A.M.C.

2nd A.D.B.D .-- Captain E.N. Docker, A.A.M.C.

3rd A.D.B.D .-- Captain F.M. Purchas, A.A.M.C.

4th A.D.B.D .-- Major L. Cowlishaw, A.A.M.C.

5th A.D.B.D .-- Captain F.N. Rodda, A.A.M.C.

There was also a Dental Staff for the Australian Base Depots consisting of 5 Dental Officers and 12 Staff Sergeant Mechanics, and 5 Dental Orderlies. These were established in a special Hut built in the grounds of the 2nd A.D.B.D., but the personnel were attached for discipline and rations to the A.G.B.D., and were under the administration of the S.M.O. The Dental Officers were as follows:-

Captain E.F. Molle, Senior Dental Officer.

Captain C.H. Terry, Captain C.P. Heatley,

Captain W.E.G. Caulfield,

Caprain W.R. Bailey.

At the time of taking over, Major Cowlishaw had been appointed by D.D.M.S., Havre, to act as S.M.O., Australian Base Depots, working under the direction of the S.M.O., Harfleur. All returns, correspondence, &c., to D.D.M.S., Havre, from S.M.O., Australian Base Depots, were forwarded through S.M.O., Harfleur. (Major A.A. Meaden, D.S.O., R.A.M.C., A.I.D. Havre and S.M.O., Harfleur). The D.D.M.S., Havre, instructed that this procedure should still continue but it was considered that this caused unnecessary delay in correspondence, also the fact was pointed out that Lieut-Colonel Burston was a senior Officer to Major Meaden, and it was then arranged that the S.M.O., Australian Base Depots, should be directly responsible to the D.D.M.S. Havre, for the medical services of the Australian Base Depots, and that all correspondence should pass direct between the S.M.O. Australian Base Depots and D.D.M.S., Havre, except such correspondence as concerned Major Meaden in his capacity as A.I.D., Havre.

Routine Orders until now had been published weekly by Major Cowlishaw. From 7th July onwards, they were published daily. The Standing Medical Board assembled as detailed in the Standing Orders for reclassificati of "P.B." and "T.B." personnel, the Boards consisting of 3 Medical Officers— 1. President, — Senior Medical Officer; 2. M.O. i/c. Depot, and another Medical Officer detailed by the S.M.O. as Members. The Board proceedings were made out in triplicate on A.F.W. 3339, and one copy was forwarded to the Orderly Room concerned, one copy to the A.I.D., Havre, and one copy to the S.M.O's Office.	on
			The Returns furnished from this Office are detailed in Appendix 2, a copy of the proformas attached.	**
	15/7/1	7.	C.O., E.F. Canteens, Havre, agreed to E.F. Canteen in 3rd A.D.B.D. Camp to be used as a Detention Hospital. This was a private arrangement between the C.O., 3rd A.D.B.D. and C.O., E.F. Canteens. The Canteen was equipped with Hospital beds and stores already supplied by the Australian Branch, B.R.C.S., and already in pass the possession of the different Base Depots, and 50 beds were fitted up in the Hospital. Captain Purchas took over duty as M.O. i/c. Detention Hospital in addition to his duty as M.O. i/c. 3rd A.D.B.D. The Staff of the Hospital consisted of— Ohe Corporal, A.A.M.C., and Two "P.B." Cooks attached from 3rd A.D.B.D. Standing Orders were made out. Copy attached, Appendix 3.	
	16/7/1		Authority was obtained for the establishment of the Detention Hospital for the Australian Base Depots, and for the issue of 15 Hospital Marquees, large. (Authority H.Q.,L. of C. D.L. 1041/AA/4. As it was only considered necessary to have an establishment of 100 beds, only 8 marquees would be necessary. It was laid down that only minor cases which were likely to become fit for duty again within from 4 to 6 days were to be admitted into this Hospital. This Hospital was established in order to prevent unnecessary wastage. It was considered advisable to draw 8 of the Hospital Marquees authorised in case at any time the E.F. Canteen should be required for other purposes. Thesen were accordingly indented for. 28/7/17. Letter written to C.O., A.G.B.D. as follows --"I shall be glad if you will bring the following matter before the Commanding Officers "of the Australian Base Depots at the next C.O's conference. There are a certain number of men in all the Depots appearing before the Standing "Medical Board, who, though not yet fit for Bullring Training, require graduated training "in order to render them, eventually, fit to undergo the Bullring course. "It has been the custom of the Board to classify these men 'T.B. Training'. "At present the position is most unsatisfactory and the men so classified almost "invariably appear before the Board the following week, either not improved, or, more "often, in a worse condition than on the previous occasion. "The explanation of this is, I think, that one or two things seem to happen to them "after classification as 'T.B. Training', viz., 1. They are sent the following day to the Bullring, and the sudden change from "Light Duty being too great, they collapse within two or three days and their "disability, instead of being improved, is considerably aggravated. 2. They are left of 'Light Duty' and consequently there is practically no "improvement in their condition when they next appear before the Board. "Could it be arranged that an Officer or Warrant Officer (on the staff of one of the "Depots) who has some knowledge of Physical Training, be detailed permanently to take "charge of these men. "The 'T.B. Training' men from all Depots could be paraded at stated hours daily, and, "under his direction, be given light physical exercises and short route marches. "If this could be arranged, I am of the opinion that, a considerable number of men " could be made fit for General Service, who at the present become 'P.B." purely through "lack of proper training. "The Adjutant of the Central Training Camp has informed me that he will be glad to "give the Officer or Warrant Officer, selected for the position, a short course of "instruction in physical training before he takes up the work." 28/7/17. Major L. Cowlishaw, A.A.M.C., proceeded on 10 days' Leave of Absence. Eight Wospikal Warquess supplied for Australian Detention Hospital.






