Subject:- VISIT OF H.R.H. DUKE OF CONNAUGHT.

1. DATE AND TIME.

H.R.H. the Duke of Connaught will inspect the Australian Mounted Division and present medals on Thursday, 14th instant, commencing at 1030.

2. PLACE.

The inspection will be held on the low ground immediately West of Main Railway, where the last practice parade was held.

3. PROCEDURE.

(a) Inspection in Divisi-onal Mass, but Divisional Train, Field Ambulances, and Mob. Vet. Sections forming a second line in rear.

(b) March Past (Walk).

(c) Reform on Parade Line.

(d) Advance in Review order.

(e) Form 3 sides of Square.

It will be noted that this procedure is the same as previously practised except that "Trot Past" is omitted.

4. UNITS TO PARADE.

The Division, less the transport at GAZA on salvage.

5. OTHER ARRANGEMENTS.

Actual frontages (in yards) required on the Parade Line will be forwarded to reach this office by 0900 on 11th instant.

The following instructions are issued for the guidance of those who are to receive decorations from the Duke of Connaught on the 14th. inst..

- (H) The recipients will parade in groups according to the decorations to be received as follows:-
- (a) Front line officers, C.B., C.M.G., D.S.O. M.C..
  - (b) Second line D.C.M. and Bar, D.C.M. and M.M. (5th. Bde only)
  - (c) Third line M.M. (except 5th. Bde) and M.S.M..
- (2) The front line will fall in in the order given in the nominal roll on reverse.
- (3) Second and third lines will fall in by units in the following order:-
- (a) D.H.Q.
