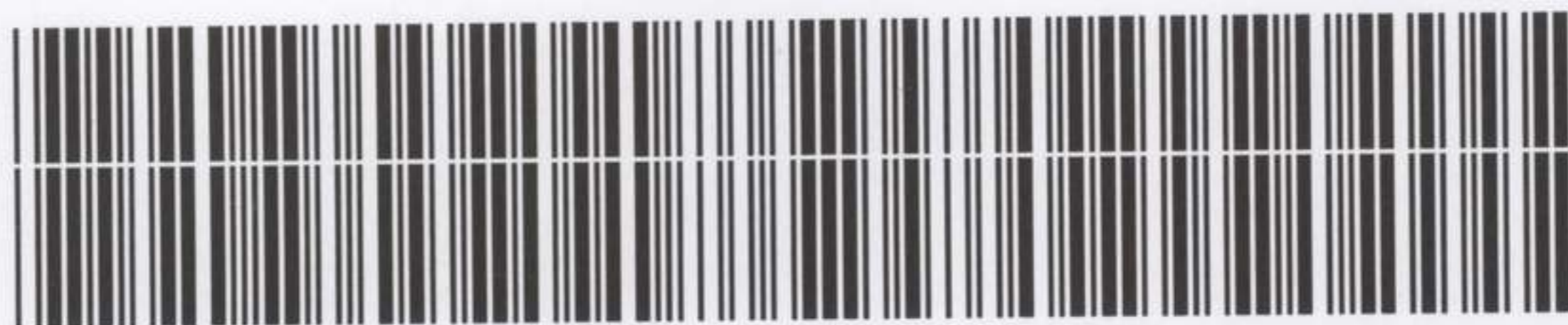



Attention is directed to the serious position of the water supply of the 1st and 2nd Australians Stationary Hospitals, at present located at Mudros. In order to demonstrate the gravity of this position, it is necessary to briefly refer to the amount of water required, and to the source and nature of the water at present available.

Amount of water required.

The 1st Australian Stationary Hospital has a personnel of 110, and has to estimate its requirements for patients on a basis of 400 per diem.

The 2nd Australian Stationary Hospital has a personnel of 94 and has to estimate its requirements for patients on a basis of 200 per diem.

The amount of water required for these units must therefore be estimated on an 804 men per diem basis. Even working on the small allowance of 3 gallons per head per diem, these two units alone would require over 2,400 gallons per diem.

Water available.

(1) Amount: Consideration must here be given to the fact that the following additional units derive their supply from the same source :-

(2) The amount available is derived from two sources:-

(a) A storage tank situated immediately north of Mudros which derives its supply from a spring at the foot of the mountains, some 1½ miles from Mudros. The tank is at present under military guard, but there is no guard over the origin of this supply. During the early spring this supply would furnish a regular 1½ inch diameter current, but on the day of examination (6.6.15) it was ( at its origin) reduced to a mere trickle.

887

Water available; (continued).

A shallow well situated a short distance north of "a". This is covered over but is not guarded. It is difficult to estimate the amount this is capable of supplying, but it is certain that during the last few days, it has not been able to furnish the amount required.

(2) Nature of source.

(a) is a clear spring (percolation) supply, which is now guarded from gross soiling at its storage but is liable to contamination at its seat of origin, not only from direct accessibility, but also from a neighbouring surface water-shed much fouled by human and animal excreta, etc.

(b) is a palatable supply, unguarded and liable to be fouled from direct accessibility and also from the surrounding ground which is much soiled by human and animal excreta.

Even without any bacteriological examination, it is certain that the supply from both sources is unsafe for consumption without previous boiling, and then only for a period not exceeding 24 hours after boiling. Attention is drawn to the fact that

- (1) Even at the present rate of supply, the amount available is quite inadequate for the demand, and that with the continuance of summer weather, owing to the nature of the source, this amount is rapidly diminishing.
- (2) The water at present available is liable to the most serious contamination and that supplies from adjoining wells are even more liable to contamination on account of their unguarded state and the fouled condition of the surrounding ground.

In our opinion it is impossible to sufficiently emphasize the gravity of the position at present existing in these units on account of the amount and nature of the water available.

It is recognised that the question of a sufficient and efficient supply from more distant, unfouled and guarded springs, from a deeper surface, or failing these two sources, by means of condensation, and also of its proper storage, is one that must be undertaken in conjunction with the engineering branch of the Service, but its urgency is most emphatically insisted on by these units. It is now impossible to get washing done for Hospitals in the village, owing to shortage of water.

In your capacity of senior Medical Officer in the Australian Medical Service on the L.of C., I desire to bring before your notice certain conditions that obtain on the temporary hospital ships at present used for the conveyance of sick and wounded.

This communication is based on the personal experience in the conveyance of wounded gained

- (1) as Officer in command of a temporary hospital ship from 3rd May,
- (2) as Medical Officer assisting on a temporary hospital ship from 21st May to 3rd June
- (3) As a Medical Officer giving assistance on a temporary Hospital ship when travelling as a patient from Lemnos to Alexandria from 21st to 23rd June.

Attention is directed to the fact that Transport s, whose decks have recently been occupied by mules or horses are still being used for the transport of wounded without such decks having undergone an efficient cleansing and disinfection.

The personnel to look after the wounded and sick is still quite deficient in Officers, Nursing Sisters, and Orderlies. It is in consequence impossible for the wounded and sick on these transports to receive the amount of surgical, medical, nursing, and general attention that they should get. The result is a state of affairs, which it is hard to conceive. It does not seem possible to obtain a keener impression of the horrors and sufferings of war in any other area of the service than on the temporary Hospital Ships.

It is pointed out that there are at present, particularly at the Base, Medical units the services of some of whose Officers, Nursing Sisters, and Orderlies, could be dispensed with without endangering the present efficiency of these Units.

It is urged that as many of these Officers, Nursing Sisters, and Orderlies, should be placed at the disposal of the proper authorities for duty on these temporary Hospital Ships.

I wish to point out to you certain anomalies in connection with the promotion of Officers and other Ranks belonging to the Australian Medical units on the Line of Communication.

We are short of several N, C, Os owing to sickness, and Corporals and Lance Corporals and in some cases privates are performing the duties of sergeants.

If this Hospital is to be expanded to say 1000 beds it is imperative that we have our proper quota of N, C, Os and as it is we are short of our quota for 200 beds.

We have plenty of men deserving of promotion, but it appears that no one has authority to promote Officers or other Ranks on the Line of Communication.

On the other hand, the promotion of Officers and other ranks of Medical Units is taking place in Australia, Egypt and England, and they are superseding the Officers and other Ranks on the Line of Communication.

I am quite satisfied that both Officers and other Ranks were satisfied with their positions on leaving Australia. They volunteered for the service of the Empire and were content to remain in the posts allotted to them but now both Officers and other Ranks on the Line of Communication are naturally disgusted to find that they are being superseded in many instances by those who have had no service and never taken the trouble to train in time of peace.

There are instances of those who have given years of gratuitous service to the Empire in time of peace and are now being superseded by certain others who have had no military training whatsoever.

In brief, it is impossible to promote Officers and other Ranks on the Line of Communication, but it is being done constantly in Egypt and Australia.
