Baalbek	Feb 1		Major G. M. O'Halloran proceeded to Cairo on leave accompanied by 1922. Weather very cold, snowing all day. Capt Linton R.N.O. 14 A L H transferred to A.D.M.S. 15 Car Dr. His position was not filled. Regimental sick attending at Immobility Section Home for treatment.	
	Feb 2		Major G. M. Anderson R.N.O. 7 L H Regt lectured to troops on the recent visit of his regiment to Gallipoli. Owing to cold weather and bad state of the troops' boots a recommendation was made that rum be issued daily and that the long expected rum boots be expedited. One light ambulance wagon arrived by train to replace one left at Habels on 22/9/19. Authority received for the full issue of rations.	
	Feb 3		Five drawn without deductions in Baalbek area. Instructions received from B.H.Q. to select some men deserving early repatriation on compassionate grounds. Six names submitted in order of merit.	
	Feb 4		L/Cpl Gittos A of the unit notified to A.D.F. 14 as convalescent Home. Payak train passed through Baalbek in the early hours of the morning, owing to the cold patients awaiting evacuation were retained. A.D.M.S. wired as to the likelihood of obtaining reinforcements.	
	Feb 5		A.D.M.S. replied that no reinforcements could be expected. Ptes Hutchinson & Trengove of the Mobile and Dr Stewart of the Immobility despatched to the base for early repatriation on compassionate grounds. Races and mounted sports held in afternoon in fine weather without accidents.	
	Feb 6		Obtained heavy ambulance from 35th M.A.C. 3able and evacuated. Brig. Gen G. M. M. Onslow to A. Section 66 CCS Moalaka. Heavy rain commenced but the car got through safely. Patient travelling well. Four stretchercases also sent by Ford ambulance to Moalaka. Gen Butler D.V. 6 & 7 inspected all horses. Heavy rain all day.

Gaalbe Feb 11

Demobilisation form A 97 Form 534 filled in by B.O. for all members of the unit at Gaalbe and analysis of the figures revealed a rather unexpected state of affairs. Out of 77 members of the unit 66 were single and the 11 married men had only thirteen children. The total number of persons dependent upon the 77 members of the unit, wholly or partly, was only 41 including the wives and children of the married men.

Two O/Rs proceeded to Egypt on short leave and 1 O/R discharged from Hospital to duty.

Feb 12

A wild wet night. Tent containing patients was blown down. The two N 3 throat cases proved to be tonsillitis cases and were taken into the ordinary ward. Capt Shipway instructed to proceed to Medical Officers School Cairo. The B.O. became Acty S.D.M. Aust Mtd Division but remained with the ambulance at Gaalbe leaving the S.D.M. to carry on the Routine Work. Referring important matters by wire or D.R. L. S. Brigade pay issued to the Brigade show during the day.

The incidence of Venereal disease has been low and compares very favourably with the rate of the other Brigades in the Division. Prophylactic booths are in use in the town and at the Villa Kaoum, where the 15 th L.H. Regt is billeted.
