ES SA	LT 1.5.18,		Orders having been received the Regiment moved out at 0100 to rejoin Brigade at ES SALT, moving by the UMM ESH SHERT-ES SALT Road, and halting for an hour at 05% in the foot-hills where the men had their breakfast and the horses were fed up. From here on to ES SALT, about 9 miles, the track was extremely rough and the men had to lead their horses for the greater part of this distance. Great trouble was experienced with the pack horses as the track was only wide enough for one horse at a time. At the junction of No. 6. Road the 2nd Regiment was passed and from them we heard that ES SALT had been occupied by the 3rd Brigade at ktx 1830 the night before. During the latter part of this march it rained heavily, making travelling most difficult. The Regiment arrived at ES SALT about 1130 and found that the 2nd Brigade had already moved out along the AMMAM Road. the Regiment joining up with the about 4 miles out at 1400, remaining in this position until 1700. At this time we received orders to move out to the village at AIN HAMAR, the junction of the ES SUR Track, and to put out a line of outposts here. At this village the horses were watered and mens water bottles filled. At 1930 the Regiment received orders to withdraw to Brigade, the concentration of which	Ago

About 0000 orders were received to proceed down this road dismounted with a view to assisting the 5th Mounted Brigade in their attack down this road. After proceeding a short distance Turks were reported advancing from AMMAN and the Regiment was then ordered to take up the following positions, from EL AWAB (Square J.28, ES SA:T Composite map), "A" Squadron being placed on the x hight and "B" Squadron on the left, "C" Squadron in Reserve. Summary of Events and Information push out line further NORTH to about Square J.17. "C" Squadron was then ordered to occupy the high ground in the vicinity, which was completed about 1200, at which time the outposts of the 3rd Brigade were driven back to this line. Up to this time there had been no decisive attack on the line, but about 300 enemy camalry had pushed forward and appearend to be making a demonstration. On coming within long rifle range they dispersed and retired. About 1400 "C" Squadron was relieved by the 5th L.H.. they then withdrew and took up a position in the centre of our priginal line. During the remainder of the day small parties of enemy mounted men advanced along the gully and sniped at very long range. The Regiment held this position during the night, all being quiet. From midday rations and horsefeed had been consumed and a requisition was made on the inhabitants for cattle, the horses being razed on barley in positions behind our lines. After daylight the enemy advanced along the AMMAM Road,

attacking the 3rd Brigade, and about 350 were captured by the 8th and 5th L.H.Regiments. About 200 of the enemy turned to the left and proceeded down the Wadi in front of dut position, these were later joined by about 100 davalry, sniping at long range. The country being so precipitous it was impossible to make a flank move to drive them out of the position they held. Our line was slightly shelled during the day. No rations having come through further requisitions were made for fresh meat and horses were unsaddled for the first time after leaving the JORDAN and were again grazed on the crops. No trouble was experienced in regard to water as were bevougced on a running wadi. About 1630 orders were received that the whole force would withdraw on account of large enemy reinforcements NORTH of ES SALT in the neighbourhood of AFR HUDA. The Regiment was ordered to the draw from its

ES SALT	3.5.18,		position at 2000 and hold the roadhead in the vicinity of EL FUHEIS and then forming the rearguard until the whole force had withdrawn through. I troop under Lieut. Riley being left to watch the SHUNET NIMRIM Road. with orders to withdraw about daylight, joining the 6th Regiment who were holding the AMMAM Road. The Regiment on withdrawing from the front line experienced great difficulty in getting out of the ES SALT Road owing to the difficult nature of the track, taking three hours for the Regiment to pass one bad part.	
do	4.5.18.		At 0100 the Regiment arrived at the roadhead position and the Squadrons then took up their defensive positions. In fidding that the column had all practically moved off word was sent to those holding the roads in the valley to retire, these parties moving through us at about 0.300. The Regiment withdrew at 0.415 and about 5 miles down the road passed through a regiment of the 5th Mounted Brigade, to whom we reported that the retirement was complete, they in turn taking over the rearguard from us. During the descent of the hills we were slightly shelled. The Regiment crossed the JORDAN by the GHORANIYEH Bridge and moved to bivouac site in the MADI KELT, 12 mi; esq S.E. of JERICHO and arriving there at 1100. During the ES SALT Operations the Regiment had no casualties. The remainder of the day the men were erecting bivvys and resting.	MAY **

NUEIAMEH 25.5.18.

26.5.18.

A Pumping party of 1 N.C.O. and 16 o.r. were detailed. All Guards and other duties were relieved by the 5th L.H. Regiment at 1500. The Regiment weceived orders to take over the following Outpost Line from the 5th L. H. Regiment; -On the left of the 4th L.H.Brigade and running SOUTH to the WADI SABATA, one Squadron only holding the line during the day. The remaining Squadrons of the Regiment and Maxhine Guns attached moving out in support at dark and returning to camp again at daylight. At 1630 "A" Squadron moved out to relieve the Squadron of 5th L.H.Regiment. At 1745 the remainder of the Regiment plus two troops of machine gun Squadron attached also moved out. The enemy shelled the roads which necessitated "B" and "C" Squadrons taking cover until dark. The following redoubts were occupied from right to left; -WOOD, WILD, WART & WAX. WOOD & WILD by "C" Squadron, 1 troop in ach with 1 sub-section of Machine Guns in WOOD. WART & WAX by "B" Squadron, with 1 troop in each and two in reserve, "A" Squadron being in reserve during the night behind WART with 1 section of Machine Guns and Three Listening Posts of 1 N.C.O. and 6 men each R.H.Q. were put out towards the AUJUA. Work was carried out for three hours in the different redoubts, improving the trenches. All quiet during the night. 1 o.r. was evacuated to hospital sick during the day. The Regiment stood to arms at 0330 and Eturned to camp when "All clear" was given, less "A" Squadron. This Squadron sent 1 N.C.O. and 3 men to each post to guard stores and for observation purposes. A patrol consisting of Lieutenant Spencer and 12 o.r. left at daylight for TEL EL TRUNI returning at 1700. This patrol was fired on by about 10 rifles and a machine gun and was forced torstire, 1 man being slightly wounded.

Training Regiment, MOASCAR. Quiet throughout the night. The Regiment katt less "A" 27.5.18. Squadron returned to camp when "All clear" was given. "A" Squadron occupied the usual posts and sent out a patrol under captain Maddrell to the high ground to the WEST and overdooking TEL EL TRUNI, this patrolreturning at 1700 3 working parties of 1 n.c.o. and 12 men each were sent to improve tracks from WAIN to WAX Posts, also three digging parties of 1 n.c.o. and 20 meneach to improve trenches in WAX, WART and WAIN. The Regiment moved out at the usual 5 mk Reinforcements were received from 2nd L.H. Training Regiment during the day. The Regiment returned to camp after "All clear" was given. 28.5.18. All guards and pumping parties of the 5th L.H. were relieved by by us at 1500. 1 Officer and 25 o.r. were detailed to erect wire at WAX Post. 1 Officer and 25 o.r. were sent to WART post for similar purposes. 2 Officers and 50 o.r. reported to Engineers for road making in rear of Posts. MAY 1918 At 1530 the enemy fired 27 rounds 77mm high explosive shells, starting at WAX Post and gradually working along to the right. Out artillery Observing Officer having to reture from his Post at 1600. The valleys in rear of the Posts were also well searched. At 1930 "A" Squadron was relieved by 5th L.H.Regiment and returned to camp. 3 o.r. to hospital sick during the day .
