

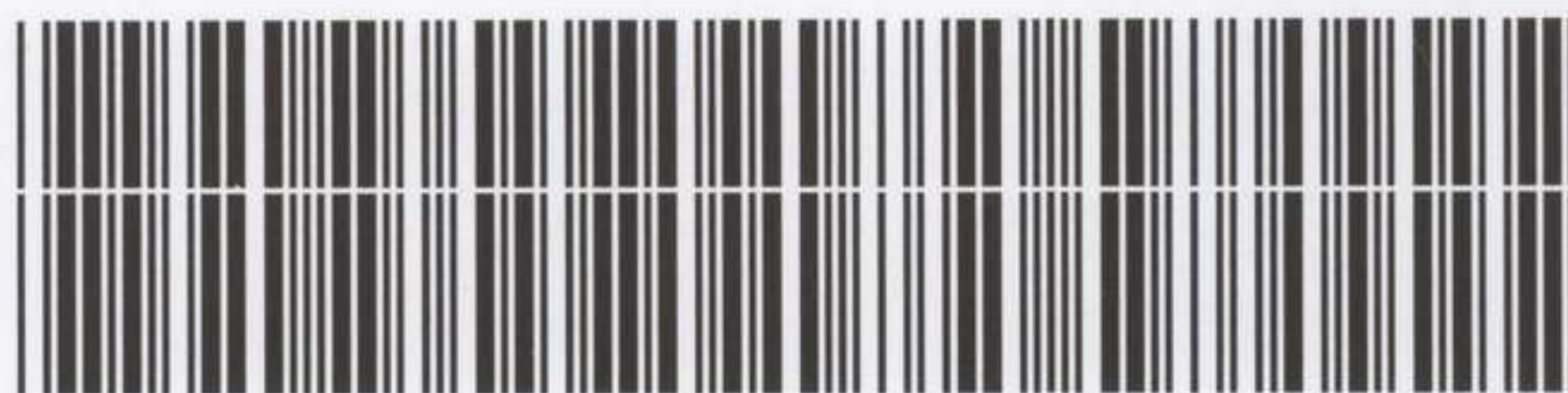

| | | | B. - <u>HEALTH OF TROOPS.</u> | |
| | | | The number of soldiers in hospital shews a decrease during the month. For full statistical reports see <u>Appendix "B"</u> which consists of the Weekly Reports on this subject submitted to the D.M.S. These reports shew that for the five weeks ending 3.7.19, 10.7.19, 17.7.19, 24.7.19 and 31.7.19, the total numbers of soldiers in hospital were respectively 2014, 1821, 1716, 1603 and 1529. Of these numbers, however, only 795, 744, 717, 647 and 621 respectively were admitted from the A.I.F. Depots in U.K., the corresponding percentages to the total strength of the Command being 2.67, 3.14, 3.58, 4.37 and 5.21. | APPENDIX "B" |

Of these numbers, however, only 435, 406, 366, 347 and 317 respectively had been admitted from A.I.F. Depots in U.K., the corresponding percentages to the Total Strength of the Command being 1.46, 1.72, 1.83, 2.34 and 2.67. GENERAL HEALTH:

Number of troops in hospital as compared with last week has decreased from 2276 to 2014: of these 795 (2.67%) were admitted from A.I.F. Depots in U.K., the remainder, 1219, were admitted from B.E.F. troops and Headquarters, A.I.F.

Number of cases sent to hospital during the week has decreased from 298 to 222: of these, 201 (.62%) were admitted from A.I.F. Depots in U.K., the remainder, 21, were admitted from B.E.F. troops and Headquarters, A.I.F.

Number of General Cases in hospital has decreased from 426 (1.26%) to 353 (1.18%). In addition to these 101 General Cases had been admitted from B.E.F. troops and Headquarters, A.I.F.

Average number attending Daily Sick Parade has decreased from 306 (.87%) to 216 (.66%).

RESPIRATORY DISEASE:

Number of cases sent to hospital during the week has increased from 5 to 9: of these Influenza accounted for 5 as compared with 3 last week.

INFECTIOUS DISEASE:

Number of cases in hospital, excluding scabies, has decreased from 143 to 3.

Measles: Number of cases admitted to hospital has decreased from 6 to 1, which case had already been segregated.

Mumps: Number of cases admitted to hospital has decreased from 2 to nil.

Diphtheria: No cases occurred during the week.

