





WAR DIARY MEDICAL SECTION HEADQUARTERS A.I.F. DEPOTS IN U.K. FOR MONTH OF JANUARY 1919.

During January the Strength of A.I.F. Depots increased from 34,100 to 34,348.

A. MEDICAL OFFICERS:

The Strength of Medical Officers in the Command has increased from 70 to 86 during the month. No Reinforcement Officers arrived from Australia and 33 reported from the D.M.S. for duty. 9 marched out to report to the D.M.S. and 6 embarked for return to Australia. 2 Officers were evacuated to Hospital.

4 Officers from the Command were permitted to attend a 14 days School of Neurology at the Seale Hayne Military Hospital, Newton Abbot, Devon, commencing on 27.1.19., and it is expected that they will derive considerable benefit from this valuable course of instruction.

APPENDIX "A2" is a request for more Medical Officers by the A.D.M.S. A.I.F. Depots in U.K.

This was met by the D.M.S. A.I.F. by sending Medical Officers due to return to Australia to these Depots for temporary duty while awaiting embarkation.

B. HEALTH OF TROOPS.

The number of soldiers in hospital shews an increase during the month. Influenza, which had almost disappeared during the first half of the month again commenced to increase in incidence during the last week of the month, and there is every indication that a further epidemic may be expected.



			<p>For full statistical reports as to health of troops, see <u>APPENDIX "B"</u>, which consists of the Weekly Reports on the subject submitted to the D.M.S. These Reports shew that for the five weeks ending 2.1.19., 9.1.19., 16.1.19., 23.1.19., and 30.1.19., the Total Numbers of soldiers in hospital were respectively 2036, 2140, 2330, 3006, and 3310., the corresponding percentages to the total strength of the Command being 5.97., 6.35., 6.83., 8.93 and 10.36. The large increase in the numbers for the week ending 23.1.19., is explained by the fact that 836 cases of Venereal Disease were transferred during the week from France to No. 1 A.D.H. Bulford. The further increase during the week ending 30.1.19., is explained by the increased incidence of Influenza, and also by further transfers of V.D. cases from France to this Command. The amount of serious disease was slight until the last week of the month, xx during which 12 deaths occurred from Pneumonia & Broncho-Pneumonia. There were 18 deaths from all causes, of which 17 were due to Pneumonia. There were no cases of Cerebro Spinal Meningitis.</p>	APPENDIX "B"

			<p>during the month, the figures for the five weeks ending 2.1.19., 9.1.19., 16.1.19., 23.1.19., & 30.1.19 being respectively 1090., 1198., 1431., 1975., and 1983. The increase is due to the fact that 1371 cases were transferred during the month to Bulford from the 39th General Hospitals Havre. An average of 60.6 per week were admitted from soldiers from British or Australian Auxiliary Hospitals or on Sick Furlough, as compared with 62.5 from these sources last month.</p>	
			<p>Of B.E.F. troops onleave from France, a weekly average of 40.4 were admitted as compared with 40.5 in December.</p>	
			<p>The admissions to Bulford Hospital from within A.I.F. Depots averaged 42 per week as compared with 72.25 in December.</p>	
			<p>543 cases of Gonorrhoea were discharged to the C.T.D. during the five weeks ending 30.1.19., of which 63 cases relapsed and were returned to No. 1 A.D.H. for further treatment.</p>	
			<p><u>Early Treatment:</u> 7929 soldiers attended the Early Treatment Depots during the five weeks ending 30.1.19. Of these 416 soldiers showing signs of disease were sealed up and 245 such cases were aborted.</p>	
			<p>Excluding transfers from Havre, a weekly average of 149.8 cases were admitted to No. 1 A.D.H. in January, as compared with 154 in December.</p>	
			<p><u>Parkhouse Extension Hospital:</u> Towards the end of December the D.M.S. A.I.F. advised that approximately 1000 Australian Venereal patients at that time at the 39th General Hospital, Le Havre, would be transferred to England before the end of January and that accommodation was to be found for them in this Command. As no further accommodation was available at Bulford, the O.C. No. 1 A.D.H. was instructed to inspect No. 2 Camp, Parkhouse, situated about 2 miles from Bulford and adjoining the C.T.D. and report on its suitability for the treatment of V.D. cases. His report shewed that, with certain additions and misappropriations, No. 2 Camp, Parkhouse, would be ready to receive upwards of 1000 patients by the third week of January. These alterations were proceeded with, and on 16.1.19., the Parkhouse Extension Hospital, as it is now called, was opened with the admission of 474 patients. Further admissions were made during the month, and by the end of January the Hospital Strength was 596. Walking cases of Gonorrhoea only are treated in this hospital, bed cases and cases which become chronic being transferred to Bulford.. Minor operations only are performed.</p>

The corresponding figures for the four-weekly month of December were 4,109. Thus the admission rate shows an increase of approximately 13%. GENERAL:

The number of Returned B.E.F. men discharged for General Service from Command Depots for the four weeks ending 25.1.19 was 18 as compared with 468 in December.

All Red Cross Equipment from Nos. 1 and 4 Command Depots was returned to Australian Base Depot Medical Stores during the month, and these Depots have now ceased to function as Command Depots and are simply Concentration Camps for men returning to Australia. Portion of the Equipment held by No. 2 Command Depot and regarded as surplus was also returned.

