

Enemy forces of all arms are reported to be entreaching along the 6000 ft. Contour from GOZ LAKHIEILAT - Point 680 - KH. KHASIF - IM SIRI.

Desert Column is to reconnoitre this line tomorrow May 1st 1917. (a) 1 Bde A. & N.ZM Mounted Division is to make good GOZ

EL BASAL and the KARM area at 0800.

The Imperial Mounted Division will reconnoitre the line GOZ

LAKHLEILAT to Point 680.

6th Bde will leave ABASAN EL KEBIR at 0430 and will move via UM AJUA - Point 530 - Point 630 TEL ITWEIL on BIR EL ESANI and from thence will reconnoitre the GOZ LAKHLEILAT Point 680 position.

(a) I.E.S. Cav. Bde. will move in support of the right of 6th Bde. and will make good the line Point 530 GERALIN - BEIT

GHAZALI - TEL ETWEIIL by 0830.

(b) 4th A.L.H. Bde less 4th A.L.H. Regt. will move in support of the 6th Bde and will be at GOZ MARRUK at 0830. This Bde will push patrols East of Wadi SHANAG through EL GA'A and SHANAG.

This operation is a reconnaissance and Bdes. will not become seriously involved with strong enemy forces. Should enemy mounted troops be encountered they should be dealt with as

boldly as possible.

Plentiful water supply is known to exist at BIR EL ESANI. 6.

On conclusion of reconnaissance 6th Bde. will withdraw to 7. GOZ MABRUK when orders will be issued for the return to bivouac.

R.H.A. Batteries and F.A. sand carts will accompany Bdes. 8. Field Troops and Mob. Vet. Sects. will remain in bivouac.

Bdes will move as light as possible. Mobile Scale of rations 9. and S.A.A. limbered wagons will not to be taken.

3rd Bde. and 4th A.L.H. Regt. will remain saddled up until 10. further orders.

Having made good its area I.S.Cav. Bde. will water by Squadrons 11. at the pool & N. of GOZ MABRUK. 4th Bde. will water at GAMLI.

Divisional Headquarters will be established at EL SHAUTH at 12. 0700. Advanced H.Q. will move to GOZ MABRUK at 0830 at which hour a visual station will be established there.

RECONNAINSSANCE REPORT.

- MAY 1917 640/14

On the morning 1st May the 4th A.L.H.Brigade moved to GOZ MABRUK.

From this Point two Officer's Patrols were sent due E. with orders to reconnoitre country along Contour 600 and get in touch with the ANZAC MOUNTED DIVISION on the left and the 6th Mounted Brigade on the right.

These two patrols got in touch with the troops on the right and left and by 1200 had reached a line extending from Contour 700 West of K in KHAREIRA through the EL in KHOR EL AJRAMA towards e on REERSHEBA - FARA road.

6th Mounted Brigade occupied 690 RASHID BECK.

Small enemy patrols were encountered from Contour 600. Enemy kept falling back and occupied positions along Contour 800 which seemed to be their main observation line.

At 1300 the patrol on the right fell back to Point 680.

No signs of trenches were seen in the area covered and there were no indications of large forces having occupied the country.

The country is undulating and passable for wheeled traffic and offers good cover for Mounted Troops. The depressions are cultivated, the hills in places being bare and stony. No signs of water in this area. All tracks lead to BIR ESANA.

The two patrols retired at 1500 being sniped at by the enemy. There were no casualties.



Officers commanding patrols or reconnaissances should state clearly where they are, the exact location of enemy patrols or positions, what the O.C. is doing and what he intends to do, to enable in rear to follow his and the enemy's movements and to sum up the situation from the map.

During the daytime indiscriminate firing at aeroplanes must be discontinued. Certain machine guns should be
definitely detailed from each unit to engage enemy aircraft
when flying overhead. Such fire should cease as soon as the
machine has passed out of bombing distance, as excessive fire
is only waste of ammunition.

In addition, squads will be told off by units to engage enemy aeroplanes with rifle fire. This fire will consist of "Volley" and not "Independent" firing at the command of the O.C. Squad, who will give the actual words of command for loading, range sight, and fire, at so many lengths ahead.







