

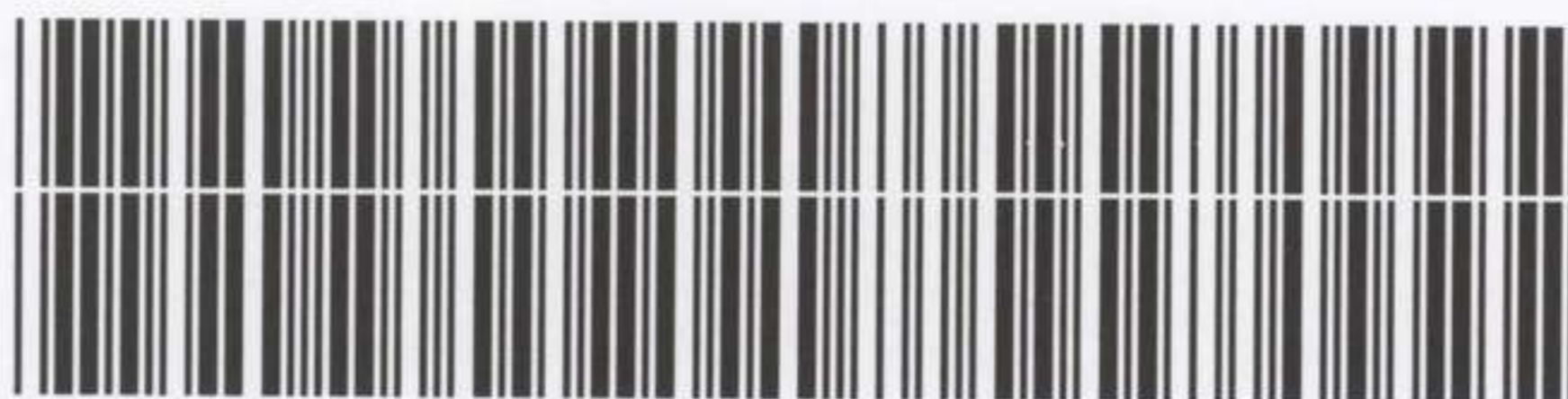

The afternoons were spent in Recreational Training, which included football, cricket, cross country running, and organised games.</p> <p>The opportunity of overhauling vehicles and equipment was also availed of whilst the Unit was in the Rest Area.</p>	JRS
			<p><u>Evacuation of Sick</u>. During the month the Unit evacuated the sick of the undermentioned Brigades:-</p> <p>1<sup>st</sup> Inf. Brigade located at MAILLY MAILLET from 28<sup>th</sup> to 30<sup>th</sup> of month.</p> <p>2<sup>nd</sup> " " " " BAIZEUX Area from 1<sup>st</sup> to 17<sup>th</sup> + 28<sup>th</sup> to 30<sup>th</sup> of month, and at MAILLY MAILLET from 18<sup>th</sup> to 27<sup>th</sup> of month.</p> <p>3<sup>rd</sup> Inf. Brigade located at MAILLY MAILLET (BEAUSARTT Area) from 24<sup>th</sup> to 30<sup>th</sup> of month.</p> <p>The cases for evacuation to the Base were sent to No. 56 Casualty Clearing Station, EDGEHILL, cases for Divisional Rest Station were sent to BUIRE (conducted by 3<sup>rd</sup> Australian Field Ambulance)</p>	JRS
