

KABA TEPE GALDIPOLI	1915 May 1st.	9 a.m.	<p>Went up with Capt FRY to Capt GOLDSMITH'S Dressing Station, that of the 12th Infantry A.I.F. Heavy shrapnel fire on our Camp all day. We helped bury some dead of the R.M.L.I. and brought down their wounded.</p> <p>Visited A.D.M.S. with Capt. FRY, he said that Capt FRY was to report to him direct as to the work of the Bearer Division which landed on Sunday April 25th and make recommendations. The O/C F. Amb. was to have nothing to do with this report. We have from 50 to 70 patients, slightly wounded and sick to attend to daily.</p>

May 2 nd 1915. Kaba Tepe Gallipoli	<p>Our Stretcher bearers go out morning & evening & so to avoid double-banking & as no orders are issued I arrange with No. 1. No. 2 F. Ambulances that w/ No. 3. shall take charge of Shrapnel Valley & Breath Valley opening off it & the valley where Capt. Goldsmith is on our right-flank nearer Kaba Tepe. This saves waste of effort for our work is very hard.</p> <p>A special General Order of General Sir Ian Hamilton is issued & contains this sentence "The Army Corps Commander wishes to convey the grateful thanks of all ranks in the Army Corps to the S. Bearers & Water Carriers. Their work has been beyond praise & of the greatest value." As our Stretcher Bearers 114 rank & file & 3 officers were the first to land we highly value this commendation.</p> <p>Captain F. Goldsmith is struck off the strength of the 3rd F. Ambulance & appointed Med. Off. to the 12th Infantry Regt. 1st Australian Div. - In day we increased our Dressing Station accomodation, the digging is very heavy, but before we could finish we were overwhelmed with patients. Heavy shrapnel fire at intervals throughout the day, driving us to cover & thus impeding our work.</p>	
May 3 rd 1915. Kaba Tepe Gallipoli,	<p>Heavy shrapnel fire, so we dig in deeper. We have 74 patients to attend to besides our Bearer work.</p>	
May 4 th 1915 " "	<p>Again heavy shrapnel fire. Went & saw Lt. Col. M.S. who says he will evacuate our patients & only leave us light cases. He re-iterated the order that Capt. Ivy was to report direct as to action on Sunday April 25th up to April 29th. He also ordered that all re-enforcements & a Tmt. Subdivision rank & file were to report to the D.A.D.M.S. as a burial party & for Sanitation company. This takes from me 37 men.</p>

No. 69. Pte J. D. Pearson, a stretcher bearer of A Section was wounded in the buttock by a fragment of shrapnel sent aboard the Gloucester Castle. Again heavy shrapnel fire. Evacuated serious cases but still have 30 others to attend to.

Pte Brownell H.A. No 135 reported last night & gave a story of having been sick & having camped in a dug-out on the beach. This is the man who was previously reported missing. He was tried & sentenced to 21 days Field Punishment No 1.

May 6th 1915. " " 18³⁰

D.A.D.M.s came along & took his Sanitary Squad from my unit. Heavy shrapnel all day, it blew our dugouts to pieces. Our hill was naked, our patients were killed & wounded & No 56 Pte H. J. Shepherd was wounded in the foot. No. 28 Pte W. R. D. Baker was shot through the wrist; No 105 Pte G. B. Hone was shot through hip & cheek. The D.A.D.M.s Lt. Marshall was shot in the ankle whilst in our camp when I went to see him & fix him up. A shell blew my dugout to bits.

Re-constructed dug-outs & tunneled into the hill.
No 186. Pte Mahoney previously reported "dead" joined to day. He had suffered from concussion in a shell burst & fallen down a gully, our men reported him dead. He was taken aboard ship to Alexandria & now has returned to duty. The following is a copy of Corps Order Part II

