- (5) The Commander-in-Chief has had under consideration the large increase in cases of self-maiming by soldiers with the object of escaping from duty at the front. He directs that in future no soldier
- (a) who has been convicted of self-maiming, or
 - (b) who is under arrest on a charge of self-maiming
- shall be evacuated sick from the Peninsula but shall be medically treated there until fit to return to duty.

If in an extreme case it becomes imperative to remove such a soldier from the Peninsula he will not in any case be evacuated beyond MUDROS.

From the number of enquiries which are received from various parts of the world it is evident that officers and other ranks are, by means of private correspondence, making statements to relatives and friends as to casualties occurring which are very frequently quite inaccurate. Confusion, needless pain and anxiety to relatives and unavoidable expense both to them and the public, not to mention a vast amount of unnecessary clerical work to already overworked officials, are caused by these unofficial and inaccurate statements.
Officers Commanding Squadrons must take steps to have all ranks carefully instructed as to what is not allowed to be written in letters, etc.
It is moreover evident that Censors are not properly carrying out their duties as defined in Standing Orders, Mediterranean Expeditionary Force, Appendix I., Censorship, para (1) otherwise so many of these statements as to casualties could not be passed.
All Censors are warned that serious action will be taken if they allow such statements to pass through the post."
- PRIVATE CABLEGRAMS (3) Large numbers of private telegrams are being despatched to the Mediterranean enquiring as to the condition of the wounded in the Dardanelles and requesting a reply by cable. Friends and relatives of those serving in the Mediterranean should be warned that if they wish for replies by cable they must prepay the charges.

- (2) Extract from Operation Memorandum No. 40 of 23-11-15 :-
"(i) It is by no means improbable that the enemy may think the present stormy weather conditions make a favourable opportunity for attack, more particularly as he may imagine us to be in straits owing to the impracticability of landing stores and ammunition. Special precautions will be taken to ensure that despite any inclemency of weather the garrison of the firing trenches is in position, sentries alert, and supports and reserves readily available.
(ii) The natural tendency of troops to reply to a hostile demonstration during such periods should, however, be guarded against.
(iii) Greatcoats may be worn on sentry duty; equipment will always be worn under the greatcoat."

CENSORSHIP

- (3) The following is a guide to ALL ranks writing letters from the Peninsula to elsewhere, as to what they must not disclose in their correspondence :-
"It is strictly forbidden to disclose to unauthorised persons any information with respect to the movements, numbers, description, condition, or disposition of any of the forces, ships, or war materials of His Majesty or any of His Majesty's Allies, or with respect to the plans or conduct of any naval or military operations by such forces or ships, or with respect to any works or measures undertaken for or connected with, or intended for the fortification or defence of any place, or any information of such a nature as is calculated to be or might be directly or indirectly useful to the enemy.
