4th AUSTRALIAN DIVISIONAL ORDNANCE

- 1/6/18. Moved Dump and Office to Sheet 62D. H.19 d 4.0.
- 2/6/18. Wire received from the I.O.M. advising the condemnation of an 18pdr Carriage for the 42nd Battery, a new one to replace being wired for immediately.  
Major J.H. Tuckett returned from visit to the Bases <sup>Rouen + Haere</sup> with A.D.O.S.
- 3/6/18 Wire received advising that a new 18pdr Carriage is available for the 42nd Battery at No.4 Gun Park. Battery advised to collect.  
Asked by Division to recommence the Sock Exchange. Lorry sent to No.1 Area Laundry at Abbeville to draw 5000 prs of Socks to exchange for Units in the Line, also to call at No.4 Gun Park on the return journey and collect all available Stores for us.  
Artillery moved to Pont-Remy for a rest and transferred to O.C., 4th Army Troops No.1 for administration.
- 4/6/18 Lorry returned from Abbeville and the Gun Park with a full load of Stores.
- 5/6/18 Warrant Officer Struthers, Cpl. Tink and Pte. Nelthorpe sent to Longpre to be attached to O.C., 4th Army Troops No.1 to administer the Divisional Artillery, 7th and 8th Medium Trench Mortar Batteries and 14th Coy. A.A.S.C. whilst they are in the Rest Area; a large quantity of Stores which had come to hand sent to Longpre for issue.
- 6/6/18. Sent Lorry to O.C., 4th Army Troops No.1 with quantity of Stores for the Artillery which arrived this morning. Many indents had already been submitted by Artillery for Clothing etc. and on examination it was found that demands had been exceptionally heavy. Not understood why Units should submit such excessive indents, especially for Breeches M.S. as the numbers asked for when with me were always supplied.
- 7/6/18. Visited 4th, 12th and 13th Brigades, saw the Staff Captains and asked if there were any battle stores outstanding to Units of their Brigades which were urgently required but found that they were all complete, also visited Pioneer Battalion.
- 8/6/18. Visited the Divisional Armourers Workshop where they were very busy fitting up Bicycles and Lewis and Vickers Machine Guns. The Shop/s still situated at the Munition Works, Boutillerie where it has been established since the beginning of May.

- 9/8/18. Informed Staff Captain, 12th A.I.Bde. that 5 Trench Covers which were urgently required were now available for collection.  
 Indent received from 4th Aus.M.G.Bn. for 4 Vickers Machine Guns and One Tripod. Issued the 4 Guns from stock. Visited Gun Park No.4 and brought back 2 Vickers Guns, 3 Tripods and quantity of other Stores.  
 Wire received from Corps. "Instruct Major.Tuckett to proceed to England tomorrow morning".
- 10/8/18. Major.Tuckett, D.A.D.O.S., evacuated to No. 5 C.C.S. but expects to be about again in a day or two.
- 11/8/18. Sent Lorry to Abbeville with dirty socks for exchange and to collect Stores from Gun Park.  
 Informed by D.A.G.M.G. that no more socks were to be exchanged at Abbeville and that in future all socks could be exchanged at Aust.Corps.Baths at Railhead, Ailly-sur-Somme.  
 Received Letter from A.D.O.S. enclosing letter from Army stating that on and after 11th/12th inst. all Indents for Artillery Units who went back to Rest Area would not be cancelled on Base but transferred from O.O. of Formation who was administering them before going to Rest Area, to O.O. 4th Army Troops No. 1.  
 This is by far the better arrangement as under the old conditions it meant that even though Indents were cancelled on Base at the same time as move was forwarded the O.O. of the Formation would receive Technical Stores for two or three days owing to same being on rail when Indents were cancelled. These Technical Stores would be of no use to Units consequently same had to be returned to Base whereas perhaps a Unit had been waiting three or four months for the articles and by submitting fresh Indents lose all seniority in supply.  
 Phone message received by Division from Aust.Corps stating that Major Tuckett was not to proceed to England. Matter in abeyance.
- 12/8/18. Lieut.Harrington, DA.D.O.S. learner, visited A.D.O.S. re 52nd and 47th Battalion Stores. A.D.O.S. advised that the 52nd Bn's Stores could now be returned to Base - Complete Sections as far as possible and as Stores arrive from Base they are to be returned to Railhead for transmission to Base.  
 Sent Lorry to Gun Park with 24 complete Lewis Guns of 52nd Bn.  
 Major.Tuckett returned to duty from Hospital.  
 One surplus Travelling Kitchen and One G.S.Wagon received from 16th Battalion being handed in under instructions received from Division. As 12th Field Coy.Engineers had had a G.S.Wagon condemned this surplus Wagon was issued to them. The Kitchen will be issued in satisfaction of first Indent submitted.
- 13/8/18. Lorry returned from Gun Park with receipt for 24 complete Guns rendered surplus by disbandment of the 52nd Battalion.  
 Brigade W.O's spent the day getting Stores of 47th and 52nd Bns. ready for despatch to Base.
- 14/8/18. Lieut.Harrington visited D.A.D.O.S. 2nd and 3rd Divisions and Aust.Corps.Troops also D.H.Q.
- 15/8/18. Received permission from A.D.O.S. Aust.Corps. to return Mob. Stores of 47th Battalion to Base.  
 All Units of Division are fairly complete as regards supply of Ordnance Stores and nothing is urgently required.  
 During the week the Armourers and Bootmakers Workshops have been doing very satisfactory work. A number of Lewis and Vickers Guns and a large quantity of Bicycles have been overhauled and repaired by Armourers and all Australian Pattern Boots have been clamped before issue to Units as well as general repair work by Bootmakers.

