Date\_\_\_ 水 TESTRALIAN MOUNTED DIV Secretary, Educational Advisory Committee. with the fair hap with that the first day and the distribution The work during the last fortnight has been carried out under rather difficult circumstances as regards weather, accommodation and equipment. With the exception of the 5th. L.H. Brigade the whole division is in tents and consequently more subject to the vagaries of the weather then if in billets. During the period under review a number of Marquees were received. These will be an immense help, enabling large classes to be held during rainy weather, a proceeding which was impossible before. A number of text books and a quantity of stationery were received during the fortnight. These have been distributed among the Brigades and have given a much needed fillip to the When the additional books asked for a received the individual students will be able to "swot" up in their spare time. No blackboards, forms or benches have yet been received. These are most urgently required as timber is very scarce, and, though some tables have been improvised, units are unable to make a great deal of headway. Blackboards, however, are the most urgent requirement at the present time, more especially for the use of the lecturers in various technical subjects. The I.C. engines promised by the Advisory Committee will enable the classes in this subject, which have been held up for lack of practical illustration, to make better progress. efforts to get assistance from M.T. units in this direction failed owing to pressure of work in the various repair shops. The proposed attachment of men to R.A.F. units will enable about 120 men from the division to refresh their knowledge of the various trades involved. The number of classes in different subjects has been increased, especially in the 5th.L.H.Bde. This Brigade has a big stretch of country to control and consequently cannot do as much as Brigades which have only routine duties to perform. On the whole it can be said that, during the period, fair progress has been made and the interest of all concerned well maintained. With the added facilities provided, the work should make greater progress during the ensuing fortnight. As regards examinations, the opinions of units have not yet been received, but it is not thought that there will be a great demand, as the students in most cases are simply refreshing their previous knowledge and are not inclined to go in for examinations. As soon as areas come under British control - even when this control is only to the extent of Cavalry and Armoured Car patrols - it is important that tactical, topographical and administrative recommaissances should at once be carried out, in order to provide material for a report on the territories occupied or visited by British troops.

- 2. The following points indicate the line that these reconnaissances should follow:-
- (a) Tactical features and obstacles.
  - (b) Communications rail and road, and landing grounds for aeroplanes.

(c) Billeting accommodation and water supply.

- (d) Economic resources mines, factories, crops, and water power.
- 3. The reconnaissances should be systematically carried out, so that as far as possible each report will be complete as regards the routes and areas to which it refers.
- 4. Please arrange for recommaissances to be carried out in the area which is or becomes occupied by the troops under your command and forward reports. Detailed march reports are required to cover principal routes.



During the past month progress in Educational training was severely checked by the movement of troops, transfer and destruction of animals and a week of phenominally bad weather.

Despite the difficulties the average attendance per Brigade at all classes within the Divisional area for the month was 107.

These are being withdrawn in the case of M.T. Units as Units are ordered to move to MOASUAR.

Although no definite report has reached this Office it is believed that good work is being done in the above Departments.

It has been decided, that, at the moment, examinations are not advisable.

A civilian was coaching the 3rd. Bde. and 2nd. Signal Squadron in French. He did good work; and appears to theroughly justify the payment granted by the E.A. Committee for civilians.


