Depots decreased from 11,911 to</p> <p>A. - <u>MEDICAL OFFICERS</u></p> <p>The strength of Medical Officers in the Command decreased from 48 to 36 during the month.  <u>Appendix "A"</u> (attached shows the weekly Distribution and Posting of Medical Officers.</p> <p>B. - <u>HEALTH OF TROOPS.</u></p> <p>The number of soldiers in hospital shows a decrease during the month. For full statistical reports see <u>Appendix "B"</u>, which consists of the Weekly Reports on the subject submitted to the D.M.S. These reports show that for the four weeks ending 7.8.19., 14.8.19., 21.8.19., and 28.8.19, the total numbers of soldiers in hospital were respectively 1476, 1427, 1331 and 950. Of these numbers, however, only 610, 610, 554, and 304 respectively were admitted from A.I.F. Depots in U.K., the corresponding percentages to the total strength of the Command being 5.8, 5.86, 5.5, and 3.1,</p> <p>The amount of serious disease during the month was slight. 2 deaths occurred from all causes.</p>

Depots in U.K., Tidworth.</u> Headquarters A.I.F. Depots in U.K. ceased to function on 31.8.19. and the office of the A.D.M.S., A.I.F. Depots in U.K. Tidworth closed accordingly on that date.</p> <p>From 1st September 1919 all medical formation in A.I.F. Depots in U.K. will be administered direct by the A.D.M.S. A.I.F. London. On and after that date the following Medical Units will continue to function in A.I.F. Depots :-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(1) No.1 A.G.H. Troops for Week-Ending - 21.8.19.

Statistical Report attached.

GENERAL HEALTH:

Number of troops in Hospital as compared with last week has decreased from 1427 to 1331. Of these 554 (5.50%) were admitted from A.I.F. Depots in U.K.; the remainder, 781, were admitted from B.E.F. Troops and Headquarters, A.I.F.

Number of cases sent to hospital during the week has increased from 112 to 133. Of these 83 (.79%) were admitted from A.I.F. Depots in U.K., the remainder, 50, were admitted from B.E.F. troops and Headquarters, A.I.F.

Number of General Cases has decreased from 344 (3.32%) to 327 (3.3%); in addition to these 96 General Cases had been admitted from B.E.F. Troops and Headquarters, A.I.F.

The average number attending Daily Sick Parade has decreased from 82 (.73%) to 75 (.71%).

RESPIRATORY DISEASE:

Number of cases sent to Hospital was the same as last week, viz.- 5. Of these Influenza accounted for 3 as compared with 5 last week.

INFECTIOUS DISEASE:

Number of cases in hospital, excluding scabies, has decreased from 1 to nil.

Number of contacts has decreased from 26 to 25.

No cases of Measles, Mumps or Diphtheria were admitted during the week.

Scabies: Number of cases undergoing treatment has increased from 9 to 13.

VENEREAL DISEASE:

Number of cases in hospital has decreased from 977 to 908. Of these 223 (2.25%) were admitted from A.I.F. Depots in U.K., the remainder, 685, were admitted from B.E.F. Troops and Headquarters, A.I.F.

Number of admissions to hospital has increased from 71 to 95.

Infection was acquired as follows:-

Before reporting to the Command - the number was the same as last week, viz.- 41, of whom 28 were on furlough from Headquarters, A.I.F.

After reporting to the Command - the number has decreased from 6 to 4.

Number of cases discharged during the week has increased from 154 to 164.

GENERAL HEALTH:

Number of troops in hospital as compared with last week has decreased from 1476 to 1427. Of these 610 (5.86%) were admitted from A.I.F. Depots in U.K., the remainder 817 were admitted from B.E.F. Troops and Headquarters, A.I.F.

Number of cases sent to hospital during the week has increased from 106 to 112. Of these 87 (.82%) were admitted from A.I.F. Depots in U.K., the remainder 25 were admitted from B.E.F. Troops and Headquarters, A.I.F.

Number of General Cases has increased from 311 (2.96%) to 344 (3.32%); in addition to these 105 General Cases had been admitted from B.E.F. Troops and Headquarters, A.I.F.

The average number attending daily sick parade has increased from 76 (.72%) to 82 (.73%).

RESPIRATORY DISEASE:

GENERAL HEALTH:

Number of troops in hospital as compared with last week has decreased from 1529 to 1476. Of these 610 (5.8%) were admitted from A.I.F. Depots in U.K., the remainder, 866, were admitted from B.E.F. troops and Headquarters, A.I.F.

Number of cases sent to Hospital during the week has decreased from 112 to 106. Of these 84 (.8%) were admitted from A.I.F. Depots in U.K., the remainder, 22, were admitted from B.E.F. troops and Headquarters, A.I.F.

Number of General Cases in hospital has increased from 303 (2.54%) to 311 (2.96%); in addition to these 110 General Cases had been admitted from B.E.F. Troops and Headquarters, A.I.F.

The average number attending Daily Sick Parade has decreased from 162 (1.27%) to 76 (.72%).

RESPIRATORY DISEASE:

Number of cases sent to hospital was the same as last week, viz.- 4. Of these Influenza accounted for 1 as compared with 2 last week.

INFECTIOUS DISEASE:

Number of cases in hospital, excluding scabies, has decreased from 1 to nil.

