ANZAC	1/10/15		Quiet day - our snipers kept up a steady fire on enemy trenches, attention being paid to enemy's loopholes - these are made principally of mud bricks - about 3 shots as a rule bring them down and make the loophole useless. - nearly all loopholes on TURKISH DESPAIR WORKS have been smashed - destroyed during the night. Shells along HARRIS RIDGE and badly damaged the BALKAN GUN PITS.

Cross drives on tunnels running out from RYRIES POST still continues - enemy have been heard tunnelling opposite No 6 Tunnel Head but does not appear to be any closer than 16 feet. Apparently he is endeavouring to run a sap across his front to locate our tunnel head.																
Very little movement of enemy is apparent on our front. Monitor shelled OLIVE GROVE heavily about 4 pm.

ANZAC	11/10/15	9am	<p>Enemy shelled section very heavily for 1 hour and searched right along front - about 8 shells were coming over to the minute - gun fire was coming principally from OLIVE GROVES and GUN RIDGE - our artillery replied and gun were silenced at 10 am - our casualties were 3 other ranks wounded - one severely - only damage done was to reserve trenches of 4th L.H. Regt -</p> <p>During the day, matters were very quiet - at night a combined firing scheme by the destroyers and artillery (9th Batty) was carried out - target being HARRIS RIDGE. Artillery only fired 6 shells but effect was not observed - destroyers got a few good bursts too to BIRD TRENCHES - very little fire was drawn from enemy and most of it, appeared as if the enemy were firing in the air.</p> <p>During the morning's shelling, it was noticed that a very large number of periscopes were in use in the enemy's lines.</p> <p>Staff Captain (temporarily) vic Smith, Lt E. B. Skater, 4th L.H. Regt, took up duties in Staff position of enemy in front of Turkish Despair works.</p> <p>Quiet day - a shipping position of enemy was destroyed by the Bomb Sarge of the 6th L.H. Regt covered with corrugated tin was smashed by the Bomb Sarge of the 6th L.H. Regt with an improved Cricket ball bomb - during the night, an enemy working party on KNIFE EDGE was fired into by 4th L.H. Regt - effect not observed but no further sounds were heard from that direction during the remainder of the night - destroyers again shelled HARRIS RIDGE effectively - parties at work widening tunnel in rear of 4th L.H. position to 6ft overall to allow of mule transport to get into POPPY VALLEY. "	7/10/15	-	Quiet day. Sniping is kept up continually - when no target is visible, the firing pits or duts are employed to break down all loopholes - usually 3 shots with a brick smashes it up. At 2030 - a demonstration was carried out with No 2 attached. Very little fire was drawn - destroyer on right flank did particularly good work.	
"	8/10/15	-	Day was quiet but at night several working parties on KNIFE EDGE & TURKISH DESPAIR TRENCHES were heard - several rockets were sent up and parties fired into - at least 10 were seen to fall - no other parties were heard during the night. White Rockets were found to give much better results than any other colour - the white showing the ground up clearly.	
"	9/10/15	-	At 10 am, a Turk was seen moving along the beach about 800 yds from the BEACH POST - one of our snipers fired and the man was seen to fall - subsequently he was seen to get up and stagger along the beach towards our lines for a distance of 200 yds - during this time, he was continually shot at by his own people and it was therefore presumed he was a deserter. At dusk a party was sent out along the beach to get the man - on arrival, there, a Turkish patrol of 20 with 4 as an advanced point, was encountered. There were five men and four killed - the remainder retired and the stretcher party got the wounded man away safely. Whilst the party were out, the firing line CHATHAM'S post to the sea, and 2 machine guns kept up a hot fire on enemy trenches & prevented them

Shells came principally from OLIVE GROVES + PINE RIDGE - during afternoon and night the enemy were particularly quiet.</p> <p>Quiet day - enemy were heard sapping very close towards us in Tunnel No 7 - RYRIES POST. 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ANZAC	11/10/15		<p>During the night, the enemy threw out a good deal of wire in front of TURKISH DESPAIR WORKS - their entanglements consist principally of "Chevaux de frise" heavily wired.</p> <p>Quiet - very little movement of enemy notices.</p> <p>Quiet day - destroyers during night put several shells into BIRD TRENCHES and badly damaged them.</p> <p>Quiet day - day was unusually quiet - practically no movement or sound was heard from enemy's lines.</p> <p>A catapult bomb thrower was issued to the Brigade - during the afternoon. The W.C.O. in charge threw bombs a distance of 200 yds into enemy's trenches. It was found that up to ranges of 150 yds, very accurate shooting can be done - over this range, there is too great a tension on the rubber propellers.</p> <p>Demonstration carried out at 4 am, drew heavy fire from BIRD TRENCHES, TURKISH DESPAIR WORKS and PINE RIDGE for about 20 minutes. Enemy did not open up with artillery at this hour but did so a little at base without causing any casualties.</p> <p>Destroyer did particularly good work, mainly along trenches on HARRIS RIDGE</p>	<p>3. attached</p>

