The incidence of Venereal Disease in the Division is far too high. Returns show that many men do not report for prophylactic treatment, and that too high a proportion of those who do receive this treatment become casualties from the disease.

Many men, owing to indifference or the influence of alcohol fail to report for prophylactic treatment at the Rest House, in AMIENS, these should be caught on arrival in the lines by an orderly specially trained in the methods of treatment.

Recent trials have shown also that the early treatment of the disease, once it has appeared, is capable of aborting a very high percentage of cases.

The responsibility of seeing that men report for prophylactic treatment, and again for EARLY treatment once the disease has manifested itself, rests with the R.H.O. who should make adequate provisions for both.

Prophylactic treatment consists in the following:-

- (a) The man voids his urine.
  - (b) Washes the penis thoroughly with soap and hot water, paying particular attention to the glans and preputial folds.
  - (c) A solution of Pot. Permang. 1/5000 is run into the urethra either from an irrigator or by means of a urethral syringe, the urethra being filled and emptied at least 6 times.
  - (d) The glans penis is well smeared with 30% Calomel Ointment.
  - (e) The patient thoroughly washes his hands before leaving.
- Abortive treatment is carried out as follows:-
- (a) The patient voids his urine.
  - (b) Washes the penis thoroughly with soap and hot water.
  - (c) The meatus is swabbed out with 10% Argyrol Solution by means of a probe bearing a small cotton wool swab.
  - (d) 10-20 minims of 10% Sol. Argyrol is injected into the urethra by means of a hypodermic syringe fitted with an adapter, or failing this by means of an ordinary urethral syringe.
  - (e) The meatus is sealed for 5 hours with collodium.
  - (f) This is repeated for 4 days morning and evening.
- To effectively carry out these methods it is necessary:-
- (a) That all men be educated in the need for prompt prophylactic treatment as early as possible after exposure to infection.
  - (b) That they realise that prophylaxis is not infallible.
  - (c) That they be educated as to the need of the man to report for abortive treatment WITHIN AN HOUR of suspecting himself of developing the disease.
  - (d) That they be educated as to the early symptoms, itchiness of meatus &c.,
  - (e) That an orderly specially trained in prophylactic and abortive treatment be ALWAYS on duty at the R.A.P. and that all men are made aware that they can attend for the treatment at any hour of the day or night.

(f) That the Argyrol Solution be freshly prepared daily with Distilled Water only, the Argyrol being poured on to the surface of the water and allowed to dissolve without unnecessary stirring.

(g) That a system be adopted ensuring that all men present themselves to the R.M.O. before going on leave and within 12 hours of return therefrom, say at morning or evening sick parades.

To this end the R.M.O. should be provided with a list of all men proceeding on leave, showing the hour at which each is due back, that leave passes should be ~~invalid until~~ countersigned by R.M.O., and that all men who fail to report to the R.M.O. within 12 hours of return be reported for disciplinary action.

Only in this way can it be ensured that men attend before and after leave and so enable the R.M.O. to give them the few words of advice (a long lecture is not needed) which will cover the education referred to in paras. (a) (b) (c) and (d).

(h) That the treatment, both prophylactic and abortive, though necessarily largely carried out by the specially trained orderly, be actively supervised by the R.M.O.

Field Ambulances will carry out prophylactic and abortive treatment in the case of men belonging to detached units who have no R.M.O. and will continue the treatment in the case of those admitted from Battalions, but it is essential that the abortive treatment be started by the R.M.O. in the Battalion, immediately the first signs of the disease appear.





BILLETS & CAMPS. Ventilation is good and there is no overcrowding. Lice are less prevalent than for preceding month, due to disinfection of billets and clothing and to effective bathing arrangements.

CLOTHING. Is good and suitable to work and season.

FOOD & COOKING. Food was of good quality and variety and cooking good. Fresh Meat varies from 25% to 64%, averaging about 50% per daily issue, balance being made up with preserved meat. Bread issue averages about 90%. Fresh Vegetables averaged about 75% and full issue usually made up by purchase.

WATER SUPPLY. Water is drawn chiefly from deep wells, all of which bear labels stating plainly amount of chlorination required per water cart. At principal wells for filling of water carts, men are stationed who chlorinate each water cart of water. Water carts are in good order and repair. Chlorination of all drinking water is effectively carried out by units where water has been drawn from water points, where men for chlorinating duties are not stationed.

CONSERVANCY SYSTEM. In medical units, incineration of faeces is carried out. No Prisoners of War or Kaffir Camps in this area. In all other units, deep pit, fly-proof, box type of latrine is used. Urine is disposed of in deep covered-in pits. Receptacles for night use are used in larger billets.

BATHS. Three baths are in use and each bath deals with a Brigade group per week. The whole Division can be bathed each week.

LAUNDRY. Clean Clothes are issued at each of the baths in exchange for dirty clothing: dirty clothing is then disinfected through Foden Thresh Disinfector, bagged and despatched to Army Laundry at ABBEVILLE where washing and mending is carried out. Seams of mounted pattern breeches are ironed at Baths; all other clothing including blankets is disinfected by Foden Thresh Disinfector.

HEALTH OF TROOPS. Generally speaking, good. Number of cases of Trench Fever are decreasing for last week of month. Total number for month being 99 and that for last week 16. Six cases of Diphtheria have occurred, appears to be of a sporadic nature. Four (4) cases of measles have also occurred.

GENERAL REMARKS. Chief improvement effected during the month has been in disinfection of billets, clothing &c. This appears to have had a good effect on health of troops.
