MONTHLY REPORT.

30th April 1919.

RATIONS

The rations for the month have been good, and shown a great improvement on the previous month. The bread has been in good condition and a regular daily issue except for the usual one day per fortnight Biscuit issue. Australian jam has been a regular daily issue except for two days when the famous but unfancied Egyptian marmalade again appeared. Oatmeal & bacon were regular issues, while cheese appeared only once in a way until to-day when it was replaced by an issue of fresh butter. Fresh meat has been regular. The men's mess has been greatly assisted during April by the Cinema Canteen Fund which provides for goods to the value of 10 PT per man per month, to be purchased for the mess. Total spent for month 1807 PT & 8 mm.

MEDICAL COMPORTS

These have been coming forward regularly, Milk, Eggs, Jellies, Fresh Butter, Custards, & Meat Extracts being supplied to Hospital in quantities sufficient to cope with the number of Patients passing through our hands.

Stout was indented for but was unobtainable.

CLOTHING

All necessary clothing has been available & issued to cover shortages of personnel, while from my notice all ranks are in possession of decent clothing, although the Tunics are of numerous colours, which the Ordnance people cannot avoid & all Units seem to be in the same position.

Australian Fur Hats have been obtained & issued in place of the many English made hats, which were of inferior quality & at the best of times never looked decent.

BQUIPMENT

The general equipment of the Unit has again been brought up to strength and ready for any emergencies, while rifles issued to all Drivers as well as ammunition were inspected on parade this morning & showed that care had been taken of them generally.