Scabies: Number of cases undergoing treatment has increased 105 to 137.

VENEREAL DISEASE:

Number of cases in hospital has decreased from 1689 to 1553. Of these 435 (1.46) were admitted from A.I.F. Depots in U.K., the remainder, 1118, were admitted from B.E.F. troops and Headquarters, A.I.F.

Number of admissions to hospital has decreased
from 179 less 4 readmissions from C.T.D. - 175

Before reporting to the Command: The number has increased from 82 to 84: of whom 38 were on furlough from Headquarters, A.I.F.

Number of cases discharged during the week has decreased from 258 to 225.

GENERAL HEALTH:

Number of troops in hospital as compared with last week has decreased from 2014 to 1821: of these, 744 (3.14%) were admitted from A.I.F. Depots in U.K., the remainder, 1077, were admitted from B.E.F. Troops and Headquarters, A.I.F.

Number of cases sent to hospital during the week has decreased from 222 to 191: of these 168 (.45%) were admitted from A.I.F. Depots in U.K., the remainder, 23, were admitted from B.E.F. Troops and Headquarters, A.I.F.

Number of General Cases in Hospital has decreased from 353 (1.18%) to 337 (1.42%): in addition to these, 106 General Cases had been admitted from B.E.F. Troops and Headquarters, A.I.F.

909. TREATMENT OF SYPHILIS:

Routine Order No. 7130 of 23.1.1919 is hereby cancelled, and the following substituted therefor:-

1. Any A.I.F. Officer or soldier who has had Syphilis and has had only one course of treatment (7 injections of Salvarsan and 7 injections of Mercury) will be advised to have a second course. This advice will be brought under the notice of all ranks now in, or subsequently marching into the Command, and they will be informed that such second course of treatment does not involve forfeiture of pay.

2. The continuation course should be given not less than four months after the termination of the first course.

3. All who undergo a second course of treatment before embarkation in accordance with the above will be transferred to No. 1 A.D.Hospital, Bulford, where they will be given a course of treatment consisting of:-

6 Intravenous injections Novarsenobillon .45 gramma (or its equivalent) at intervals of seven days.

6 Intramuscular injections of Mercurial Cream at intervals of 7 days alternately with the intravenous injections.

This course of treatment will be given irrespective of the result of Wassermann tests.

4. The following entry will be made on the A.F.B.178 of any Officer or other rank who has had Syphilis:-

"Syphilis contracted(date)"

"First course of treatment terminated(date)"

"Second course of treatment should be given not earlier than(date)".

This entry will be made by the O.C., the Hospital in which he is a patient or in cases where the soldier is not a patient in Hospital by the S.M.O. of the Group concerned.

During the past month the medical routine of this Group has been carried out satisfactorily, and there are practically no low category men remaining. The medical work is chiefly taken up with examination of men marching in to the Depot and men on Boat Rolls for embarkation to Australia.

All A.A.M.C. Instructions re men on quotas and Boat Rolls being complied with. For the Month 1284 soldiers were treated; of whom 87 were admitted to Hospital, including One Mumps, One Influenza and One Chicken Pox, leaving 84 General cases. The highest admissions to Hospital on one day being Nine on the 12th. Scabie treatment was successfully carried out, and 91 men were treated and cured. Two cases of Infectious disease was reported during the period. e.i. One Mumps and One Chicken Pox. Contacts of both cases were immediately isolated, and no further cases have since been reported.

The 6th Sanitary Section have carried out their duties effectively. The various Camps under the administration of No. 2 Concentration Group are in a sanitary condition in every respect.

The early Treatment Department continues to do effective work. Herewith please find Monthly Summary of Sick Parades.

On the first of the month three new Medical Officers reported with a view to acquiring some practical experience in the treatment of Venereal Disease (Lt/Col Upjohn, Lt/Col Hurley and Capt. Newton) (by order of D.M.S. A.I.F.) Other members of the Staff marched out by the same order.

The work, however, has progressed fairly satisfactorily, and the discharges are more than double the admissions for the month. The average stay in Hospital for cases suffering from Gonorrhoea (65.9) days, is remarkably good, in the opinion of the officer in charge of treatment, considering the high standard, set as a standard of cure; and it will be noticeable that only one relapse was admitted during the month, which is certainly a record for this Hospital, and I feel justified in claiming it as a record for all similar Hospitals.

