Chatelet	1st to 5th January '19		<p><u>JANUARY EDUCATION REPORT</u>. Although many difficulties have had to be faced and contended with, progress in the work of Education in this Unit has been in many respects very satisfactory. Several Instructors have left France, whilst men for early repatriation are, generally, too unsettled in mind for solid study, and many others are expecting to fill posts in England under the non-military employment scheme, but, on the whole, much has been done to brush up old subjects or to give an insight into new ones.</p> <p>In spite of the obvious disadvantages to contend with, there has been a marked advance on the December returns. Indeed, both enrolment and attendance have more than doubled for the month, whilst the practical nature of the courses of instruction have been very gratifying. For the week ending January 25th, the totals reached their highest since Oct. 1918. Of a Ration Strength of 145, 115 were enrolled. The attendance being 83. As most of these classes have been in operation -hostilities permitting - since July 1918, one may form some estimate of the work which this Ambulance has done in the realm of Education.</p> <p>In addition three men have been sent to the Corps School 5 have returned to Australia, inconnection with University courses, and three have gone to the Corps Workshops at Jeumont, whilst several men are preparing for a 5 days tour of the mines and industries near CHARLEROI. Meanwhile the classes are continuing, and are forming a solid basis for any future study which the members of this Ambulance may feel disposed to carry on at a later date.</p> <p>Advantage has also been taken of the Unit Lending Library to a gratifying extent. 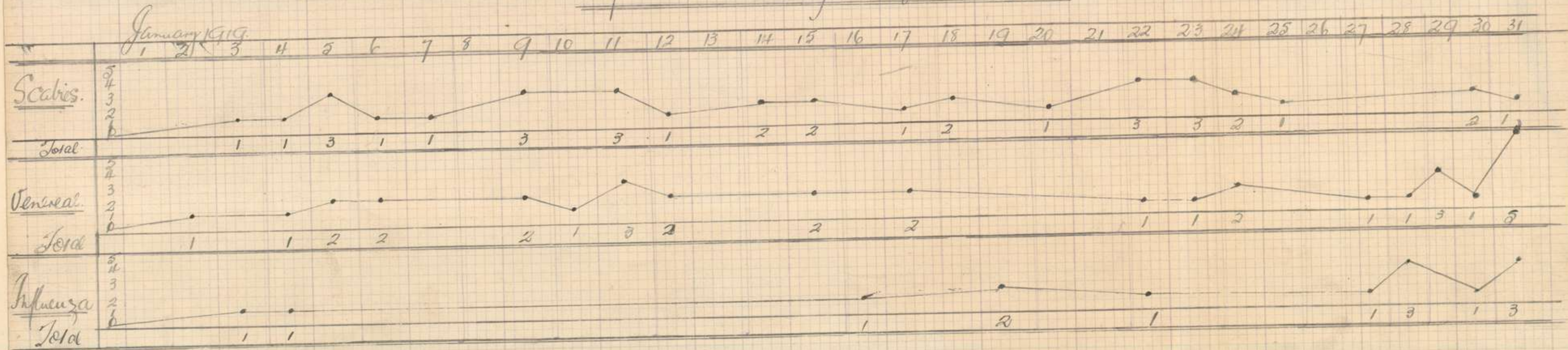

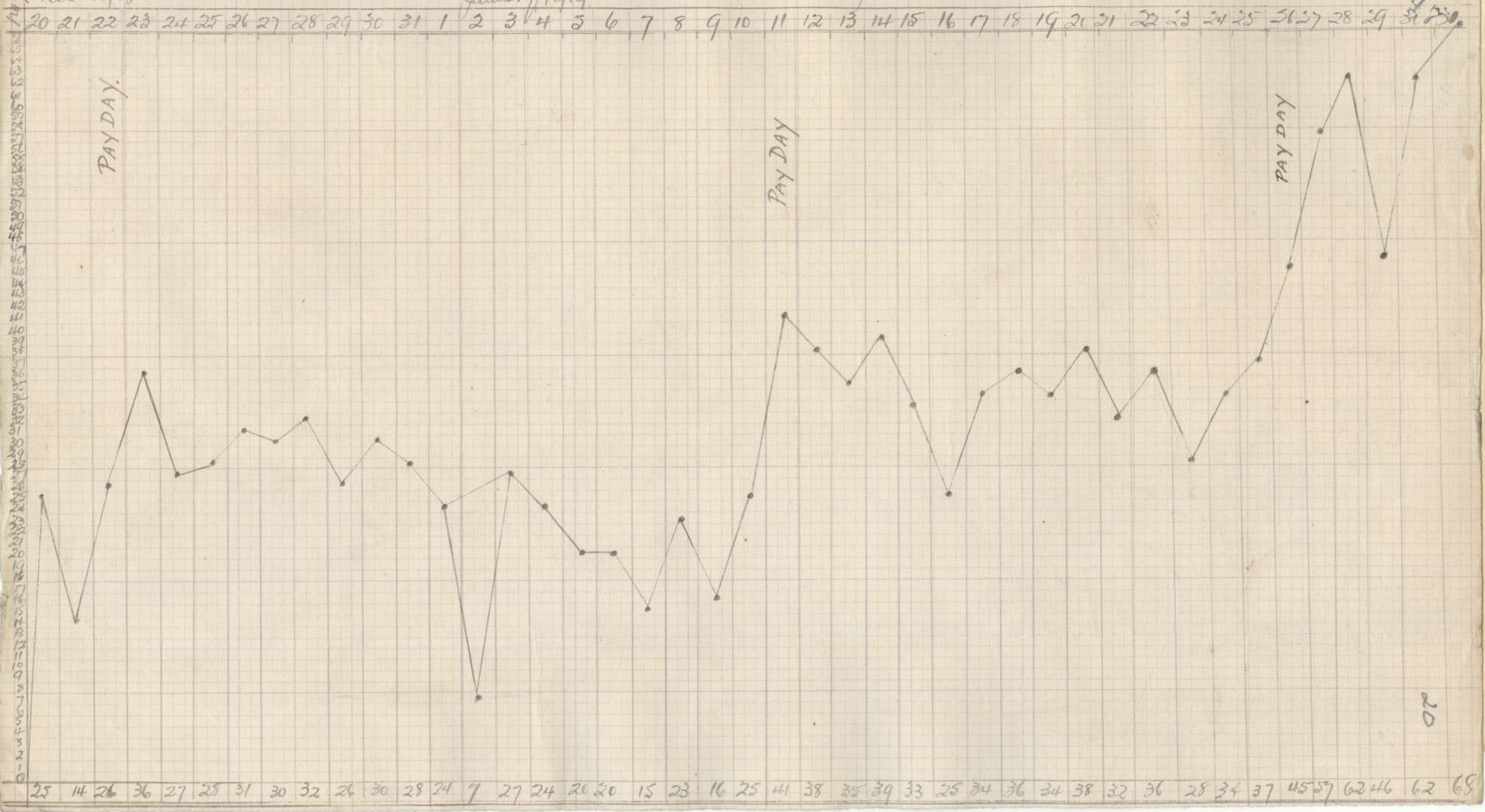
