REPORT on the Capture of TIBERIAS by Capt L. A. W. MACPHERSON

O C "C" Squadron. SEP 1918

"A" Squadron 8th A L H moved from NAZARETH at 0500, 25/9/18, and arrived at Y central at 1030. Patrols and L. A. M. BATTERY were heavily fired on by machine guns and automatic rifles, known to be six, north of the town. Two N C O prisoners reported 3 machine guns holding road leading North. I sent a detachment to Z 8 central to prevent escaping enemy using Beach road.

About 200 Turks, 3 motor cars, 2 motor lorries, retiring along this road were fired on from Z 8 central and all returned to TIBERIAS, the motors being abandoned on the road.

The high ground from Z 15 to 22 central was held by machine guns. "C" Squadron, 12th L H Regiment arrived at EL MENARAH and reported to me about 1200. I interviewed the Squadron leader, and decided to put his squadron through J 8 and 4 and one troop of 8th Regt through J 14-15 and 22. The second troop of 8th Regiment were sent through 20 and 21 to 22 central to make good M/ Gun positions on 22 central. The L A M Battery was sent down the road on the right of 8th Regt troops. Squares 20-21 and 22 were the only positions offering resistance. It appeared their idea was to hold road leading to MEDJEL, but I had prevented it being used by placing a detachment with h/kiss Gun in Z 8 central. Inhabitants gave reliable information at 1300 and I wired the 12th Regt squadron to commence demonstration at 1415.

I sent the armoured cars down the road at the same time and in advance of the squadrons. The 12th Regt squadron approached the town from the South and the 8th Regt Squadron swept over the M/ Gun positions immediately North of the town and entered from the North simultaneously with the armoured cars from the West and the 12th Regt Squadron from the South.

I arranged with Captain LOWING to supply the guards and picquets and patrol the streets during the night and I put my Squadron on outposts covering all roads leading from the North.

The following wire was sent at 1500 addressed 3rd L H Brigade and 8th A L H, "Have occupied TIBERIAS aaa 20 German prisoners and a number of Turks not yet rounded up aaa Please wire orders"

REPORT on OPERATIONS at KUSR ATRA 27/28th Sept 1918

The Regiment went into action at 1600 on sector of line (approx 029-35 central, Pal Sheet 4), the idea being to give covering fire whilst the 10th L H Regt crossed at ford at P 19c. Very little counter fire was put up by the enemy, 2 m/guns and a few snipers evidently being all their troops in the vicinity. The 10th Regiment crossed without any serious resistance at about 1800, followed by the 8th at 1900. Guides were left at the crossings also a signal lamp to assist in shewing 9th L H and B H Q the route. The 10th L H (leading), and the 8th L H were then guided by a intelligence (bedouin) agent to DAMASCUS road. The track chosen was most difficult and rocky and it took the column about 6 hours to get to TAT AHSEIN. Communication with B H Q was established at 0530 at Deir es Saros and the column then halted and rested.

A large enemy ammunition dump was found abandoned at TAT AHSEIN and evidently this place has been a refilling place.

No casualties occurred throughout the day.

At 0630 on the 28th 3 enemy planes flew over.

REPORT on OPERATIONS at NUKAIB SASA, Night of 28/29th Sept, 1918.

SEP 1918

At about 0200 on the 29th Sept, the Regiment, was ordered into, action to assist the 9th & 10th L H Regiments to clear the enemy off a ridge as they had delayed the advance of the Column for some considerable time. I could not find the 9th L.H. Regt, but met Major OLDEN of the 10th L.H. Regt, who could give me no definite information as regards the position of the enemy, except that they were holding the ridge, apparently in force with rifles and machine guns.

I decided to, attack dismounted at once, and arranged with Major OLDEN to go in on my left. The Regiment advanced under heavy fire to within 500 yards of the enemy's position when I ordered-discovered that the 10th Regiment had not advanced with us. I halted the line and handed it over to Major Macpherson with instructions to keep up a heavy fire but not to advance unless the enemy's fire slackened off, and he thought they were trying to get away. I then went away to try and get reinforcements as it was absolutely necessary that the position should be taken before daylight. I found Captain MacDonald of the 10th Regiment on the road, who told me he had no orders, so I brought him along with me.

When we were half way up the hill I found the position had been captured by the 8th Regt. There were 5 machine guns and much gear lying about but it was too dark and difficult to get a complete check of it.

It was impossible to pursue the enemy on foot owing to the very rough and precipitous ground, and the horses had to be taken some distance back out of range.

The Regiment had no casualties, but 2 horses were killed by machine gun fire.

The whole operation after handing over the led horses took about 30 minutes.
