1. The defensive front of Nos.3 and 4 Subsectors will be gradually reorganised during the period August 12th - 15th.
2. When the reorganisation is complete, the garrison will be distributed as follows:-

MOVES.

3.(a) On night 12th/13th August one Coy. 1st Battn. B.W.I. Regt will move from Y.29 at 1930 to "C" Section.
1st. Battn. B.W.I. Regt. (less 3 Coys) will move from Y.29 at 1930 to Y.17 c.2.1 and Y.16 d.5.6 taking over present Hdqtrs. 10th A.L.H. Regiment at Y.17 c.2.1.
One Coy. 1st. Battn. B.W.I occupying present bivouac reserve Squadron at Y.16 d.5.6.

(b) On night 12th/13th August 10th A.L.H. Regiment after relief will move from "G" Section to Y.28 along routes 26 and 33, occupying camp being vacated by 18th Lancers and 4 Machine Guns.

(c) On night of 12th/13th August 10th A.L.H. Led Horses will move from K.5 at 1930 along routes 27 to Y.28.
On arrival at Bivouac Area in Y.28, horse-lines will be put down and the following detail of horses will be sent to report to Hdqtrs "C" Section at 2200:-

All packs.

"A" Squadron - 77 rides. "B" Sqdn. - 41 rides.

"C" Sqdn - 52 rides. Hdqtrs - 12 rides. In addition 2 spare rides per Squadron.

4. The command of all troops in "F" & "G" Section will pass to the O.C incoming troops on the completion of the reliefs. Until such completion troops will remain under the command of the present C.Os.

5. During the relief the C.Os of the 9th A.L.H. Regt, 10th A.L.H. Regt, and Worcester Yeo. will hand over to the C.Os 1st. and 2nd. Battn. B.W.I. Regts the following stores, documents, &c. relating to their respective sections.

(a) All area stores for which receipts will be taken in triplicate.

(b) All special maps, sketches, orders and information relating to the defences.

6. Os., A.B & C Squadrons will each detail 1 NCO & 9 o/rs. to remain in each of the named posts as close support to the infantry. This personnel will be under the command of the Officers in charge of the respective posts for tactical purposes. A further detail of 1 N.C.O & 9 o/rs. to move into and remain in each of the works of No.4 Subsector namely:- WOOD, WANE, WART & WAX to act as close support of the infantry from night 13th/14th August inclusive will be detailed later.

7. On completion of reliefs the Regiment will concentrate in vicinity of R.H.Q. On concentration Os.C Squadrons will ensure that all reinforcements who have marched in during the period that the Regiment has been garrisoning "G" Sector are allotted horses and saddlery, and that all ranks under their command are prepared to move at short notice if called upon.

- AUG 1918

1. The 1st A.L.H. Brigade will relieve the 3rd A.L.H. Brigade as garrison nos.3 and 4 Sub-Sectors on the night 22nd/23rd Aug 1918.
2. The Command of nos.3 and 4 Sub-Sectors, and of 1st and 2nd. Battn.B.W. I will pass from G.O.C 3rd A.L.H. Brigade to G.O.C 1st A.L.H. Brigade at 1900 on 22nd August.
3. The 3rd A.L.H. Brigade will be in Corps reserve from 1900 22nd August until it leaves TALAAT ED DUMM. ~~fax~~
4. Each Unit of 3rd A.L.H. Brigade on being relieved by corresponding unit of 1st A.L.H. Brigade on night 22nd/23rd Aug. will move independently to TALAAT ED DUMM. Kilo 17 as follows:-
 - A. Men and horses by Roman Road (Northern)
 - B. Vehicles by new road (Southern)
 - C. No unit will move before 1930 and the march will be completed before 0400 on 23rd Aug.Units will be advised later exact time of move. Bivouacs will be struck, saddles packed and lines and bivouac area thoroughly cleaned ready for inspection by 1830.
5. Personnel of 3rd A.L.H. Brigade at present in close support of the Infantry in Nos. 3 and 4 Sub-Sectors will be withdrawn after stand down on 22nd. Aug., and will rejoin their respective units.
6. Os.C Squadrons will ensure that march discipline is strictly adhered to during the move to TALAAT ED DUMM and subsequent marches particularly with respect to marching on the right of the road and non-straggling. All rear parties and personnel who do not for any reason leave their bivouac areas with their units will be collected and will march in one formed body under a officer. A succession of small parties is prohibited.
7. The usual halt of 10 minutes to each clock hour will be observed.
8. All area stores i.e., tents (to be left standing), sanitary equipment, meat safes, mosquito nets, mosquito gloves, at present in possession will be handed over to incoming unit. All regimental reserve S.A.A (carried in limbers) will be handed over with area stores. Os.C will ensure that great care is exercised in handing over all stores.
9. Bivouac representatives i.e., officer from each Regt. etc., will assemble at TEL ES SULTAN at 1500 on 22nd inst. and move off for TALAAT ED DUMM under the command of an officer detailed by 8th A.L.H. Regt. Lieut. A. Herbert will act as bivouac representative for 10th Regt. for move to TALAAT ED DUMM and subsequent moves to LUDD Area. On arrival at TALAAT ED DUMM party will report to Staff Captain at Junction of old Roman Road and New Motor Road.
10. Last issue of rations in the Valley will be made on 21st inst. rations for consumption on 23rd will be drawn at TALAAT ED DUMM. Rations will be drawn on arrival at ENAB, LATRON, and LUDD. Supply party of 2 men per Sqdn. will report, mounted and prepared not to return to this area, ~~xxx~~ to Quartermaster at ~~xxx~~ 1430 21st inst.
11. Transport will move independently from the Valley to TALAAT ED DUMM via Motor Road (South). No transport will pass TEL ES SULTAN before 1930. Strict march discipline on journey is to be observed. Wagons to keep to right of road, and no straggling. An officer must accompany transport of each regiment. O.C. A Squadron will detail a non-commissioned-officer to meet transport at junction of roads at TALAAT ED DUMM to guide Transport to bivouac. On journey from TALAAT ED DUMM to LUDD Transport will march in rear of each unit.

12. Os.C will ensure that bivouac sites are left scrupulously clean; burning of horse manure will be carried on with all haste, so that very little will be left unburned when units move out. Brigade Sanitary Officer will inspect vacated camp sites, and will render a report direct to A.D.M.S. This will apply to all camp en route to LUDD.

13. The following will be the move from TALAAT ED DUMM to LUDD. On 23rd Aug. leave TALAAT ED DUMM for ENAB, passing 2nd.L.H Brigade halted at Kilo 3. Hour of starting - 1930. Route - main road. On 24th Aug. leave ENAB for LATRON. On 25th Aug. Leave LATRON for LUDD Area. Hour of starting in each case 1930, and routes - main road.
