This station is situated about 500 yards from the Rest Station, at the LONG, BOUCHON, L'ETOILE crossroads (See Appendix) for accommodating Scabies patients there are 2 operating tents and 1 Hoop. Marquee (small). A Russian Pat Disinfector is being constructed, this will be used to disinfect the clothes and blankets of patients.

L'ETOILE	31/10/18		<p>CO's Comments on Events that have occurred during the month of October 1918</p> <p>The month of October has been sufficiently interesting to all concerned. We have had enough work to keep us employed, while, at the same time, there has been plenty of opportunity for mental and physical recreation. We have conducted a Brigade Rest Station in which lightly sick cases from the Battalions have been treated and in addition we have run a Divisional Sick Station. The former has designed to accommodate 50-60 patients while the latter could hold as many as 30. We were fortunate in having a most convenient building for our Rest Station, a plan of which was submitted with last month's diary. This building not only afforded accommodation for patients but also provided room for billets for personnel and apartments which were used for Canteen, club room and educational centre. Bathrooms and cellar rooms lie sides of the quadrangle in front of the main building provided further billets and room for cook house, D.I. store and barbers & carpenter's shops. In the quadrangle we parked the motor ambulance belonging to the Unit. Everything was thus very centralized and convenient. The billets were exceptionally good and comfortable.</p> <p>The Sick Station had to be established under tentage. The site was a very good one in an old disused quarry on the outskirts of the village. It was protected from the weather on three sides. We succeeded in having bath a three-dimensional wooden structure in construction which was used as a drying room for patients' clothes. L'ETOILE	3/10/18		<p>The Educational Centre has been very popular during our stay here and the number of students, which has risen considerably, now stands at about 100.</p> <p>The YMCA (English) in Alesville has been very good to us in providing tables and forms for our Club Room and School and in sending lectures for our personnel. I consider we are under a deep obligation to this organization for their kind assistance so generously and freely given.</p> <p>Remarks on: -</p> <p>(1) Personnel</p> <p>(a) Strength. Our strength at the beginning of the month was 9 Off and 206 OR; at the end of the month 9 Officers & 178 OR. The considerable depreciation in our strength was due to the return, during the month, of 27 OR to Australia on furlough. Four (4) of the unit were graduated Sicks. Against them we only received 4 OR as reinforcements.</p> <p>(b) Health. The health of the personnel of the unit has been good thus I ascribe to the good condition of the billets; the amount of out door exercise the men have been able to take and the food which has been uniformly good, the ordinary ration having been supplemented by the purchase at regular intervals of a supply of fresh vegetables.</p> <p>Baths were conveniently situated and the men afforded the opportunity of bathing twice a week. The men were made more comfortable by the provision of a supply of straw for the floors of their billets.</p>	<p>228</p>

L'ETOILE	31/10/18		<p>The Epidemic of Influenza which has been so prevalent this month did not hit us hardly, though our personnel have been much exposed to infection through having to attend cases suffering from this complaint, sent to us from the Battalions.</p> <p>(c) Sanitation The Sanitation of the Camp and billets has been carefully attended to and particular care has been paid to chambers and outhouses in billets.</p> <p><u>Horses and Transport</u> The horses have been completely stabled under cover and look well generally. The number of men returning on furlough to Australia includes several of the drivers and these have had to be replaced by men drawn from the barracks.</p> <p><u>Wheeled</u> We have drawn three new Horse Ambulances to replace depleted ones and the horse transport generally is in good condition. The harness also is in good repair.</p> <p><u>Patients</u> Reference to the appended graph will show that influenza, scarlet fever and diphtheria have been the most prevalent diseases. Of these influenza is easily put on the direct cause of the most admissions to the Ambulance.</p>	<p>RD</p>

