5th.Light Horse Regiment, A.I.F. 2nd.Light Horse Brigade, For Month March, 1917.

Sheikh Zowaiild.	2nd.		Brigade made good KHAN YUNUS enabling country and road reconnaissance of area to be carried out. The Sqn. this Regiment moved along the beach road to TEL EL MAKAREB. Remainder of Regiment formed advance guard to E. of Sand ridges. "C. "Sqn. van guard, "B. "Sqn. main guard. When advance guard padsed E. of BENI SELA it was fired on from Eastward. 6 snipers taken prisoner here Vanguard then moved on and occupied line running E. and W. through HILL 330, gaining touch with beach Sqn. at TEL EL MAKEREB.  Lieut. Hicks made a reconnaissance of Sand Hills from RAFA to TEL EL MAKEREB. Regt. returned to Camp. No casualties. One long range shell from WELI SHEIKH NURAN dropped within a few yards of main guard while at BENI SELA.	
Shunnar.	8th. 10th. 13th.		Brigade moved to make good KHAN YUNUS, HILL 320, EL FUKHARIX and ABASON EL KEBIR. This Regiment formed right flank guard, occupying line 255 (RAFA) to within two miles of ABASON. Sent patrol to FUKHARI, where enemy Cavalry patrol of 10 men seen, but did not come into contact with it. Duly returned to camp. No casualties.  Regiment with rest of Bde. moved from ABU HAMTHALA to BIR ABU SHUNNAR, a distant of 5 miles along the beach.  Brigade proceeded to DERE EL BELAH to enable reconnaissance of roads and country to be carried out. "A." Sqn. this Regt. formed advance guard, Screened as far as figure 6 on beach three miles N. of DERE EL BELAH, one troop "C."Sqn. formed Bde. right flank guard. On arrive at DERE EL BELAH, Posted on HILL 130, one mile N.E. of DERE EL BELAH. No enemy seen, no casualtic Regiment made a reconnaissance of area 10, starting at cross roads one mile S. of MAAN, then N.E. along road through ABASON EL KEBIR to point 340 half a mile of the second "t" in Abu Sitta, then by a line Southerly through WELL SHEIKH NURAN to a point where tracks meet about one mile S. of EL MELEK, then by track running S.W. to point on road marked 410, then by that roan N.W. to point of commencement. Area occupied by 1100. Recommaissance reports made by Capt. Stabfic Lieut. Hicks and Lieut. Billington. Re giment returned to camp at 1815. No casualties and no edemy	e ld,

references to Appendices Army Form C. Left with Bde.at 0230 for DEIR EL BELAH. SHUNNAR 25th. Left DEIR EL BELAH at 0230 with Bde. to take part in DEIR EL action against GAZA. Moved with A.& N.Z. Division do BELAH BEIT DURDIS, 2nd.L.H.Bd .in advance, 2 troops "A." 26th. Sqn. Bde.left flank guard. When near BEIT DURDIS "B." detached to outflank snipers firing on advance guard. Thissqn. moved out 2 miles and captured 7 waggons & 13 prisoners. Divnl.H.Qrs. remained at BEIT DURDIS, "C. "Sqn. as escortfor 2 hours and then rejoined Regt. at 1230. Remainder of Bde. moved W. to JEBALIE, about 3 miles N.E. of GAZA. 7th.L.H.Regt. with 2 troops of "A. "Sqn. (the Bde. left flank guardm covered the beach. This Regt. took up position on ridge overlooking main JAFFA-GAZA road at tomb 5000 yds. in rearof left Tlank of Turkish position S.E. of GAZA. One troop "A." Sqn. sent forward 300 yds. towards GAZAas observation post, 2 troops of M.G.Sqn. subsequently sent to same position. Body of Turkish infantty estimated one Battalion was seen from this post marching along road in cactus plantation F 800 yds. distant. The troop and M.Guns opened on them and Information inflicted numerous casualties. Infantry disperseda amongst hedges. For some time afterwards small parties of these Turks were fired on as seen moving among hedges. During this time Infantry attack on S. andS.E. of GAZA was developing. About 1430 the N.Z.Bde.arrived from BEIT DURDIS and moved on to ridge running from 2nd.L.H.Bde.H.Qrs.to ALI MUMTAR. The Brig.General this Bde.gave me instructions this Regt. to co-operate with the New Realanders in attack in rear of GAZA. The countto the N.E. of GAZA is as follows :- A ridge runs from JEBALIE to Turkish position at ALI MUNTAR, open sand ridges run close to and parallel with beach and para-i llel with last mentioned ridge. Between the sand ridges and the ridge JEBALIE to ALI MUNTAR there is a valley running to the rear of the main GAZA town. The S.E. side of this valley consists of a olive grove, the N.W. side consists of small allotments fenced with cactus hedges and in which there are numerous villages. Instructions to this Regt. were to advance through theolive grove as far as possible in co-operation with the N.Z.Bde. At 1830 "C. "Sqn. -Major CHATHAMgalloped down the JAFFA - GAZA road which runs through the olive grove with their bayonets fixed, closely followed by "B. "Sqn.-Major NEWTON- in support and ones troop of "A"Sqn. in reserve, before they could reach the olive grove heavy fire was opened on them from the cactus hedges and Native villages on their right. The Regt. then dismounted and with the assistance of the 2nd.Aust.M.G.Sqn.quickly overcame the fire, killing or capturing numerous Turks. This work was done at very short range, openings had to be cut through hhe cactus hedges to get at the enemy, as soon as ourmen ? got to close quarters the Turks surrendered. It. WAITES troop kept to their horses, jumped the hedges and got amongst them still mounted, Lt. WAITE using his revolver until shot in three places, and some of the troopers firing from their horses. While this work was being dome Major BOLINGBROKE took the 2 troopsof "A"Sqn. which had originally gone to the beach and with them raided the prepared Turkish Artillery observation post at SHEIKH REDWAN to the N.W. of GAZA, here he captured the observing party 4 in number, together with their range finding instru-Instructions ments and telephones.
