1. INFORMATION.

(a) System of Defence. EL ARISH will be defended by a First and Second Line of Defence supported by a line of strong posts running from the Sea on the East, South of the Town, and back to the Sea again on the West. This system will eventually be continued on the South side of the Caravan Route West towards MAGBASA.

(b) Sections of Defence. The Defences will be divided into two Sections :-
Right Section. Commander : G.O.C., 42nd Division.

42nd Division. From the Sea on the West to a North and South line through the East of EL ARISH.

Left Section. Commander : G.O.C., 52nd Division.

52nd Division. From a North and South Line through the East of EL ARISH to the Sea on the East.

(c) Construction of Trenches. The First and Second Lines, when finally selected by Section Commanders, will be constructed and wired. The line of strong posts in each Section will be dug and wired.

(d) Outpost Line. Until the 42nd Division is concentrated in EL ARISH and is ready to take over the right Section, G.O.C., 52nd Division will be responsible for the protection of the Town from the present advanced position, which has already been wired. This Line will be the Outpost Line.

(e) Administrative Areas. Administrative Areas are allotted as under -

(i) 52nd Division. From the Railway Supply Siding, exclusive, Eastwards, and including the Town of EL ARISH.

(ii) 42nd Division. From the Railway Supply Siding, inclusive, (including Railway Station, Ordnance, R.E., and Supply Depot), to the valley - inclusive - which runs in a S.E. direction from the water tanks on the Beach about Kilo 153.

(f) Wire Roads. A wire road exists along the Beach to about Kilo 154. A second wire road is to be constructed, under the direction of the Chief Engineer, from EL ARISH along the Caravan Route Westwards to MAGBASA.

2. ADMINISTRATIVE AREA.

Administrative Area allotted the A. & N.Z. Mounted Division is as follows -
From the valley - exclusive - which runs in a S.E. direction from the water tanks on the Beach about Kilo 153, Westwards.

A. & N.Z. Mounted Division will be responsible for the sanitation of, and the development of water in this area.

1st A. L. H. Brigade,

It is of the utmost importance that the water at BIR EL BURJ should be developed.

The G.O.C. Desert Column wishes a comprehensive and thorough reconnaissance in that region made.

- Search is to be made (i) on the beach
- (ii) in the Sandhills.
- (iii) In the cravan route and south of it.

Any water found to be developed to the greatest possible extent.

In addition to the search for water a practicable route between the sea and the cravan route is required.

A report is required as to the possibilities of making a road, which would enable animals to pass from the caravan route to the sea to water or to carry water from the sea to EL BURJ, information of the following points:-

- (i) Amount of material required.
- (ii) Time required in which such a road could be made.

Every precaution to ensure the safety of the detachment will be taken, and, outposts, both day and night will be pushed out well in the direction of SHEIKH ZOWAID.

The reconnaissance is required as early as possible.

The G.O.C. wishes a reconnaissance to be carried out by the Regiment at EL BURJ of the area bounded on the North by the sea, on the East by a North and South line through the cross roads West of SHEIKH ZOWAID, on the South by the DARB EL GIDLA road and on the West by a North and South line through UJRET MASAUD.

The escort to the reconnaissance should be at least 1 sqdn owing to the presence of hostile, or presumably hostile, arabs in the country.

Points to be specially reported on - (i) Water possibilities. (ii) State of roads. Fit for wheels or pack and going across country. (iii) Observation Points, both enemy and ourselves and direction of view. (iv) Positions which may be taken up covering SHEIKH ZOWAID. (v) Firewood, or scrub suitable for it. (vi) Grazing for horses in area.


The point of concentration for the N.Z.M.R. Brigade and 3rd L.H. Brigade will be at BIR EL MASMI just North of the wells. Two routes to this point have just been marked by palm branches, the N.Z.M.R. Brigade will use the most Eastern and the 3rd L.H. Brigade the most Western of these routes to reach the place of concentration.

The Brigades will form up facing South, the N.Z.M.R. Brigade being on the East side. Units of the Brigade will be kept together and assembled in the hollows as near to each other as the ground will allow.

Divisional Hdqtrs position will be on Hill 110, which is about 400 yards West of the wells at BIR EL MASMI.

1. INFORMATION

(a) On the 29th January 1917 the 5th Mounted Brigade (Less one Regiment) will relieve the 1st L.H. Regiment at BIR EL BURJ, and will remain at BIR EL BURJ to protect the water development in that area, and to enable the Field Company to withdraw and fall back on EL ARISH if attacked in force.

(b) Patrols will be carried out as follows:-

(i) Three times a week to SHEIKH ZOWAID.

Strength of Patrol at least one Squadron

(ii) Daily Patrols 5 miles East and South.

Strength of Patrol not less than one troop.

(c) Observation posts will be kept well out by day.

(d) Standing Patrols will be put out each night.

(e) No tents will be taken.

(f) Probably an Infantry Brigade Group with Brigade of Artillery will be sent forward to BIR EL BURJ during the first week in February.

2. INSTRUCTIONS.

The spear points laid down by the 1st A.L.H. Brigade will be left at BIR EL BURJ and the same number made over to them by 5th Mounted Brigade. This will be arranged direct between the 5th Mounted Brigade and 1st L.H. Brigade.

Other details connected with the relief will be arranged direct between the 5th Mounted Brigade and the 1st A.L.H. Bde.


