



			This sector is a very interesting one to clear. The frontage is 3000 yards held by two Brigades. The Right Bde. has two Battalions in line - The Left only one. The town of VILLERS BRETONNEUX lies in the centre of the front and the line is only a few hundred yards East of it. Along the whole of the front is a hill which commands the whole SOMME valley and AMIENS. Our line is only a few hundred yards over a crest and as possession of the hill would give the enemy a complete command of the valley and Town, it must be held at all cost. 



The men will then be sent back to their Units where R.M.O's. will arrange for their segregation and the continuation of the treatment which will consist of Sulphus Ointment inunction on the morning and evening of the two days following the bath. On the following day the Brigade has again arranged for the men to be bathed and given a clean change of underclothing. —

The blankets of all men suffer ing from scables will be a ent under Brigade arrangements to Foden Lorry at 10th. Aust. Field Ambulance for fumigation on the first day and again on the last day.-

Special attention will be given to disinfection of blankets of men found to be suffering from scubies. -

The Officer Commanding Field imbulance of Brigade Group will detail an Officer to report to Brigade Headquarters to examine those details having no R.M.O. attached and supervise the after treatment of those found to be suffering from scabies. -





MEDICAL INSTRUCTION No.46

- The term "Walking Wounded Collecting Post" for Station at N.27.c.5.3. (Sh. 62D.) is abolished. This Post will be known as A. D. S. (Walking Wounded).
- 2. All cases from A.D.S. (Walking Wounded) will be sent to M.D.S. All records will be kept at M. D. S.
- Two busses are being made available by Officer Commanding 3rd M.A.C. to clear cases between A.D.S's and M.D.S. only. Officer Commanding M.D.S. will arrange to clear Walking Wounded to Corps Walking Wounded Relay Post at Sh. 62E/K.30.d.0.4. by returning empty lorries.
- 4. All gassed cases will be treated at M.D.S. before being sent on to Corps Walking Wounded Relay Post.
- In addition, in the event of a sudden rush of cases, two hourly progressive totals of admissions will be sent to this Office by D.R. These progressive totals are to be approximately only, and are not to interfere in any way with the 5 a.m., 4 p.m. and 8 p.m. wires
- 6. This order will come into force from 7 p.m. to-night.



SANITATION REPORT ON THIRD AUSTRALIAN DIVISIONAL AREA

For month ending 28th. MAY, 1918.

(a). General Health

Continues to be good.
For the past three weeks there has been an epidemic of a pyrexial condition of the influenza type. This occurred especially in the troops of the 11th. Brigade and is now lessening.

(b). Physique.

Good.

2. Billets.

Very few men are in billets - practically all are in trenches and in bivouacs - practically all are under cover - the billets that are in use are good. On the whole the conditions are good.

3. (a). Baths.

There are three baths in the Area with an average capacity of 65 per hour. Brigades supply N.C.O's. to supervise the running of the baths (allotted to them) which are staffed by P.B. men from Corps. Units apply to Brigades for bath allotments.

Under the present conditions it is difficult to

Under the present conditions it is difficult to make full use of Divisional Baths, but many men are able to bathe in rivers and streams.

(b). Washing.

There has been very little opportunity for the erection of ablution benches. men mostly washing in the streams.

(c). Laundries.

- There is a Divisional Wlothing Store located at CAGNY - clean clothing is supplied by the Divisional Baths Officer - article for article in exchange for dirty clothing. Erigades arrange transport necessary to and from Store and baths.

(d). Drying-rooms.

(a). Disinfection.

Carried out when necessary - Crescl used as required.

(b). Prevailence of Vermin.

Lice are not very prevailent.

(a). Cooking.

Arrangements for cooking are on the whole satisfactory, though the Cooks have considerable difficulties to contend with.

(b). Quality of Food.

Satisfactory.

(c). Variation of Food

As far as is possible variation of menu is arranged for. At the present this is not possible to any great extent. Plenty of fresh vegetables are obtainable.

(I). Quality.

Water is mostly obtained from Water Points and is of good quality. Practically all wells in the district are labelled.

(a). How sterilised.

The following morn ing at 8am. about 30 "gas casualties" were reported. The gas masks had be worm all night . From 10am and onwards the swatens symptoms began to appea The chief symptoms were photophobia, lacrymation and a smarting sensation in the eyes. The Latter became so severe that a number of the patients had to be led as they were unable to open the eyes. More serious cases complained of dryness of the throat, pains the epigestrum- and vomiting The eyes were washed with sodium bicarbonate and those with gastric symptoms were given sodi blearbonate - grns.xx per mouth. There were not many cases of skin blistering , Although the Battalion suffered the following casualties 5 Officers 235 men . On 27-5-18 we moved into front line . I took over the RAP from the 44th. Battalion. It was situated in VILLERS BRETTONEAUX 0 29d 1 4 . I stayed there 4 days and considered it an absolutely unfit afface for an R.A.P. for in the event of an attack there would be no means of evacuation . Pending the construction of an RAP to the left of the village I moved back to 038 c 7 5 near Battalion Headquarters, leaving a relay of 4 Pn. stretcher bearers at forward RAP in the village. This worked well and on relief from front line on 4-8-18 the new RAP had not been commenced . Our casualties were light and there, not many sick . On relief 4-6-18 the Eattalion occupied areas around #28 . There has been very little sickness and general health and morale is excellent . The men have all been bathed and have had an issue of clean clothes . The sanitary conveniences are good . The issue of food is excellent except for shortages in green vegetables. The water is all drawn from water supply points.



Throughout the month the sick rate of the 9th. and 10th. Field Coys. was low, the 11th. Field Co. was considerably higher than usual owing to an epidemic of influenza. The cases were isolated and treated with Quinine Sulph. in solution and in 5 or 6 days were fit to return to duty.

Slight - 13 wounded, 7 of whom remained on duty.

Sanitation .- Good .

Fitnessfor Marching .- Men are in a fit state for marching.

Water. - Carts are in good order and ready to move.