We decided early in the course of the epidemic not to hold any cases that presented any sign of bronchial affections, so I merely spoke from hearing as to its virulence. Bronch. pneumonia seems to have been a very frequent complication.</p> <p>A prophylactic centre was established in the ambulance. There has not been one single case of mental derangement among the members of the Ambulance during the month.</p> <p>The method of treatment adopted at the Scotch Station, was the daily hot bath, immersion with Sulphur mustard and sterilization of clothing & frequent issues of clean garments.</p> <p>The feeding of patients has been particularly good.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">M. 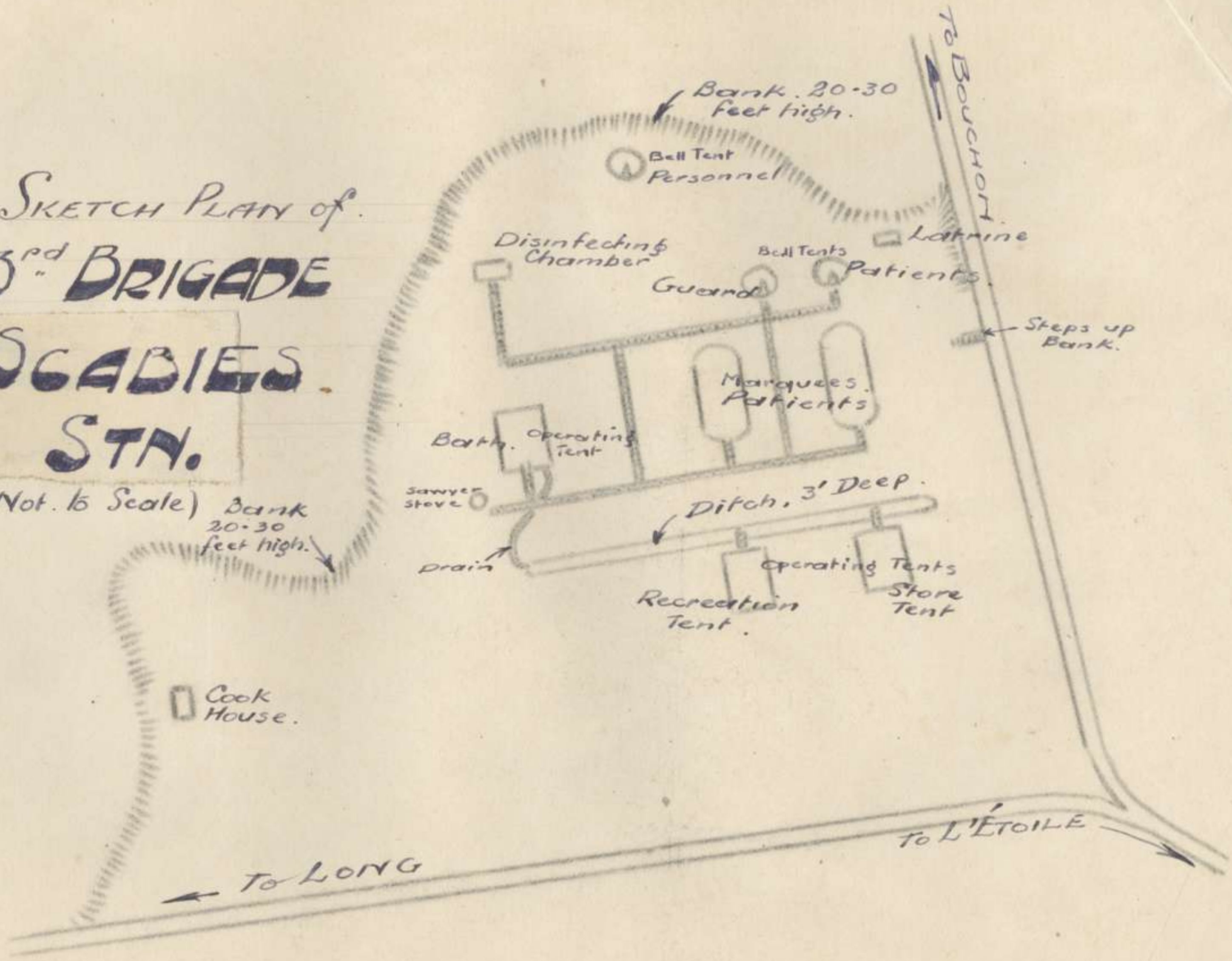