Number of contacts has increased from nil to 32.

Measles:

No cases were admitted during the week.

Mumps:

No cases were admitted during the week.

Diphtheria:

No cases were admitted during the week.

Scabies:

Number of cases undergoing treatment has decreased from 10 to 8.

VENEREAL DISEASE:

Number of cases in hospital has decreased from 1118 to 1055. Of these 299 (2.84%) were admitted from A.I.F. Depots in U.K., the remainder, 756, were admitted from B.E.F. troops and Headquarters, A.I.F.

Number of admissions to hospital has decreased from 91 to 58.

Infection was acquired as follows:-

Before reporting to the Command: the number has decreased from 42 to 33, of whom, 21, were on furlough from Headquarters, A.I.F.

After reporting to the Command: the number has increased from 4 to 6. 21 cases were admitted from B.E.F. troops as compared with 31 last week. There were no cases transferred from France during the week.

Number of cases discharged during the week has decreased from 168 to 125.

Early Treatment: 202 soldiers reported for Early Treatment during the week. Of these, 16 showing signs of the disease were sealed up and 30 such cases were aborted.

A.A.M.C. Units in Sutton Vengy Area.

There are three distinct A.A.M.C. Units in the Sutton Vengy Area, namely:-

- (1) No. 1 A.G.H.
- (2) A.A.M.C. Training Depot.
- (3) A.A.M.C. Personnel connected with No. 2 Group (No. 1 Op.)

In view of the expected early closure of this office and in order to facilitate the administration of the above Units by the D.M.S. A.I.F., I would make the following suggestions:-

- (1) That the O.C. No. 1 A.G.H. (a Major or Lt/Col) being the senior A.A.M.C. officer in the Area be appointed S.M.O., Sutton Vengy Area, in addition to his present duties. After the 'Kisumu' embarks on the 28th inst. there will not be more than 100 patients in No. 1 A.G.H. so that he should be easily able to spare the time for the additional duties.
- (2) The S.M.O. Sutton Vengy Area would then administer:-
  - (a) No. 1 A.G.H. the bulk of the internal administration which would be done by the registrar.
  - (b) The A.A.M.C. Training Depot, which would continue to be administered with Captain Savign as O.C., the only difference being that he would be directly responsible to the S.M.O. Sutton Vengy <sup>Area</sup> instead of to the A.D.M.S. A.I.F. Depots in U.K. as at present. This would enable Major Parker the present O.C. to be spared without replacement.
  - (c) No. 2 Group which would be administered as at present, but the R.M.O. would be under the S.M.O. Sutton Vengy Area instead of under the S.M.O. No. 2 Group as at present. This would enable Major. D.M. Coutts, the present S.M.O. No. 2 Group to be spared without replacement.
  - (3) The S.M.O. Sutton Vengy Area would communicate direct with the D.M.S. A.I.F. & with H.Q. A.I.F. Depots in U.K. and would handle the correspondence for all A.A.M.C. Units in Sutton Vengy Area
  - (4) The D.M.S. A.I.F. would under the above arrangement, have the following A.A.M.C. Units to deal with in A.I.F. Depots in U.K.
    - (a) Sutton Vengy Area.
    - (b) No. 1 A.D.H. Bulford.
    - (c) R.M.O. A.I.F. Detention Barracks, Lewes.
    - (d) R.M.O. Bhurtpore Barracks Tidworth until 30.9.1919.

GENERAL HEALTH:

Number of troops in hospital as compared with last week has decreased from 1331 to 950. Of these 304 (.31%) were admitted from A.I.F. Depots in U.K., the remainder, 646, were admitted from B.E.F. troops and Headquarters, A.I.F.

Number of cases sent to hospital during the week has decreased from 133 to 92. Of these 80 (.81%) were admitted from A.I.F. Depots in U.K., the remainder, 12, were admitted from B.E.F. troops and Headquarters, A.I.F.

Number of General Cases has decreased from 327 (3.3%) to 104 (1.06%). In addition to these 10 General Cases had been admitted from B.E.F. troops and Headquarters, A.I.F.

Average number attending Daily Sick Parade has decreased from 75 (.71%) to 71 (.72%).

RESPIRATORY DISEASE:

Number of cases sent to Hospital during the week has decreased from 5 to 2. Of these Influenza accounted for 2 as compared with 3 last week.

INFECTIOUS DISEASE:

Number of cases in hospital, excluding scabies, was the same as last week, viz.- nil.

Number of contacts has decreased from 25 to nil.

No cases of Measles, Mumps and Diphtheria were admitted during the week.

Scabies. Number of cases undergoing treatment has decreased from 13 to nil.

VENEREAL DISEASE:

Number of cases in hospital has decreased from 908 to 836. Of these 200 (2.04%) were admitted from A.I.F. Depots in U.K., the remainder, 636, were admitted from B.E.F. troops and Headquarters, A.I.F.

Number of admissions to hospital has decreased from 95 to 66.

Infection was acquired as follows:-

Before reporting to the Command: the number has increased from 41 to 49, of whom 42 were on furlough from Headquarters, A.I.F.

After reporting to the Command: the number has decreased from 4 to 3.

Number of cases discharged during the week has decreased from 164 to 148.
