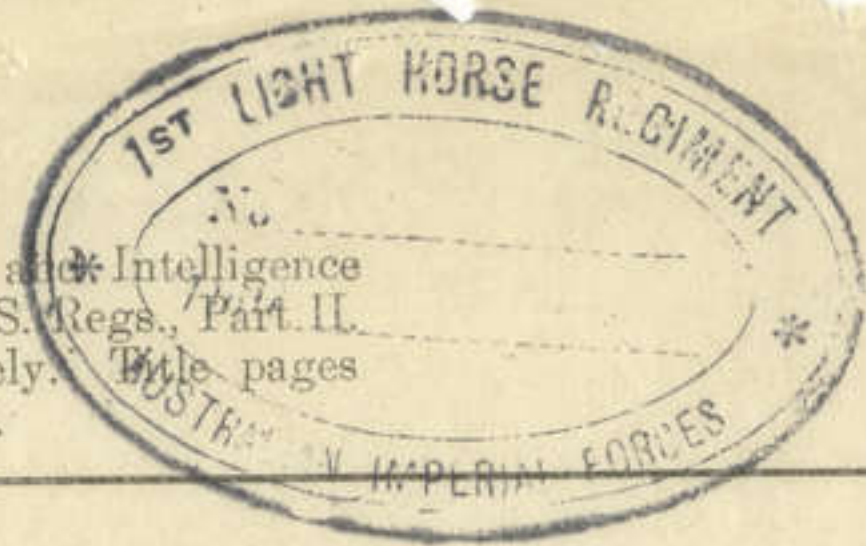

- (2) The Regiment will form up on present lines on the 23Inst. and move to ENAB leaving present Camp at 1530 and will march to area opposite DESCORPS REINFORCEMENTS CAMP where horses will be watered and fed, leaving again at 2100 for ENAB.
- (3) Order of March:-

 - Signallers
 - "A" Squadron
 - "B" Squadron
 - "C" Squadron
 - Transport
- (4) Halts .

The Regiment will halt at 40 Minutes to each hour and move again punctually at the hour. The first will take place at 1650.
- (5) March discipline must be observed throughout the move .
- (6) Bivouac area must be left perfectly clean and be ready for inspection by C. O. at 1510.