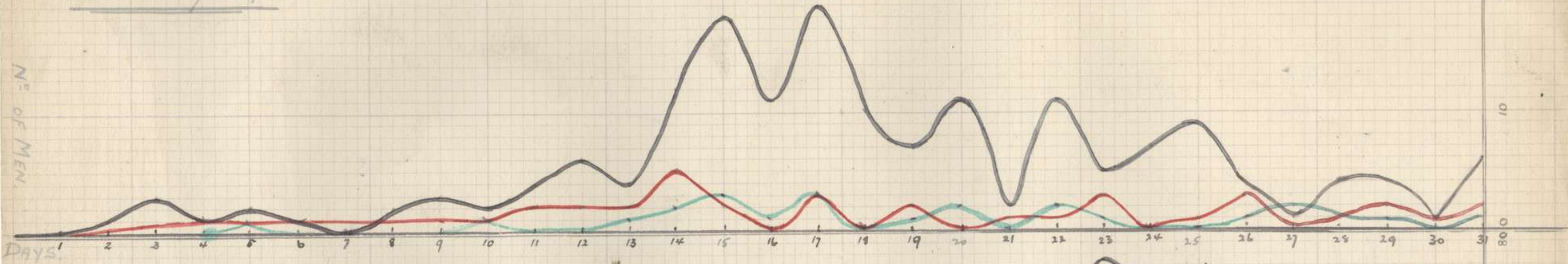

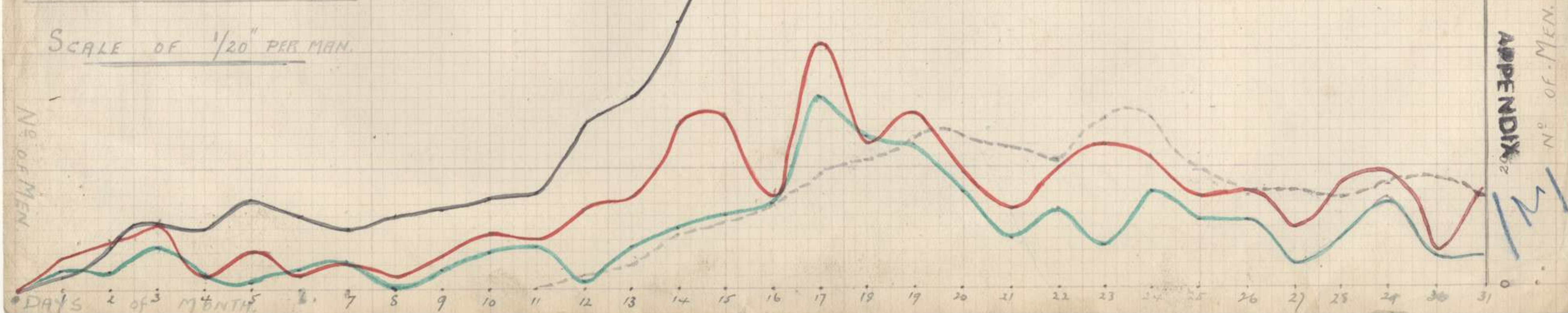

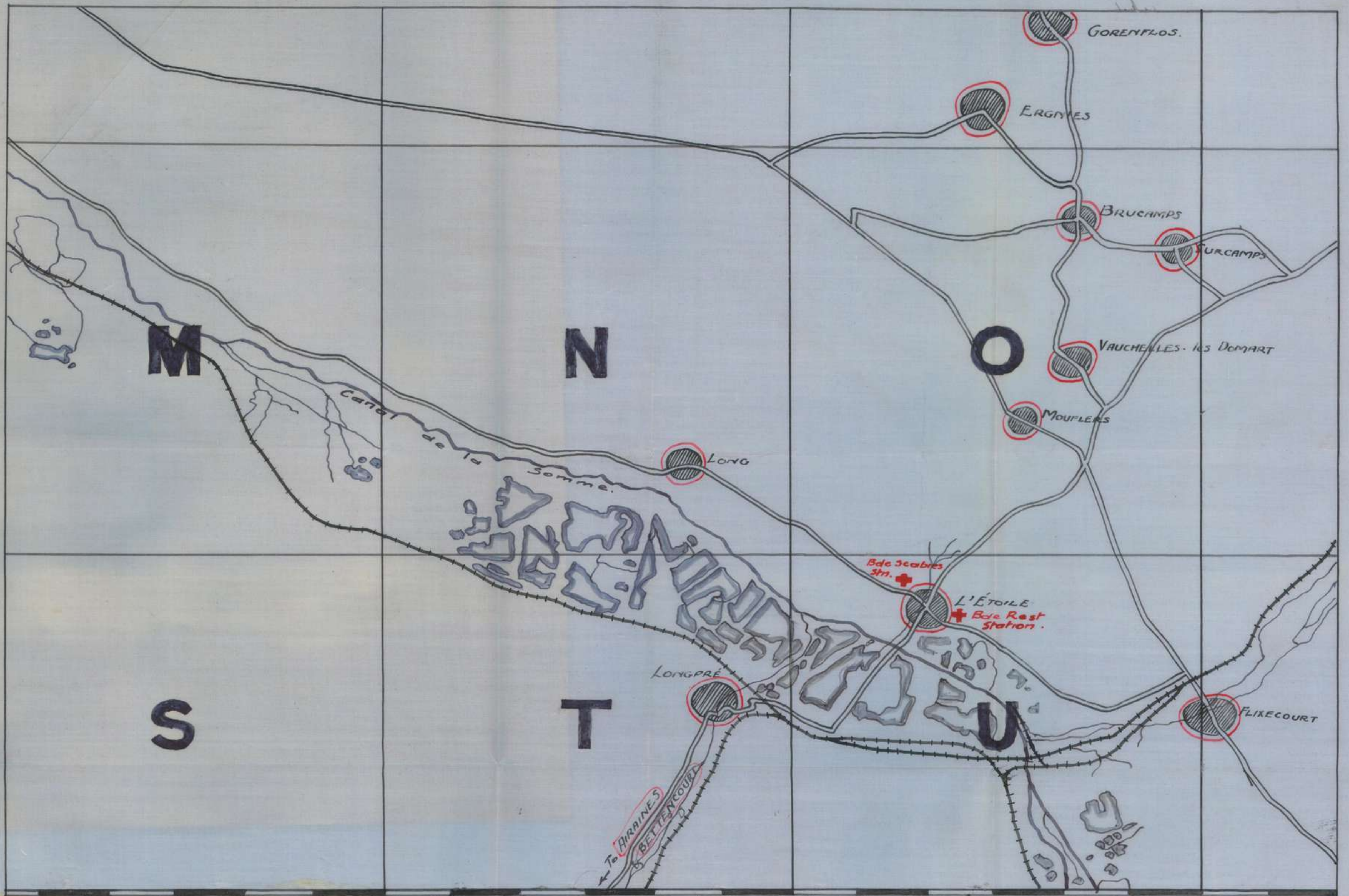

(2) ORGANISATION

- (a). The time table is made to agree as far as possible with the Unit activities. Periods are of one hours duration. No classes have more than two periods per week; the number being governed by importance of subject and attendance.
- (b). Each Instructor keeps a roll book, and the Secretary keeps a book showing all class attendance rolls. This is submitted daily to C.O.
- (c). The Instructors are in most cases qualified teachers. With such subjects as farming, it has been found necessary for the class work to take the form of discussions, with a competent man permanently in charge.
- (d). Text books. Under the old scheme these were bought by Students. Then help was obtained from the English Educational Authorities. At present they are obtained for Instructors out of Corps Funds, and for Individuals, privately. Note books are purchased out of Corps Funds.
- (e). A.I.F. Education Department. A Report of progress is sent to A.I.F. (Ed.Dept) every month. The Secretary forwards at the same time any enquiries that are beyond the scope of the present scheme.
