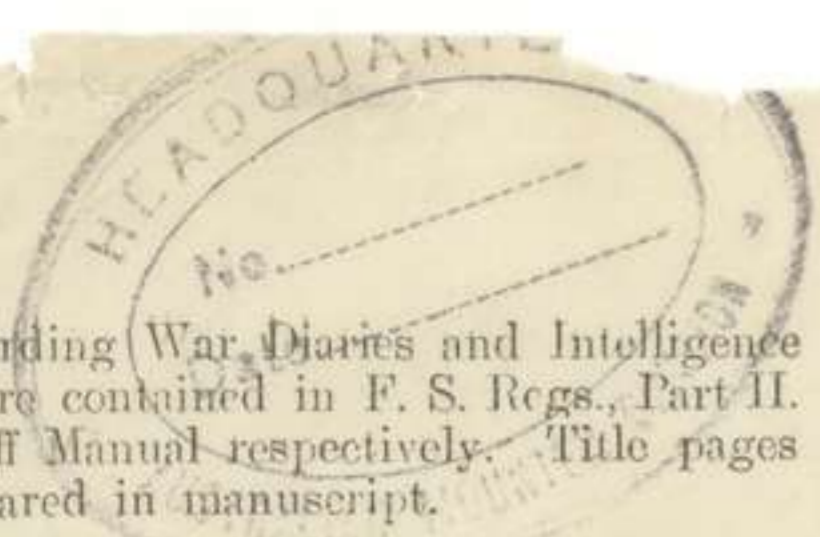

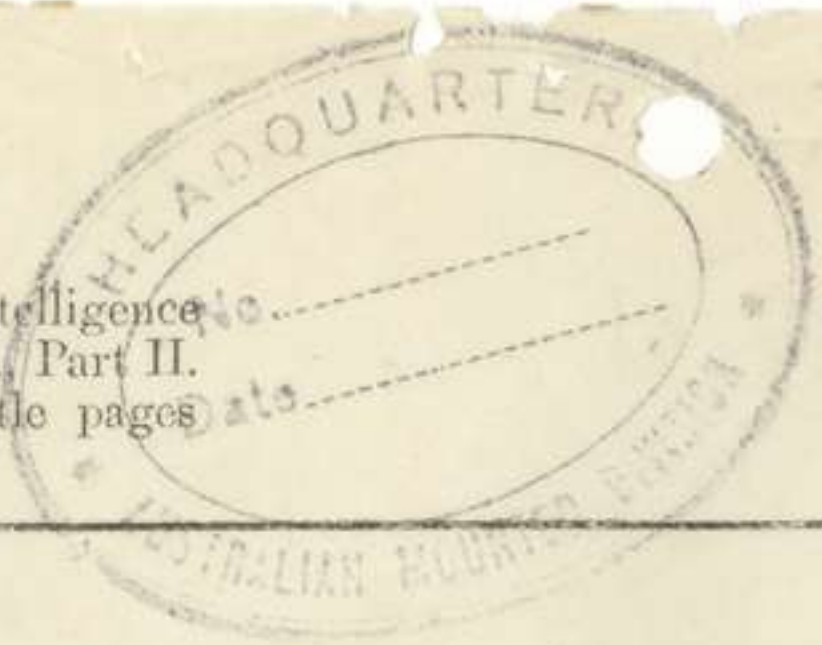

## ADMINISTRATIVE INSTRUCTIONS NO. 11. E8/8

Reference Divisional Order No. 22 of 8th. inst..

1. MOVE OF ALWAR INFANTRY.

Rations for consumption on 9th. inst. will be drawn on 9th. inst. from JERICHO.

Rations for consumption on 10th. and 11th. inst. will be delivered on 10th. inst..

On 9th. inst. whilst bivouaced in the WADI NUBIAH, water for men and horses will be drawn from Divisional Troops watering area..

2. MOVE OF 4th. L.H. BRIGADE COMPANY OF TRAIN. on 9th. inst.

The Company will march to Corps Headquarters Area, men and horses by Old Roman Road, vehicles by New Road so as to be clear of JERICHO at 2100.

Representatives will report to Admincom Corps Headquarters Area at 1600 on 9th. inst. for camp site and water.

Rations for consumption on 10th. inst. will be drawn at TALAT ED DUMI.

3. MOVE OF 4th. L.H. BRIGADE LESS TRAIN COMPANY.

The last delivery of rations, in the Valley, to any units of the Brigade will be on 9th. inst..

4. STATES.

Marching Out States of 4th. L.H. Brigade will be wired to ADMINCOM Corps Headquarters Area 48 hours before leaving present location.

5. QUARTERMASTERS.

Quartermasters or their representatives and sufficient personnel to handle supplies drawn in advance at TALAT ED DUMI will accompany the 4th. L.H. Brigade Train Company.

These parties will report 1 hour before time of march of the company.

6. TRENCH RATIONS.

Indian Scale Trench Rations will be issued to the works in No.1 Sub-Sector forthwith under arrangements to be made by S.S.O..

