Belah		0700	Marched in from School of Instruction Zeitoun and posted to "B" Squadron 2/Lt McCowan Major P.J. Bailey and Capt Costello proceeded to Shaluf near Gaza today to make arrangements for commencing salving operations on Wednesday the 20th. Notification was received from Brigade that the Inspection by the C. in C. had been postponed indefinitely. All those men who had not previously been though a gas test at Divisional Hqrs paraded at this time for trial test of helmet and respirator.	
	20th.		The Regiment commenced salvaging today of both our own and enemy's trenches at Gaza. Two hundred and fifty men per Regiment were to be found daily with two Officers in command of each Squadron, one Officer in Command of the Regiment and A Senior Officer not below the rank of Major in Command of the Brigade Party. Capt Costello was detailed as permanent overseer of the works and was instructed to make himself conversant with the work and report progress daily to Brigade Hqrs. Major P.J. Bailey left in Command of the Brigade Party, one meal and one horse feed were taken; the party to return to bivouac at night time and proceed out to the works each day. 2/lt Barton K and two Other Ranks batmen marched out to school of Instruction for Junior Officers at KELAB near Khan Yunis. Duration of school we three weeks. One N.C.O from "B" Squadron was detailed as Instructor.	
			Two teams of horses were sent today to Dier Sineid for repaired wagons, the teams to return the next day. Also a wagon was sent out today for wood under Divisional warrangement. This on account of the short issue of wood, which is hardly sufficient for the men's requirements.