No. 2 Command Depot:

The Strength of the Depot during the month increased from 6200 to 6806. The number of Invalids who marched ~~into~~ out to the Port of Embarkation for return to Australia during the 4 weeks ending 25.1.19., was 8471 as compared with 10508 during the 4-weekly month of December.

The return of soldiers retrograded from "A" class to lower medical categories for the month of January is as follows:-

GENERAL MATTERS:

The 1st A.G.HOSPITAL, under the Command of Colonel J.A.Dick CMG., and previously located at Rouen France, took over from the Sutton Veny Military Hospital on 15.1.19 and came under the administration of the A.D.M.S. A.I.F. Depots in U.K., on 18.1.19. The Hospital has a total accommodation 1112 beds, and at the time of taking over there were 240 Australians, 58 British, and 273 German Prisoners of War in Hospital.

A large number of Australian cases were transferred from British Hospitals in the Southern Command during the month, with the result that by the end of January the Hospital was almost full.

Steps have been taken to bring about the removal of the Prisoners of War at present occupying a considerable number of beds at the 1st A.G.H., and when this is effected, further accommodation will be available for Australian cases.

MEDICAL OFFICERS FOR A.I.F. DEPOTS IN U.K.

Owing to Demobilization of Troops from France, the following additional duties will be required of the Medical Service in this Command:-

- (a). From approximately the 15th January onwards 1000 soldiers will arrive from France every 2 days. Thus, 3,500 soldiers per week will require to be medically boarded.
- (b). The treatment of 1000 Venereal cases transferred from France.

No Medical Officers will be made available by the transfer of reinforcements from England to France as it is intended to use all Depots in the Command, except Brightlingsea, Clifton, Longmoor and St. Budeaux as Staging Camps for soldiers sent from France for return to Australia.

In order to carry out the above duties and to replace Medical Officers who are leaving the Command, I estimate that the following additional Medical Officers will be required, if possible by the 15th instant:-

- 11 for Permanent Cadre and Boarding duty.
- 8 for treatment of Venereal Disease (assuming that 5 of the 13 Officers already asked for will accompany Venereal patients from France to England)

19 24 Total.

As Medical Officers arrive from France with troops of other commands for Demobilization, they will become available for duty, after they have had their furlough. No Officers however will be available from this source until towards the end of February.

GENERAL HEALTH:

The number of troops in hospital as compared with last week has increased from 3006 to 3310; of these 1501 (4.56%) only were admitted from A.I.F. Depots in U.K., the remainder being admitted from B.E.F. troops and from Headquarters, A.I.F.

The number of admissions to hospital has decreased from 1273 to 726; of these 552 (75%) were admitted from units in this Command, the remainder 174 being admitted from B.E.F. Troops and Headquarters, A.I.F.



Monthly Medical Report for January 1919.

During the month under review, the Medical organization of the Depot, has been carried out without interruption of any kind. The demobilisation of A.I.F. Troops still continues and the boarding of all soldiers prior to embarkation has been carried out without any hitch. The general health of the troops under the control of the Depot has been satisfactory and a decrease is still noticeable in the numbers on sick parade as against the numbers shewn on last month's return. One feature worthy of note, is that not one case of infectious disease was reported and the general cases admitted to Hospital were the average mild type of prevalent diseases, mostly Influenza cases which have slightly increased but there is no reason for alarm as the average cases per day equals 5 only.

The several Auxillary Departments have carried out their work to entire satisfaction during the month, especially the E.T.Department with good results. On the 29th ultimo, the Massage Department closed down, the Masseurs and Remedial Exercise Instructors were transferred to No.2.Command Depot for duty.

The sanitary conditions of the Depot during the first part of the month were not satisfactory but with the recent fine weather, more attention has been paid to this matter and there is now a marked improvement.

GENERAL REMARKS.

During the month of January, a recurrence of the Influenza Epidemic which was most marked during the months of October and November, 1918, took place, but, so far, to a lesser degree. In a recent draft which arrived from France there were 27 cases of illness admitted to Hospital, mostly Influenza, in two days. In all 335 General cases were admitted to No. 2 Group Clearing Hospital for the month. When it is considered that at present, the troops in this Area, with few exceptions, are "A" Class, and also taking into account the small number of men in the Area, it will be seen that the admissions were relatively high.

GENERAL REMARKS. (continued)

Early in the month steps were taken to draft all available Reinforcements from 3rd. Training Brigade to France, and similarly all category men at No. 4 Command Depot who were not on Boat Rolls were transferred to other Commands. This was done in order to make available as concentration camps, the camps occupied by those Units. Thus, on the 28th. January, all camps in the Area were established as concentration camps and were made ready to receive quotas from France, en route to Australia, the A.A.M.C. Training Depot, Fovant, being used for the concentration of all "A" class A.A.M.C. personnel.

On 22nd. January, a change of Senior Medical Officers of Hurdcott Area, took place, Major A.C. Fraser taking charge from Lt. Col. B.C. Kennedy, who was transferred to 3rd. A.A.H., Dartford.






