Weather very like rain but only a few drops gell. A party of natives came through from MESHAE. They said the Turks had ordered them to go to NABLUS, but they decided to come back through the lines. Two men were taken to RAMLEH to be handed to the A.P.M. for their particulars. The remainder of the party went back to RAMLEH with their donkeys, etc.	
	21.2.1		Range firing could not be carried out owing to rain. All working partieswere also cancelled. Office 2 o.r. evacuated to hospital sick.

Onslow, Major Barton and Major Easterbrock, with a small party went out to SHEBTIN and reconnoitred the country towards MESCHAL. Only enemy seen were two or three at a long distance away. Water was found to be good and plentiful in the vicinity of SHEBTIN, numerous springs being found. Lieut. 