7. AREA STORES.

On the passing of the Command of Nos. 1 and 4 Sub-sectors and of the Right group Divisional reserves the outgoing G.O.'s C. will hand over all area stores for which receipts will be given and forwarded by the G.O.C. taking over to this office, with the following exceptions:-

Sanitary equipment, on area charge, with 13th. Cavalry Brigade Headquarters and 9th. Hodson's Horse will be returned to O.C. No. 8 Sanitary Section who will forward statement of numbers of stores received to this office.

8. TENTS.

All tents will be left standing.

G.O.'s C. will arrange for periodical checking of tents in all vacated camps.

Brigade Sanitary Officers will inspect the bivouacs of units before they march out and forward a report as to the sanitary state of the area to the A.D.H.S.

Herewith amendments to Appendix F Defence Scheme Left Sector Desert Mounted Corps dated 15th. June 1918.

Para 3. TRAFFIC CONTROL.

(a) JERICHO - JERUSALEM. Cancel para A and substitute:-

The times at which troops may use the JERICHO - JERUSALEM Road may be extended to the following hours:-

- (a) Troops and vehicles marching from JERICHO to Corps Hdqrs. Area will do so between the hours of 1900 and 0630.
- (b) Troops and vehicles marching from Corps Hdqrs. Area to JERUSALEM will do so between the hours of 1900 and 0500.
- (c) Troops and vehicles marching from JERUSALEM to Corps Hdqrs. Area will do so between the hours of 1800 and 0630.
- (d) Troops and vehicles marching from Corps Hdqrs. Area to JERICHO will do so between the hours of 1500 and 0800.

All troops and vehicles are to be clear of the roads between the places mentioned outside the hours stated."

(b) Delete:- 1. 1st. Mounted Division H.Q.  
3. by 1st. Division H.Q.

(c) OVER WADI NUBIAHEH.

Substitute:-

"Traffic, with the exception of motors and camels crossing this WADI, is restricted to crossings 27 and 29.

(d) THE ROMAN ROAD.

Add:-

Traffic crossing this road north of the WADI NUBIAHEH is to do so at the recognised crossings which are all marked with the usual sign.

Para. 8 RESERVE SUPPLIES.

Line 6 for "they must be turned over at least once a month" substitute: "These trench rations must be consumed once a month and others indented for in their place. The reserve water must be changed every week."

Cancel second para. and substitute as follows:-

All units hold iron rations for personnel. Two days special emergency rations for men and horses are held in bulk at JERICHO Supply Dump for all troops in this Sector.

Para. 10 DAILY FIGHTING STRENGTH RETURN.

Delete first 5 lines and substitute:-

Brigades will wire to Divisional Headquarters by 0900 each morning the fighting strength of the Brigade by units.

Para. 14 AREA STORES.

After " Heavy Sanitary Equipment" add:-

- Meat Safes.
- Spine lads.
- Mosquito Gloves.

delete:- Number of petrol Tins ISSUED.

1. LINES OF COMMUNICATION INSTRUCTIONS.

All units marching to ENAB must water on route at KULONIEH on account of shortage at ENAB. Formation representatives are to report at 1600 on the day before the arrival of Formations to the Admincom Corps Hdqrs. Area, Staff Officer, Lt. of C. ENAB, LATRON and KALLEH. Marching out States are to be wired 48 hours ahead to the office to which the Formation representative reports for camp site, water and rations. This wire is to be repeated to Descorps.

2. MOVE OF N.Z.M.R. BRIGADE.

Supplies for consumption on 18th. will be drawn from JERICHO. A double delivery of supplies will be made on 20th. inst.. Staff Captain and an Engineer officer will report at D.H.Q. at 1600 on 17th. inst. to be shown bivouac area and watering arrangements.

3. MOVE OF 13th. CAVALRY BRIGADE.

Rations for consumption on 20th. will be drawn from Corps Headquarters Area Supply Dump.

4. MOVE 1st. L.H. BRIGADE.

Supplies for consumption on 21st. will be drawn from JERICHO. A double delivery of supplies will be made on 23rd. inst.. Staff Captain and an Engineer Officer will report at D.H.Q. at 1600 on 20th. to be shown bivouac area and watering arrangements.

5. MOVE OF 3rd. L.H. BRIGADE.

Supplies for consumption on 23rd. inst. will be drawn from TALAT ED DUMM.

6. DIVISIONAL TROOPS GROUP.

Supplies for consumption 24th. will be drawn at Corps Hdqrs. Area Supply Dump.

7. DIVISIONAL TRAIN.

Headquarters and Headquarter Company will march with the Divisional Troops Group.

8. QUARTERMASTERS.

Quartermasters or their representatives and sufficient personnel to handle supplies will accompany the Brigade Companies of the Train.

9. AREA STORES.

Relieving Brigades will take over all Area Stores. Outgoing Brigade and Divisional Troops units will forward copies of receipts obtained to D.H.Q..
