

Wounded will be cleared from front line to Subsidiary line by means of Regimental Stretcher Bearers, along special lines of evacuation.

Officer Commending 10th. Australian Field Ambulance will arrenge for and equip Dressing Posts in Subsidiary line where Submidiary line mosts lines of evacuation.

Heah Dreseing Post will have -:-(1) Medical Officer and sufficient personnel.