- 16/8/18. Visited C.O. 4th Army Troops No.1 to whom the Artillery are still attached while in Rest Area. Informed him of reduction in scale of Harness and Saddlery for Field Artillery Brigades authorised by G.H.Q., O.B./1866E dated 10/6/18. Asked him to see that the Artillery return all Harness and Saddlery rendered surplus and to ensure that same is returned to Base, the receipts to be forwarded to me so that financial adjustment could be made between the Australian and the Imperial Authorities.  
Saw staff Captain, 4th Aus.Div.Art.
- 17/8/18. Forwarded letter from A.D.O.S. to C.O. 4th Army Troops No.1 in confirmation of our conversation of yesterday regarding the reduction in scale of Harness and Saddlery for Field Art.Bdes.
- 18/8/18. Saw Staff Captain 12th and 13th Bdes also 4th Div.Art. Artillery on move from 4th Army Rest Area to rejoin the Division.  
The Coys. of 4th Aus.Div.Train each returned a Travelling Kitchen which they had been carrying surplus to Establishment. These were ordered to be returned by Divisional Headquarters.
- 19/8/18. Quantity of Harness and Saddlery returned by the Artillery forwarded to Base. Truck and Waybill number obtained.  
As Units only received very short notice the day previous the full quantity has not been returned but the balance will be returned as soon as the Artillery rejoin the Division.  
Visited C.O. 4th Aus.Fld.Amb. and inspected his Transport vehicles. They looked very well and he informed me that all his requirements were being met.  
Visited Mobile Vet.Sec. who want a new shaft for their Horse Ambulance. The Base sent up one 9 feet long whereas they require one 11 feet long. Sent indent to Base with remarks to that effect. There does not appear to be any standard Horse Ambulance and there is always difficulty in getting parts notwithstanding the fact that we always give the name of the Maker or any other distinguishing marks on the Indent.  
Visited Armourers Workshop at Boutillerie and found that Units were returning a number of French civilian Bicycles and expecting Army Bicycles in exchange. Instructed Brigade W.O's not to accept any more civilian Bicycles.  
A number of Gramophones belonging to various Units which were issued by the Comforts Fund have been lying in the Shop for a long time waiting for spare parts. Told S/Sgt.Raper, Foreman of W'shop, to let me have a list of Units and I would find out from the Comforts Fund if they could supply these spares and if not, will write to Units to take them away as they take up too much space when moving
- 20/8/18. Saw A.A. & Q.M.G. and gave him statement showing issues and returns of Clothing. (See Appendix 1.) I pointed out that some Units had returned article for article whereas others had only returned about half. He is showing it to the C.O.C. and sending it out with a covering letter to all concerned. Also gave A.A. & Q.M.G. statement of issues to Battalions for 5 Months (See Appendix 11)  
Took 3 Air Cylinders for Strombos Horns to No. 2 Ordnance Mobile Workshop for refilling also One pair of Binoculars and Clinometer for repair. Brought back the Refilled cylinders in Car.  
G.R.O. 4292 published authorising return of Pistols etc., by Machine Gun Battalions and stating that in future only Nos.1 of Lewis Gun Crews in Battalions including 4 Guns for A.A. Defence would be armed with Pistols. All Indents for Pistols to Bns. outstanding on Base were cancelled by this G.R.O.
- 21/8/18. Moved Artillery from 4th Army Troops No.1 back to Division.  
Wrote to Brigades and M.G. Battalion re G.R.O.4292 and return of Pistols, instructing Battalions to Indent for 4 Pistols as a first supply and to redemand any Pistols Outstanding for Lewis Gun Crews.

