

(1) As articles contributed to the Australian Press by Mr.C.E.W.Bean have in some cases been misquoted so as adversely to comment upon tho conduct of the Australian Troops in Egypt, the following cable has been sent by Mr.Bean to the Australian Newspapers:-

"An article in which I stated that the Australian Troops were not responsible for a certain rowdiness in Cairo some menths ago, but that it was due sololy to a small percentage of unsuitable mon, seems to have been so twisted and misquoted by a certain newspaper or newspapers as to appear to be an attack on the Australian Troops in Egypt- that is to say exactly the opposite of what was written by me or intended.

Readers of my articles and cables know that the condition of the Australian force in Egypt, the way in which it has carried through its strenuous and tiring training, and the condition in which it is emorging from it are such as would make Australians, if they could only see it, very proud indeed.

on the whole of the Officers, who were never mentioned in my articles, & which are quite unjustified. Such offences as took place were Military offences. Nothing else occurred which does not happen in Australian and other cities every day.

The article referred to omits the fact which I was careful to stato, and which it is immensely important not to omit, that all tho men returned to Australia are not unsuitable; but that a largo proportion consists of men whose health has broken down through hard work and exposuro & who are bitterly disappointed at being unable to go on".

(2) The following is an extract from one of Mr.Bean's recent

"The 1st Australian Division camped today outside of Cairo is a different force from what it was at the beginning of its training in Egypt. It is a made and manufactured force. Its men are not only Soldiers, but ones opinion is that they are particularly good soldiers. The Division is not only fit to represent Australia, but one wwould say that it is a better disciplined, better drilled, better organised force than many of Australia's critics believed possible. It has been through the strain & the self-sacrifice of a very hard training, and as far as any force van be judged when it emerges from that ordeal, the first Australian Division is good. It is very good indeed."

(3) The following is one of Mr. Bean's recent cables:-

*After ten week's training in the desert, carried out in a spirit which one would have expected from Australians, the 1st Australian Division is emerging into one of the finest fighting units any soldier could wish to see. Hard work cheeffully undertaken day after day in toil-some sand and heat in the true spirit of playing the game, have gradually manufactured a fighting force of which Australia may be intensely proud.

I can state after following it closely for more than 2 months that the Australian force in Egypt deserves all the pride with which Australians will follow its progress".

RE INFORCEMENTS.

- With reference to the standing of 1st (E) Reinforcements, the General Officer Commanding considers it desirable to define their position as follows:-
 - They are part and parcel of the unit for which they have been commissioned or enlisted, whether on the War Establishment or supernumerary thereto.
 - From the date that reinforcements join, individual soldiers (but not officers) cease to be supernumerary as individuals. When therefore excess numbers have to be sent to the Base at a future date, it is open to Commanding Officers to send such N.C.O's., and men as can best be spared, provided that the full establishments (and no more by ranks are taken into the field. Any change in the officers of the unit

requires sanction from Divisional Headquarters.

- (c) Soldiers committed to detention barracks or admitted to hospital, or who otherwise are not immediately available will of necessity be posted to 1st reinforcements in preference to other soldiers.
- Soldiers sentenced to discharge, or who discharge it approved by the General Officer Comm manding for other reasons will be posted to the Base Depot at the earliest opportunity.
- War Establishment of personnel and horses, AND NO MORE, (2) are to be taken into the field by squadrons.
- Referring to para. 4, R.O. 61, the Nominal Rolls men-(3) tioned therein will be rendered two hours after the notification to move has been received by you, and not at 9. a.m. on the 8th inst., as stated. These Rolls will show the personnel actually going into the field, i.e., 154 per squadron, and 27 Machine Gum Section. In addition rolls of all ranks in Detention, Hospital, Sick, or in excess of establishment, will be rendered at the same time in order that they may be transferred to 1st Reinforcements at the Base.

Attention is directed to notes on the movements of troc by rail and sea, copies of which are in possession of all Every opportunity is to be taken of reading & officers. explaining same to the troops under your command -especiall paras. 1496, 1512, 1527, 1530, 1561, 1564, 1565, 1570, 1592 1593, 1594, 1599, 1603, 1608, 1621, and pages 11 & 12.

ENTRAINMENT

The <u>Maximum</u> time required for entraining a Squadron at War Strength and moving complete is 40 to 60 minutes. To enable this to be done the entrainment must be carried out systematically i.e., Parties told off to lead baggage, horses, vehicles, etc. When this has been done parties will fall in and marchea to carriages allotted, each compartment being in charge of an N.C.O., and troop Sergeants and Corporals being with their respective troops. As each compartment is filled men will sit quiet until the whole of the entrainment is complete and the train moves off.

While en route men are not to leave their carriages
without permission; when permission to leave carriages
has been granted men will return to their carriages on the

are present and report to O.C. Train.

The following notes relating to the Financial arrangements of the Australian Imperial Force are published for information:—

- 1. All casualties affecting Soldiers' Pay should appear in Battalion etc. Orders Part II, which must be issued and numbered separately and consecutively.
- 2. When punishments, promotions, reductions, etc., are published in Orders the Company etc., Number, Rank, and Name of the Soldier should be distinctly stated. In cases of Absence without Leave, the exact period of absence should be shown, and in cases of Detention the amount of pay forfeited.
- 3. Absence without leave for six consecutive hours or more out of 24 entails a forfeiture of one day's pay, and similarly absence from a duty which is thereby thrown on some other person.
- 4. Absence without leave, Detention, Field Punishment, necessarily entail Forfeiture of Pay, and no discretion is given to the Commanding Officer whether or not to enforce wholly or partly the forfeiture (see Army Act Section 138 and Note 2 thereon). This forfeiture extends to the whole day's pay (irrespective of whatever Allotment may have been made or what amount is being actually issued to the Soldier), and the amount thereof exclusive of deferred pay only must be entered in Cash Column of Soldier's Pay Book and signed by O. C. Company.

- 8. Allotments. No new Allotments can be made unless necessitated by change of rank, family distress, or by married men having failed to make provision for their wives and children as required by A. I. F. Orders.

ACQUITTANCE ROLLS.

Following rules should be observed regarding these: -

- 1. Actual date of payment must be inserted in each Roll.
- 2. Each Roll is to bear one Number only.
- 3. Such signatures as "Brown" or "Brown A. W." are incorrect, and cannot be admitted.
- 4. Imprest Holders only are entitled to sign certificate at foot of Roll.
- 5. The total amount acquitted is to be shown at end of each Roll. Amounts unpaid are to be deleted and excluded from total acquittance.
- 6. Fractions of pence are not admitted.
- 7. Any alteration to amount of cash advanced to Soldier is to be initialled by Payee. All other alterations are to be initialled by Officer signing Certificate.
- 8. Erasures are prohibited under any circumstances.
- 9. No Fines or Forfeitures should appear on Acquittance Rolls which should show the exact nett amount received by the Soldier only.
- 10. Names on Acquittance Rolls should be in same order as in Nominal Rolls.
- 11. Rolls may be furnished in ink or indelible pencil. Black lead pencil must not be used.
