



NEAR AMMAN.27		The Bn 1ess 2 Coys - moved out with the Bde at 0830 along AMMAN- AIN - ES - SIR ROAD towards AMMAN. Enemy opened fire at long range on Advance Guard of 2nd. Bn. who dismounted for action near KUSR, 142.Y.6.D. and deployed so that the road formed centre of line, with one Coy frontage on either side of the road. The enemy H.E. Artillery Fire was neutralized by the mud. 1st. Bn. Coys were not called till late in the afternoon, when the order was received for No. 4. Coy and No. 2. Coy less Escort to A.C.F.A. and 1 section to move to Bde H.Q. An hour afterwards orders were issued for 1st. Bn. to move up, and form a reserve to 2nd. Bn. (Maj. R.V. Branden, Commanding and the A/C.O. (Mapt. H.R. Denson) moved along the Wadi AMMAN to a point immediately behind the 2nd. Bn. H.Q. at the Castle, and 1st. Bn. H.Q. then joined with them.

'Qrs was moved forward about 1000 yards half right to a ledge on the steps bank of the WADI. and on the right flank of the I.C.C. line, where joint dressing stations were also established. All through the night the men of No. 4. Coy were employed in carrying in the 2nd. Bn. casualties numbering 70 in all, abd getting them back to the A.C.F.A. No. 2. Coy was brought into position as a reserve line with 4 Lewis Guns. The M.G. Sqdn. formed the remainder of this line to the left.	
AMMAN	28/3/	18.	This day was comparatively quiet with only reciprocal artillery and Machine Gun Fire. In the afternoon at 1600, A/O.C. 1st. Bn. took No. 4. Coy forward to strengthen the right flank of the line. Ground Scouts sent ahead - numbering 12 - recieved 5 casualties. The remainder whem. about half way across received orders from C.O. 2nd. Bn. to remain where theywere and take cover. This was done, and at night fall the Coy was retired to the old position in the reserve. In conference with C.O. 2nd. Bn. the A/O.C. suggested a night bombing raid as the best means of dislodging the enemy from their position on the Bde front. The suggested plans of operations was made out and sent on to I.C. Bde H.Q.	
ditto.	29/3	/18.	Comparatively quiet. The enemy with held all artillery and Machine Gun fire and few snipers were at work. During the day the Brig. Gen. Commanding I.C.Bde visited Bn. Ed.' and instructed Capt. Denson to place Lt. Matthews in command of No. 4. Coy. Orders and plans of attack for a night raid on enemy positions along the whole front were also received. During the afternoon 2 Coys of 180th. Inf. Brigade arrived to reinforce the I.V. Bde for the attack. The plan of attack decided on by C.O's 1st. & 2nd Battns, was as follows: The attack to be made in two waves of two lines each. 1st. Wave to be commanded by Capt. P. Newsam 2nd. Bn and 2nd. Wave commanded by Major Day 2nd, Bn. The first line of 1st. Wave under Capt. E. Deas 2nd. Bn. to consist of 2 sections each from Nos. 4, 9. 7, 18, and b Companies each with 2 Lewis Guns and men armed with Hand Grenades. Second Lines of 1st. Wave to consist of the remainder of each Company in same order. First and Second Lines of Second Wave to each consist of 2 half Companies of 108th. Inf. Brigade already refersd to. On the right of I.C.Ede Line, the N.Z.M.R. Were to attack, and on the left the 2nd. A.L.H.Bde. These attacks were to be delivered simultaneously along the whole line at 0200 on 30th. ditto	30/3/1	CPCS-Jerse jisk-escrateringships shieters warmen are seen	At 0200 the attack was delivered by a quick rush forward and the Bde Line captured the whole of their objective, consisting of 2 lines of enemy trenches. Units on either flank were not so successful with the result that, when daylight broke and throughout the whole day the new I.C. position received enfilade fire from both flanks. Casualties were afterwards found to be much less than expected, showing how efficient the work of consolidation had been after the taking of the position. Lt. Matthews with a party from No. 4. Coy penetrated right beyond the objective and actually succeded in getting into the town, hoping to find the M.Z.M.R. Bde up with him. Finding hamself alone, he was forced to retire with his party. About 1600 30th. orders were received to retire the whole line back to the Led Camels as the G.O.C AMMAN FORCE had decided to not further pursue his efforts towards taking the town. As soon as darkness felt the C.O.lst. Bn. and Capt. Tredennick 2nd. Bn. organized the retirement of the Companies. The rear was guarded by No. 4. Coy (Lt.Matthews). The retirement was effected without arousing the enemy's suspicions, although the lines were only 100 to 200 yards apart, and the night was stand fine.	
AMMAN	30/3/1	8.	As daylight broke on 31st. the whole of the I.C.Bde arrived back at the Led Camels and after a short rest the Battn marched off down the AIN-ES-SIR ROAD, arriving at SHUNET NIMRIM at 2100, where Battalion bivouaced for the night.

D. Tents, post stores and post reserve rations at the posts from which Camel Corps are being withdrawn, without relief, should be disposed of as follows:—

KABRIT. They will be despatched to Coy. Hd.'Qrs at KUBRI by the daily ration boat, before the detachemnt is withdrawn. The Officer Commanding 1/101st. Grenadiers, will send up a working party by the ration boat, IN DIRECT COMMUNICATION with the O.C. Company concerned, ti assist in loading the stores. BALLAH EAST. They will be sent to Coy. Hd.'Qrs FERDAN as opportunity offers. At the remaining posts they may be handed to the detachment 101st. Grenadiers, or sent to Coy. Hd'Qrs concerned as is most convenient.

E. The Officers Commanding Companies, 1st. Bn. Camel Corps, are responsible that the A.S.C. concerned is notified in good time beofre detachments are withdrawn from the various posts.

F. 1st. Bn. Camel Corps will hand over all Maps of this area to the 3rd. Bn.

The Bn. will move as far as KANTARA in three Divisions, thence in two.

Div. 1. will march mounted. This party will be as strong as possible.

Div. 2. will proceed by train to I.C. Bde. Strength will be all men not able to be mounted less Div. 3.

Div. 3. will proceed by train to KANTARA, where they will pick up camels from Remount Depot, they will utilize all spare Coy. saddlery, plus 50 sets forwarded from I.C.Bde, and join up with Division 3.
