" 3 Party of 1 Lt Col & 30 men reported to G. O. C. A.T.M. N. Details to take over duties hitherto performed by 1st Bde. 1st Lt Brigade arrived Et Maler in route to Be'ila

General Cox and senior officers dined with General Royston.

" 5 Green Whoura supplied for horses. Report thereon supplied by Capt. Warthington. Absence of M. G. P. after artificers court at Smailik reported to Lt. Col. A.T.M. N.

" 6 Absence without leave of Sgt. Vance and Sec. Cpl. Standring 10th Lt. reported to Lt. P.M. A.T.M. N.

" 7 General Royston President of Field General Court martial at Romani, Col. Scott and Mjr Greenwood Members.

<del>SALMANA</del> KHIRBA	23 Nov	2000	KHIRBA at 1930. Delay caused by inefficiency of native drivers, who had only been two days with unit. Supply Depot at halting place was in a very awkward corner, as railway line had to be twice crossed & traffic was congested. Camels did not finish drawing rations till 2200. Marching out state and numbers left in details at ETMALER see attached.	
SALMANA	24 Nov	1930	Major G.C.M. OLDEN <sup>IOALH</sup> left in charge of detail camp at ETMALER. Marched out from KHIRBA at 0630 - halted 2 1/2 hours at AMARA to water horses & have breakfast & thence proceeded via BIR EL ABD to SALMANA arriving 1430. A halt of one hour for lunch and midday feed was made at ABD from 1200 to 1300. Limbers again arrived late and two machine gun limbers had to stay at ABD for the night & rejoined before column leaves in the morning as horses are green and have knocked up. Camel transport left KHIRBA at 0700 after further trouble saddling & loading with natives and arrived SALMANA 1500 and were at once watered. They then proceeded a further 2 1/2 miles for water and supplies to SALMANA station and returned to camp at wells at 2000.	app. N° II
MOSEFIQ	25 Nov	1940	Watered SALMANA at 0730 and left at 1000. The machine gun limbers rejoined column at 0800. Column halted at station for one hour for lunch and water drawn for following day, its unconsumed portion being carried in bottles and water-bags. Column arrived MOSEFIQ at 1530. Camel convoy left SALMANA at 0800, halted at station to refill fantasses, and arrived at bivouac at 1630. Special supply convoy with some water arrived 1530. Four officers per regiment, Major DANGAR, Brigade Major & one officer from Machine Gun Squadron left column at the SALMANA station and proceeded to Cavalry School of Instruction Zeitoun.	
MALHA	26 Nov	2015	Watered at MOSEFIQ and left at 1000, proceeding via 6 wells 1 1/2 miles North East of KASSEIBA direct to MALHA arriving at 1600. A halt from 1300 to 1430 was made at wells for lunch and duty regiment (9 <sup>th</sup> A.L.H.) watered. 9 <sup>th</sup> A.L.H. supplied advance guard (one squadron) & night flank guard (one troop) during the march. 324 finished rear guard (one troop) & left flank guard (one troop). The track was very heavy leading over steep sand dunes the whole way. Limbers were sent by road to MAZAR & have been ordered to rejoin 27 <sup>th</sup> inst leaving there at 0700. They left MOSEFIQ at 0900. Camel convoy left at 0800 and arrived MALHA at 1715, a scout being told off to show them the best track through. In accordance with special instructions issued to 3 <sup>rd</sup> ALH Bde with Order N° 57 Augac Mounted Division one squadron 9 <sup>th</sup> A.L.H. was left at KASSEIBA to relieve detachment of N°1 Batta I.C.C., which was done. The brigade less one squadron relieved one squadron.

Day observation posts

Duty regiment will supply two observation posts of strength 1 NCO 3 men & a signaller, and an officer will be in charge of the day posts.

3. TRANSPORT.

On returning from first journey Units limbers will call at the Supply Depot and bring out Rations for the Day. An extra Limber will draw Rations for Machine Gun Squadron, B.H.Q. and Canteen.
4. BAGGAGE DUMP.  
 Until trucks are available Baggage will be neatly stacked at ROMANI Station on the ground near the Water Tanks, sufficient space being left for the passage of traffic between Baggage Dump and the Platform.
5. GUARD.  
 Each Unit will at once place a small guard on its own baggage at the Dump. The Baggage of the various units is to be kept separate.
6. TRANSPORT OFFICER.  
 Lt MacPherson 8th L. H. will act as Brigade Transport Officer at Romani until the whole of the Baggage of 8th L. H. Regt is on Trucks.