ANZAC	24/10/15	8.30 pm	Enemy working parties of 10 were noticed going along track in front of BIRD TRENCHES - 2 machine guns ^{6th LH} opened fire on them, killing 8. Smaller parties were noticed at intervals during night - 16 were reported to have been either killed or wounded. 4 th LH Regt received 50 reinforcements.	
"	25/10/15		Presence of working ^{parties} apparently indicates that enemy intends trying to move their positions further N along HARRIS RIDGE. In anticipation of this move, a tunnel 205 ft long had been run out from CHATHAMS POST. Instructions issued to 5 th LH to push forward tunnel work at once and extend work to edge of crest. Parties (sapping & tunnelling) have been put on, work to be carried on continuously until completed. Reinforcements (2 officers, 98 others) arrived for 4 th 6 th & 7 th LH Regts.	
"	26/10/15		Work on CHATHAMS POST extension continues - machine guns night of RHRIES POST keep firing bursts each night until moonrise, along position where enemy is working - patrols out reports no movement of enemy. - day was quiet.

	30/10/15		<p>1st Infantry brigade arrived during the night 29/30. 1st Batta relieved 4th L.H. Regt at LEANES TRENCH (map attached) - 4th L.H. Regt then took over portion of RYRIES POST in accordance with Operation Memorandum No 7 - reliefs completed by 11.30 am. - day was again quiet - during the night, a patrol (3) sent out from CHATHAMS POST at 8 pm, encountered enemy patrol - one of our men was killed - enemy's patrol immediately withdrew - work is progressing favourably at CHATHAMS POST.</p>

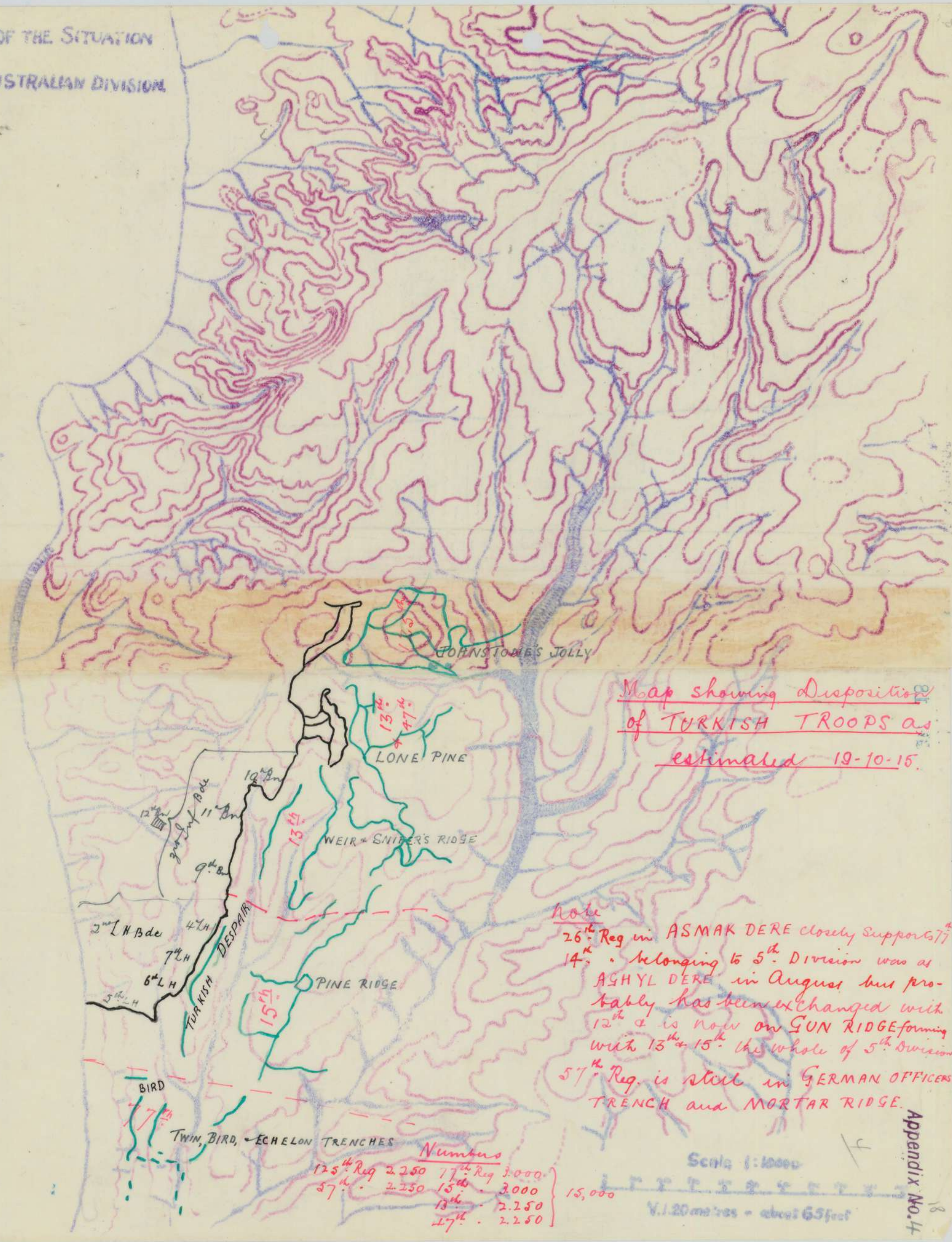
