	31 7100		Rain during the early part of the morning so that the party to the CEDARS and the trip to the Beach were cancelled.  The Regimental Football team journeyed to the 3rd Aust L.H.Brigade where they played the 8th L.H.Regiment team.  Organised parties under an officer went down to witness the match.	
	- From		Notes.  hroughout the month the health of the Regiment has been good, the percentage of evacuations being very small. Cookhouses on the scale of one to every two troops have been built of wood; tiles and bamboos, avens have been made in these, composed of stones, clay and iron bands off tibbin bales. The rations have been good, and a large quantity of extra comforts have been received through Comforts Depot and purchased out of Regimental Funds, in addition to this each troop pools a small sum weekly towards its messing, consequently troops are provided with three hot meals daily and as often as possible tea for night duties.  A good Brigade Football ground has been made just below the Regimental lines and Rugby and Australian rules football are played on every available opportunity. This Regiment being a Victorian Unit has three teams in the Australian rule competition and up to date have two unbeaten teams.  Paper chasing has been started and two runs have been held, On the first run there being about 30 starters and on the second 60.	- DEC 1918

The Regiment is bivouaced on a dry sloping hill and plenty of tentage is available, very little discomfort is experienced during the wet weather.  An E.P. Tent has been fitted up with tables and benches where men can play cards, read or write during their spare time.  One day during the month a troop competition was held for the best turned out troop.  Brig-General GRANT D.S.O. was asked to judge and he decided in favour of Lieut Gooding's troop with Sgt Jenkinss troop a close second, a case containing 48 plum puddings was gimen to the winning troop.
