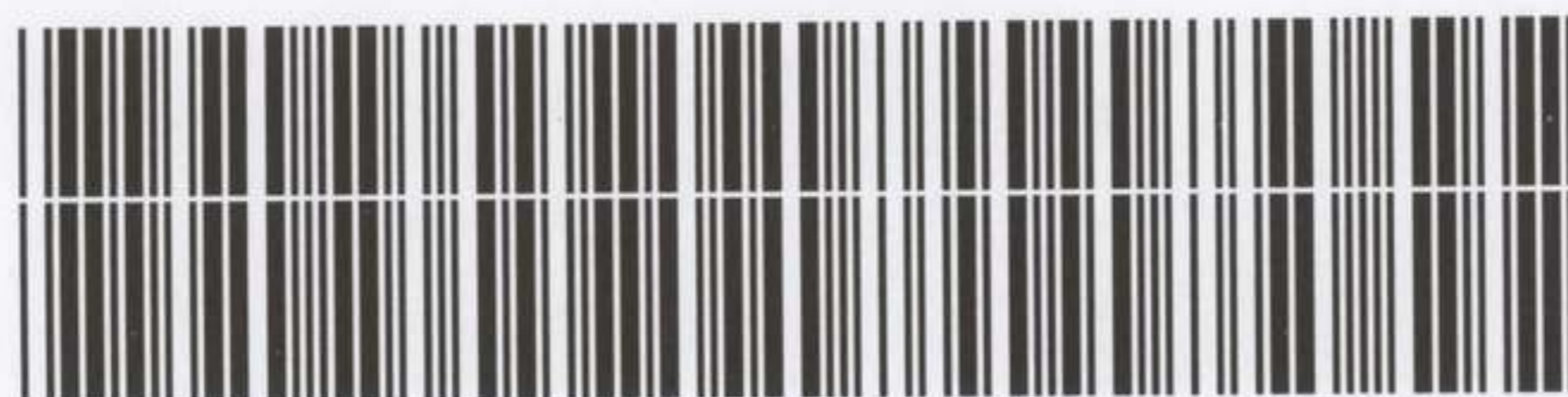

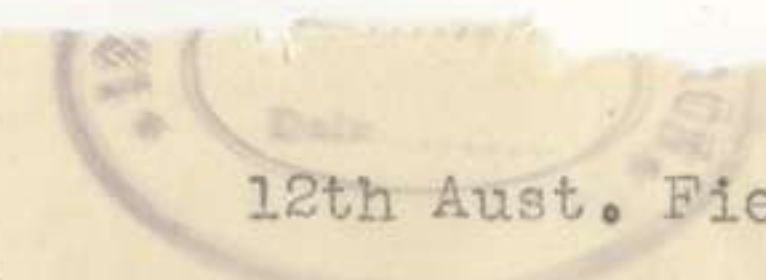

Pursuant of 4th Aust. Division Administrative Instructions No. 97 and in accordance with 12th Aust. Inf. Brigade Order No. 239, the 12th AUSTRALIAN FIELD AMBULANCE less Motor Transport will entrain at AILLY-SUR-SOMME at 0347 on the 11th instant.

1. 12th Australian Field Ambulance less Horse and Motor Transport will move from present billeting area at 2330 on the 10th instant, arriving at entraining point one and a half hours before departure of train.
2. Horse Transport will leave present lines at 2230 10th instant, reaching entraining point three hours before departure of train.
3. Motor Transport will move in convoy under orders from Transport Officer Captain F. Meldrum being in charge.

219 TRANSPORT OFFICERS REPORT FOR MONTH OF NOVEMBER 1918.

MOTOR TRANSPORT.

Movement. The Motor Transport moved from SEUX to FRESNOY-le-GRAND in Convoy in accordance with M.T? Movement Order No. 1.

SPRINGS. There is still trouble experienced with the springs issued for Sunbeam Cars, and it has been found necessary to have special springs made to gain a satisfactory result.

EVACUATIONS. During the early part of the Month one sunbeam car was evacuated to Base with a broken Chassis. To date this car has not been replaced.

-----  
HORSE TRANSPORT.

Movement. Horse Transport moved from Seux to AILLY-SUR-SOMME on 14-11-1918 and then entrained to ROISEL, moving from ROISEL via BELLINGESE to FRESNOY-LE-GRAND arriving there at 9.30 pm on 15-11-18. Movement since then has been with Brigade Group.

During moves horses have all been stabled, good stabling being available and owing to the fact that the horses have not been clipped this winter, the stabling has been most beneficial.

REMOUNTS. One Heavy Draught Horse was evacuated at FRESNOY-LE-GRAND and a Heavy Draught drawn to replace on 30-11-18.

OFFICERS GROOMS. During the last two months the practice of maintaining three grooms for the six Officers Hacks has been established and has proved most successful. This practice ensures the regular grooming and feeding of the hacks - and also places the grooms and the care of the hacks under the ~~xxx~~ charge of the Transport Officer and Warrant Officer Transport. It has been found that when batmen are responsible for the care of the Hacks the present state of efficiency ~~cannot~~ cannot be maintained.

LOADING. During the stay at SEUX - numerous excess stores were dumped and it is now possible to move the Unit by means of Horse Transport alone without heavy loading.

BREAKSMEN. During the month 5 Breaksmen have been appointed, at the rate of one per two G.S. Waggon and Limbers. Their duties are to maintain their waggons in a clean condition and also to pay particular attention ~~to~~ and care to the metal parts.

This step was rendered necessary by the Brigade and Divisional Order with reference to the burnishing of metal.
