

Horses were watered in the Orontes River on the west side of the bivouac area.  "C" Squadron posted inlying picket and observation post known as No 3 post on the west side of bivouac area.	
	2nd	0900 1300 1700	Horses lent to Operating Unit returned. Supplied picket of one troop in vicinity of HOMS. Organized party under an officer proceeded into HOMS for stores. Inlying picket and observation post supplied. (Major Lawson D.S.O. to R.H.Q. to be temporary in Command vice Lieut-Col M.W.J.BOURCHIER D.S.O. temporary in command of 4th L.H.Brigade.

			Note:- The weather throughout the month has been fine, without the exception of a few days. The change of bivouac area from the low flat country to the position now occupied was much appreciated. We are now camped on a fine dry site overlooking the bay and surrounding country. At night time when lights are burning in all the different bivouacs, and the Hospital ships lit up, it is not unlike GALLIPOLI as seen from the beach.  The sick parade has been smaller each day and the number of evacuations very small. Rations throughout have been good, although fresh meat has been fairly scarce.  An Educational System throughout the Division is being put into force in order that men may have the chance of learning a new trade or gaining a little extra knowledge in the one carried on before the war. This will also serve the purpose of keeping all ranks occupied up to the time of demobilisation.  A Committee has been formed to provide for all kinds of sports and recreation.