Howard previously transferred to Base is taken on the strength C Section from 25-4-15. The following casualties are reported No 69. Pte Pearson T.O. wounded 4-5-15 • 56 Pte Shepherd H.J. " 6-5-15 } The above are struck off strength from " 28 Pte Baker W.R.D. " 6-5-15 } date of casualty " 105 Pte Horne G. S. " 6-5-15 }	
May 10 th 1915. Kaba Tepe Gallipoli	Heavy shell-fire on us all day. Col Hobbs Div. Artillery Commander informs me he wishes to mount a gun on the hill above our Camp & one gun in our Camp. Having no objection I suffer him to the A.D.M.S & prepare to evacuate Camp. Acting on information I choose a gully along the beach nearer to Kaba Tepe. I do not like it as it is nearer the Enemy, but we discharge all the patients we can & pack up ready for an early move in the morning.	
May 11 th 1915.	At 6 am we make a move along beach to new position, moving stores &c with us. The Enemy evidently saw us starting until we were digging in. Rained shrapnel after shrapnel down upon us & I found the new pits untenable. Many narrow escapes were experienced & the following casualties occurred. No 37. Pte Hampson H wounded in thigh by shrapnel bullet — No 115. Pte H. D. Waterton wounded in head by shrapnel bullet. Evacuate to my old Camp & look for another pit. I choose a hill side, at the entrance of Brath Valley nearer Anzac Cove. It is bad but I have no choice. The Bear was sent over to dig themselves in & the remainder of No. 3. follow to-morrow. Heavy rain impedes our work & adds to our difficulties.	
May 12 th 1915. Kaba Tepe Gallipoli alfred sutton lt col	Moved the remainder of No. 3. F. Amb to new Camp site & dug, dug, dug. We experience heavy shell fire 4-70 & have to take shelter twice after time & so delay work.

Ballantine shrapnel bullet wound of back + neck, very serious. No. 182 Pte D. D'Arcy shrapnel bullet through left forearm. Attendance on patients in hospital & stretcher bearer work as usual.	
" " May 14 th 1915.	Still digging & constructing more wards for patients. A 4.7 shrapnel shell fell in the Camp & the following casualties are recorded:- No. 77 Pte S.J. Penhaligon right thigh shattered by shrapnel & shrapnel bullet wd of left leg - dangerous - No. 195 Pte I.W. Jones lacerated wound of left thigh by shrapnel. No. 13 Corporal G.T. Smallcombe is appointed Lance-Sergeant. 59. Pte J. Rainey is appointed Lance-Corporal.	
" " May 15 th 1915.	A complete inspection of all dug-outs was held & many being found deficient were depred & improved.

Anzac Cove. Gallipoli. May 17 th 1915 6.30 a.m.	Reported to Col. Howse received instructions. At this time he was not quite certain he would proceed to Alexandria, it was therefore arranged that I should not take up duties until I received a further message of his departure. Took over at 2 p.m. Having previously appointed Major G.P. Orson to take command of No. 3. F. Amb.

struck off strength. Removed to No 1 cl. Hosp.

No 135 Pte H. A. BROWETT, g.s.w. rt. forearm, wounded &
struck off strength. Removed to No 1 cl. Hosp. The remainder
of his sentence from date of casualty is remitted.

The attention of the A. D. M. S. was drawn to the
dangerous nature of the locality of these casualties, & orders
were recd to cease evacuating by daylight, unless in
cases of urgency.

The attention of the A. D. M. S. was drawn to the
excellence of the work performed by Pte. SIMPSON
continuously since landing.

That Lieut T.F.HALL was to embark at Anzac & leave for ALEXANDRIA to take charge of drivers, wagons & stores of No 3. F. Ambulance. No 164 Pte C. Conly of B. Section suffered from shrapnel shot wound of left arm & shoulder. No 23 Pte C. Love of A. Section suffered from bullet wound of buttocks. Both of these men were sent to Base Hospital & struck off the strength. No 25 Pte J. Thompson of A. Section suffered from bullet wound of upper part of back. Sent to Base Hospital & struck off strength - No 74 Pte F.J. Shields reported from H.M.T. Ionia.	
May 30 th	General note for May. My average strength for the month was 6 Officers & 135 men. Stretcher squads have been sent daily to clear Walker's Rd & Shrapnel Valley, never less than two squads are sent, they remain all day & are relieved at 8 p.m. by two other squads. These squads are marched by an Officer who assists the regimental M.D. when necessary. All squads are turned out whenever necessary on instructions received from the A.D.M.S. A small hospital has been carried on in dug-outs for the reception of cases who would be again fit for service in 48 hours. Our daily average for patients in May was 18. Details are shown in A + D books of the Corps & on daily static furnished to A.D.M.S.