The country in the vicinity of 810 & 820 and REIT ABU
TAHA is very undulating and of a stoney nature although the stones
do not impede operations by mounted troops old ruins are scattered
widely in the area about the junction of SABA-FARA road and the black
track through U in REIT ABU TAHA owing to the stoney nature of the
ground the Wadis have not made deep "cut aways" and all are passable
for wheels. The country affords good approaches and cover for horses
and men. Concealed Cun positions could be selected almost anywhere
in thes area.

. The HANA FISH Wadi in its upper branches affords few

obstacles as good crossings exist in many places.

The spur just East of V in CULTIVATION is a good observation point from which the camps at ABU IRGEIG and two miles. W of BIR SABA can be seen. No direct observation could be obtained on the railway W of. BIR SABA owing to the intervening ridge 910-790-650.

Points 810 and 820 are excellent observation posts which cover

the approaches from the valley of the Wadi ELI SUFI.

Roads. The SABA-FARA road is well defined having about twelve deep ruts about 9 inches deep probably made by heavy guns during wet weather. The black track through ABU TAHA and the ABU SHAWISH road are

well defined and are quite hard.
These roads could be strengthened by using the abundance of

stone in the vicinity.

Small patrols were pushed back from EL BUGGAR to 810 and 820 where they were reinforced by about 150 mounted men. These were forced back from point 820 to 810 whence they were later driven off retiring to ridge 910-790.

on this latter line. During the early part of the morning their mounted troops adopted a weak tactic in order to cover the dismounted retirement to the above line. Horsemen in pairs and even single horsemen would gallop forward but on the approach of our patrols within rifle range they would turn and gallop back. After occupying the 910-790 line the enemy did nothing in the way of counter moves and kept out of sight.

Crops. The crops were too thin to burn but 20 heaps about 2 waggon loads were burnt.

Watering Horses.

The Brigade was watered at I600 on the 22nd. at MARAKEB also between I400 and I600 at cisterns about EL BUGGAR on 23rd. and at 0900 at MARAKEB on 24th.







NO:-1 GOZ HABRUK All clear at 0630 at ESANT and 680. During the day a few shots were exchanged with small patrols near RASITID HEK and snipers prevented our patrols from wartering at ESANI. No: -2. GOZ EL BASAL. Patrol to 550 N of IM SIRI and in direction of KH KHASIF At 1430 enemy strength zeroxxxxxxxxx fxxxx120 approached 4 fromkH IMLEIH. About 60 enemy cavalry and camelry were grazing on slope of 630 EL GIRHEIR. Enemy attempted to work round our post on 550 and one mouse enemytroop galloped against our post of 8 monMAY 1917 on 550. A volley of 5 rounds rifle fire were fired and our post was then forced to retire to GOZ EL BASAL. Enemy did not advance further but concentrated on slopes of Hill 630 with a forward post of about 50 on Hill 550 W of 630. About 50 enemy cavalry and camelry moved from TAHA in BEIT ABU TAHA to junction of tracks & W of 630 EL GIRHEIR. Our two patrols at GOZ EL GELEIB was sent up to reinforce the line between GOZ EL BASAL and point 510 on ABU SHAWISH road. Hotchkiss Gun fire was opened on enemy who galloped off. Enemy then become less active and a proportion retired. No:-3. GOZ EL GELEIB. Reinforced No:-2 patrol between GOX EL BASAL and 510. No:-4 patrol. Fired at by small party just before reaching 510 Enemy observation post on Hill 630 strength 8 men. A railway bridge 6 spans was seen on a bearing 65 from point510 which crossed branch Wadi N of BIR IELEIS, a train of 7 trucks passed over at 1430. No: -5 Patrol. Reached A in ABU SHAWISH Working parties protected by small parties of cavalry and camelry were seen S of WADI IMLEIH. A forward patrol towards 410 reports a strong redoubt at 410. Patrol was driven back by rifle fire. Heavy M.G. Fire probably practee was heard throughout the morning. A train was seen moving S E from direction of HAREIRA. Reached Hill 300 andpursued two enemy patrols to No:-6 Patrol. within about 500 of WADI SHERIA where our patrols was driven off by enemy strength 70 cavalry and camelry who were covering harvesting parties S of WADI. In vicinity of KH ERK and between ERK and BAIKET EL SANA about 12 tents were seen. The unusual activity in thearea 630 EL GIRHEIR and W IM SIRR was apparently made in order to clear the western slopes of 630 and 720 for working parties to collect the crops and to gain