- 21/6/18. (cont.) Instructed Armourers to prepare 64 Rifles, Bayonets and Scabbards for issue to Machine Gun Battalion to replace Pistols returned.  
 Called on A.D.O.S. Aust. Corps.  
 Lorry sent to Gun Park to collect 7 Beds for 6" Newton T.M's. Wrote to D.T.M.O. asking him to inform me how many Beds and Sub-beds were required to complete and stating that in the meantime I had indented for 7 Beds which should be available tomorrow.  
 Attended Conference of Staff Captains. The question of returns of Unserviceable Clothing as shown on list forwarded to Units on 20th instant, was discussed. I suggested that Q.M's should inspect the men personally and satisfy themselves that articles were actually required and when clothing is received from me should make the men change their old clothing for new in the Store, so that there would be no reason for shortage in return of unserviceable in comparison with the amount of new clothing **received**. Also pointed out the necessity of returning all unserviceable Boots tied in pairs.  
 Staff Captain, 4th Aus. Inf. Bde. stated that C.O's of Ens. would like the Armourer Sergeants to remain with Battalions, but I pointed out that this could not be done as 4th Army Standing Order No. 604 states that Armourers must be employed in the Divisional Workshop, but that I was quite agreeable for one Armourer to be attached to Bde. H.Q. to do any work required by Units of the Brigade. Each Battalion has an Armourer's Understudy always with Unit, but Staff Captain said he could do very little owing to shortage of Tools, as most of the Tools had been taken with the Armourer when he entered the Divisional Workshop. I promised that I would try and make some arrangement whereby Understudies could obtain sufficient Tools for them to do all necessary minor repairs.  
 "B" Echelon D.H.Q. moved to within half a mile from my Dump.
- 22/6/18. To-day I bulked on Havre for 1800 lbs. of Service Colour Paint as I have received none for several weeks. If this bulk is not satisfied I shall have to report matter to Division for them to take steps to procure supply.  
 Demanded 1000 Field Dressings, only 200 asked for by Units but this will allow 800 for stock in case of emergency. A Stock if always kept of articles of this nature so that demands can be met as soon as they are submitted.  
 Indent returned from Base for Air Recuperator Pumps stating that supply was controlled by D.O.S. Rang up Staff Captain Div. Art re number of Guns fitted with Air Recuperators and number of Pumps in possession.
- 23/6/18. Took Indent to Gun Park for Pumps Air Recuperator and was informed that a new scale allows of One pump per 3 guns, consequently only 2 Pumps were required. I secured these and returned with same in Car. Also made arrangements for supply of 5 more Beds for 6" Newton Mortars.  
 Called on H.Q. 4th Aus. D.A.C. Nothing urgently required.  
 Re Pumps for Carriages fitted with Air Recuperators. The above was the first notification I had received regarding change in scale of Pumps for Air Recuperators from One per 2 guns to One per 3 guns.
- 24/6/18. Called on No. 2 Ordce. Mobile W'shop and left number of Warwicks and Guys for 6" Newton Mortars to be strengthened. Saw Staff Captain 13th Bde. and Div. Art.  
 Arranged to secure 4 Drums Soft Soap from Corps Troops to hold as reserve for Trench Foot mixture.
- 25/6/18. Called on Staff Captain Div. Art. re return of Harness & Saddlery authorised by G.H.Q., O.B/1866E dated 10/6/18.  
 Sent Lorry to Gun Park to collect 5 Beds for Newton Mortars also 6 Sub-beds, 4 of which were to be handed to 3rd Div.

25/6/1918 (Cont'd) Sent Lorry to Corps Troops to pick up Soft Soap; 1 cwt issued to 12th Field Ambulance; 1 cwt always to be kept in stock for emergency for Trench Foot Mixture.

Wrote to D.H.Q. asking them to instruct Units to return Socks for exchange turned inside out and loose, not bundled in pairs.

26/6/1918.

Called on I.O.M. re Guys. Found that Workshops had changed location and both No.53 and No.54 denied possession of 20 Guys left to be strengthened, afterwards found out from the I.O.M. at Picquigny that only 12 were in his possession and these were not yet strengthened but that he would do them quickly and also obtain 8 more for me. Collected 1 Clinometer and 1 pair of Binoculars that had been left there for repair. I have never yet been informed of the change in location of the I.O.M. and as Units are constantly asking me for the location it seems rather peculiar that I am not advised by A.D.O.S. of all changes of this nature.

As an Armourer was asked for at the Staff Captains Conference by the 4th Aust. Inf. Brigade S/Sgt L.A.C. Thomas reported to 4th Aust. Inf. Ede Hqs from the Divisional Workshop, to be under the orders of the G.O.C. of the Brigade.

27/6/1918.

Asked the Divisional Artillery for a return of the number of Air Recuperator Pumps in their possession, as far as I know ~~they are all complete~~ they are all complete.