4. REMARKS. (cont.)

Every case of Gonorrhoea during its stay in Hospital is at least examined once Urethroscopically, and all cases are dilated. This Treatment has been criticised, and I believe that it has been stated that the patients are over treated, but the fact remains, since Urethroscopic examinations of all cases and routine dilation has been introduced, relapses have dropped from between 4 and 5%, to less than 1%. It will also be noticed that by comparing previous reports with this, that Polypi are far fewer in the Urethra, or at any rate, Polypoid conditions of the posterior Urethra, are greatly reduced, and the Officer in charge of Treatment is perfectly certain that this is due entirely to the systematic use of Curved sounds, which prevents the growth of granulation tissue on inflamed surfaces.

Great care is also taken in the instruction of patients regarding Irrigation, and also with the increase in the Medical Staff, much more personal supervision is given to the dressings of sores admitted for treatment. These efforts have already shown good results, especially by reducing the number of cases complicated by organisms, other than Gonococci and penile sores and Buboos, which are healing with greater rapidity owing to greater care in ante-sepsis.

5. QUARTERMASTER'S DEPARTMENT.

Owing to M.M.M. and Repatriation Orders, the personnel of this Officer's Department, has changed considerably, and the lack of a 2nd Quartermaster has been acutely felt, nevertheless, the large amount of work has been carried out, and systematic inspections continued right throughout the month to anticipate as far as possible any leakages in stores and equipment. The Quartermaster and Representative were ready on the 17th of the month to hand over the whole of No. 2 Camp. Parkhouse, but no one in authority could be prevailed on to take over before 28.7.19. (11 days waiting). The necessary receipts were obtained from the Barrack Warden, and a list of damages claimed by the Engineers. The latter have been submitted to the A.M.G. to be dealt with, amounting to slightly over £70., including cost of labour. This covers a period of 6½ months, during which time 3392 patients have passed through the Extension. The deficiencies, according to the long roll, shows the amazingly small sum of £2.16., which reflects great credit on the supervision exercised on all those responsible there for. Unserviceable stores are being ^{sent} direct to Salvage Unit, Whalsea. Quarterly Certificate re surplus and deficiencies at No. 1 A.D.H. were forwarded to A.D.H.S. on 31st instant; the delay in doing this was due to the authorities failing to take over No. 1 A.D.H. Extension

6. PHARMACEUTICAL DEPARTMENT.

During the month the work in this Department has been carried out satisfactorily, and checks on instruments and stores have been made weekly.

256 Prescriptions were dispensed.

A small quantity of drugs were taken over from C.T.D. and added to our stocks.

A full list of all instruments on charge, which were originally bought with a special grant given by the Australian Red Cross, was forwarded to A.D.H.S. and instructions asked for as to disposal of same.

7. PATHOLOGICAL DEPARTMENT.

This Department is carrying out fair work, but a serious delay occurred owing to the lack of Haemolytic serum, which completely prevented Blood-tests for some days.

Owing to the higher standard of cure in the Hospital, Complement Fixation Tests for Gonorrhoea were performed in 446 cases. A detailed report is attached of the work in this Hospital for the month, and the work at Extension up to date of closing (16.7.19).

8. During the month the work has proceeded on the whole, fairly satisfactorily, notwithstanding the considerable change in personnel, of both Officers and other ranks. All patients at No. 1 A. D. H. Extension, Parkhouse (84) were transferred to this Hospital on the morning of 16.7.19., and the whole of the staff less the after party of 27 other ranks. As already referred to in para. 5., great difficulty was experienced in getting any responsible authority to take over the Camp, although ample intimation had been given both to A. D. H. S. and A. M. C., and it was not until 11 days later (28.7.19) that the necessary receipts were obtained. As the Camp, when taken over by No. 1 A. D. H. in January, was handed over from C. C. C. S. D. it seems difficult to understand why he could not have been instructed to take it back, but this was strongly objected to by the A. M. C., who insisted it should be handed over to the British, and this, to a great extent, was the cause of the delay in getting clearances, as the two long rolls did not correspond (British and Australian). A less marked diminution in admissions during the latter half of the month occurred than was expected. This was due chiefly to delays in the sailing of transports for Australia, as men who had had coitus just prior to embarkation were held up sufficiently long to develop Venereal trouble, and be struck off the boat roll before the transport actually sailed. It is, however, anticipated that an average discharge of at least 100 per week will be kept up until such time as the Hospital is handed over, and as far as can be judged, admissions will drop 50% during the coming month.