Received instructions from D.H.Q. regarding special operations to be carried out within a few days, many special Battle Stores will be required urgently.

Administrative instructions received stating that the Pack Transport Troop will be formed immediately and that they would require 40 Sets of Packsaddlery and 42 pairs of Water Tin Carriers I obtained authority from Corps to obtain these from Corps Troops 3000 Waterbottles and Carriers wanted for the 4th Aust. Inf. Brigade a Lorry being sent to Abbeville to collect these. the 40 Sets of Packsaddlery were delivered to the Pack Transport Troop the same night.

During the day I visited the Divisional Artillery, Machine Gun Battalion, D.A.C., Gun Park No.4 and A.D.O.S.

28/6/18.

Lieut. J. Harrington, who has been attached as D.A.D.O.S. Trainee for about a month, instructed to report to D.A.D.O.S.

2nd Aust. Division for duty.

Visited Divisional Artillery, also D.A.D.O.S., 5th Aust. Division regarding 150 Suits of Yellow Cross Gas Clothing which A.D.O.S. had advised as being available there, but on enquiry found that same would not be available until the following day.

Called on A.D.O.S., 3rd Corps and obtained authority to collect 14 Hot Food Containers from the 47th Division; as D.H.Q. had advised that 60 Containers would be required I rang up A.D.O.S. who informed ~~that~~ me that Army would make the necessary arrangement for the remainder; in the meantime I wired to the Base for 50 Containers and 60 Cups firing Rifle Grenade to hold in stock in case of emergency and to despatch them to No.8 Ordnance Depot. Abbeville and advise me of the despatch.

29/6/1918.

1250 American Troops to be attached to the 4th Aust. Inf. Ede. for operations; received wire from the Staff Captain 4th Brigade that they had arrived without pullthroughs for their rifles so that 1250 were required as a 'first supply', on enquiry I found that there were none available within the Army so I will try and get them from Abbeville and O.C., 4th Army Troops No.1

29/6/18. (Contd.) Received instructions to obtain 2400 Waterbottles and 50 Large Wire Cutters for the 11th Aust. Inf Brigade as our Division were supplying them with Battle Stores. Secured 40 Yukon Packs to hold in reserve in case of emergency 4th Brigade require 100 Small Wire Cutters, advised A.D.O.S that there were none immediately available so I managed to obtain 61 from Stores that had arrived from the Base for Units. Obtained a further 20 Sets of Packsaddlery and issued them to the 4th Div. Engineers.

Sent Lorry to Corps Troops for Water Carriers. I had asked for 70 Carriers (pairs) which would leave me with a reserve of 28 pairs. Delivered a Quantity to the Pack Transport Troop who advised that only 42 single Carriers had been received whereas 42 pairs were required. I will obtain the balance to-morrow.

30/6/18. 20 Torches Electric required by the 4th Brigade; secured authority to collect these from O.O., 4th Army Troops No.1 Sent Lorry to collect and arranged to meet it at Abbeville, obtained 70 Water Carriers 1000 Pullthroughs also collected 50 Containers and 60 Cups firing Rifle Grenade No.23 which had arrived from the Base. Received notification from Corps that 60 Containers and 16 lbs of Luminous Paint was available at Corps Troops, sent Lorry to collect. Informed by the Pack Transport Troop that they urgently required 19 Surcingles and 19 pairs of Ropes Baggage as the Packsaddlery handed over by the Pioneer Battalion was deficient of these items these also were obtained from Abbeville and delivered to Unit the same night. The following is a list of the Stores required for the Special Operations all of which were complete by the 2/7/18.

I would like to point out the difficulty in obtaining Stores of this nature, if a list had been prepared and handed to me of all the Special Battle Stores required there would have been no difficulty whatever, but every hour or so some other special article would be demanded, which consequently meant obtaining authority again and sending a lorry on another long journey whereas one had just returned.

I would like to place on record that during the past 3 months 247 Lewis Guns and 22 Vickers Guns have passed through our hands to Units of this Division- 120 Lewis Guns being a 'first issue' and the remainder overhauled and repaired in the Divisional Armourers Workshop.

The Bootmakers and Armourers have been doing very good work during the Month, the Bootmakers clumping and repairing boots whilst the work of the Armourers has been chiefly confined to work on Bicycles S/Sgt. H.G. Raper, foreman of the Armourers Shop, was awarded the Meritorious Service Medal in the Birthday Honours and Major J.H. Tuckett and Conductor C.S. Newman received special mention in Sir Douglas Haig's Despatch.

The vacancies in the Staff caused by the deaths of the 6 men at Camon in May last have not yet been filled but men are on probation and will shortly be transferred to complete.
